

FLORIDA STATE vs. CONNECTICUT

The Seminoles, 7-3 for the year, return to Tully Gym for the opener of a four game home stand. After playing eight of the first 10 games "on the road," Coach Hugh Durham's club plays six of its next eight at home.

The tournament trail was a little rocky for the Tribe, which suffered two key injuries and three losses. But Durham, who guided the Seminoles to a second place finish in last year's NCAA tournament, returns with optimism.

"We were not playing well at first," said the Tribe mentor, "but in the last four games we played as well as we have all season. This is encouraging."

It is especially so considering that in all four games (three wins and a loss) the Seminoles played without the help of high scoring wingman Ron King.

The senior 1,000 point club member, suffered a dislocated ankle and torn ligaments against Alabama. The ankle is now in a cast and doctors report it will be another six to eight weeks before he can play.

Late in the Tribe's 80-77 loss to Brigham Young in the All-College Tournament senior pointman Otto Petty received a severely bruised heel and was unable to play against Oklahoma City in the consolation game.

However Petty was listed as a "probable starter" for tonight's game against Connecticut. If he cannot go, Dennis Burke, who did a good relief job against OCU will again get the call.

Junior Otis Cole replaces King in the starting lineup which includes Benny Clyde at the other wing, Lawrence McCray at low post and Reggie Royals at high post.

Clyde had an outstanding game against OCU, turning in a team season high 35 points.

Connecticut brings a 4-4 record into tonight's game. The Huskies topped New Hampshire, 60-59, earlier in the week to even their season mark. Coach Donald Rowe will start 6-6 Calvin Chapman (16.3) and 6-5 Earl Wilson (13.1) at forward, 6-7 Gary Custick (10.7) at center and 6-1 James Foster (15.7) and 6-0 Ed Harrison (3.3) at guard.

The Seminoles play at home twice next week, entertaining Georgetown at 7:30 p.m. Monday and Cincinnati at 1 p.m. Saturday. The latter contest will be televised Nationally by the Hughes Sports Network.
