FLORIDA STATE VS ARIZONA

Tonight's game, the first of two for the Tribe over the holiday weekend, sends the Seminoles against an up-and-coming University of Arizona team which Tuesday night upped its record to 6-4 with a win in the finals of the Poinsetta Classic in Greenville, S.C.

The Wildcats outduelled Mississippi State, 77-75, Tuesday night for the championship. They downed Texas A&M the night before to gain the finals. The 'Cats other victories have been over Seattle, Butler, San Jose and Northern Arizona. The losses were to California, New Mexico State, Baylor and Texas Tech. Arizona is bringing a four game winning streak into tonight's contest.

The Seminoles will be returning to action for the first time in eight days, after a rather rocky road trip that saw them loose two of three games in Texas. The Tribe lost both games of the Sun Bowl Tournament, first bowing to Southern California, 94-85 and then to Miami of Ohio, 67-64, before rebounding against Pan American for a 95-90 win. The results dropped the Seminoles record to 6-3 and tumbled them out of the nation's "Top 20."

Arizona Coach Bruce Larson will probably have four seniors and junior starting against the Tribe with Bill Warner (6-4), and Bruce Anderson (6-8) at forward, Eddie Myers (6-10) at center, with Walt McKinney (5-9) and Lanny Mitchell (6-1) at guard. Anderson is the lone junior.

Coach Hugh Durham may be forced to the first change in the Seminole starting line-up since the season opener. Point man Otto Petty (5-7, 7.4) received an eye injury this week in practice and may not be able to play. If not, his spot will be taken by senior Skip Young (6-3, 4.0)

The other starters will remain the same with Ron King (6-4, 24.7) and Rowland Garrett (6-6, 13.1) on the wing and Vernell Ellzy (6-4, 17.2) and Reggie Royald (6-10, 15.6) at the post.

Saturday night the Seminoles host Pepperdine University at 7:30. The Waves, coached by former Valdosta State mentor, Gary Colson, are 4-0 on the season.
