

1972-73 BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

When 10 players return from a team which has come closer to defeating UCLA in an NCAA title game than any other club has in the last five years, there is reason to be optimistic.

Florida State, which dropped an 81-76 decision to the Bruins in last March's final game, lost three seniors to graduation, but count 10 returnees off last season's 27-6 squad. Among those 10 are Ron King, the sixth all-time leading scorer in Tribe history and Reggie Royals, one of the Seminoles top rebounders.

King, honorable mention All-America as a sophomore and a Helms Foundation pick last season, has scored a total of 589 and 573 points his first two varsity seasons to rank just behind his coach, Hugh Durham, in the all-time scoring leader for a three year varsity career.

The Louisville, Ky., native was selected to the all-tournament team in each of the five tourney's the Seminoles participated in last season. That keeps alive a string of selections that goes back into his junior high school days. In addition, King was named the MVP in the NCAA Mid-East Regionals and was the game high scorer in the championship game of the NCAA finals in Los Angeles.

Royals was selected to three All-Tournament teams during the season and was named MVP of the Senior Bowl Classic in Mobile, Ala. A native of White-ville, N.C., he has picked off 351 and 390 rebounds the last two seasons. The 6-10 senior averaged 11

grabs a game last year along with a 15.7 scoring average. As a sophomore he was the nation's 13th leading rebounder with 15 a game.

Lawrence McCray at 6-11 is a third starter back

Lawrence McCray at 6-11 is a third starter back from last season. A junior from Pensacola, he will return to his low post spot. McCray has shown improvement over his sophomore year where he averaged eight rebounds and 12 points a game.

Other returnees include Otto Petty, the Seminoles exciting 5-7 point man who will replace graduated Greg Samuel, and wing men Otis Cole and Larry Gay. All saw considerable action last season.

Two newcomers expected to make their presence felt are transfers Otis Johnson and Benny Clyde. Both are wing and post position candidates.

Even with the three starters back and seven other players returning, Durham is cautious when he labels the squad experienced. "We are relying heavily on help from the junior colleges. The three seniors we lost are going to be hard to replace. And it takes time for even the most talented newcomer to adjust to a new system."

In addition to Samuel, the Seminoles lost the services of wing starter Rowland Garrett and valuable "number six man" Ron Harris. Garrett, drafted by the Chicago Bulls, was the team's third leading scorer and rebounder. Harris, who was voted MVP by his teammates, leaves a huge void. He was capable of playing any of four positions as well as being the team's top defensive player.

FLORIDA STATE UNIVERSITY

The Florida State University is located in Tallahassee, the capital city of the State. This growing city sprawls over seven hills which are thick with semitropical plant life, including the magnificent live-oak tree hung with Spanish moss. It is served by such important highways as U.S. 27, 90, 319, and 10, as well as by several airlines, including National, Eastern and Southern. The Seaboard Coastline Railroad along with the Trailways and Greyhound busses also have facilities in the city. Both Atlanta and Jacksonville are within a few hours by car.

Although the early history of Florida is everywhere apparent, it is with the modern development of the State and the Capital that the University is linked, since it did not become a University until 1947. Historically the University had its early beginnings as the West Florida Seminary in 1851, became the Florida State College for Women in 1909 and a full scale coeducational university in the forties.

Florida State is located on a 343-acre campus and is architectually a mixture of 19th century College Gothic and modern design. It owns the Reservation, a place of such recreation as canoeing, water-skiing, sailing, and many other sports. Nearby are the Gulf of Mexico with miles of beaches, Wakulla Springs and St. Marks, both wildlife reservations. The Campbell Stadium seats 42,000 people and is a center for many activities — football, rock festivals, pow wows and commencements.

Student enrollment at the University is more than 18,000. Despite the growth in size, a great effort has ben made to preserve both high educational standards and personalized students services. As a member of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, the University works in concert with other institutions in maintaining high academic standards among both stu-

dents and faculty.
