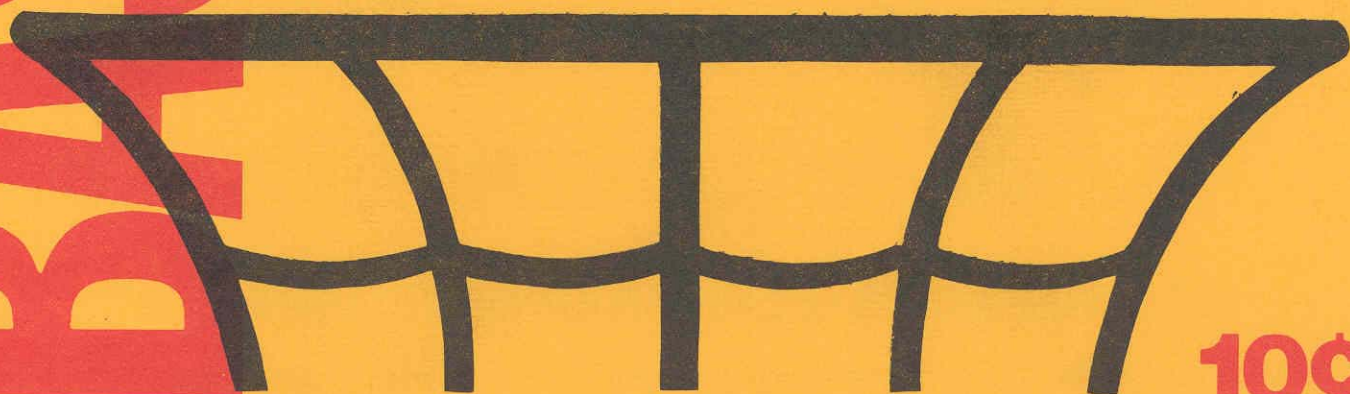

Florida State Five Wins No. 2, 109-71

Florida State's basketball team may not be that good.

Yet.

It is going to be good. Sometimes. It is young, very quick, very willing. And it can be very exciting.

Last night in little old Tully Gym the Seminoles beat - up on short, but also willing Biscayne College 109-71. The score could have been whatever Coach Hugh Durham chose to make it. He chose to make it 109-71.

"I'm glad," he said afterwards, "we got two wins in Tully. Now we go into a place that seats about 14,000, and against a very competitive team."

The place is Pittsburgh. It's the Steel Bowl Tourney, and the Seminoles on Friday night face Clemson, and the Tigers are ambitious this year. Among other assets they've got Wayne Rollins, the 7-1 super from Cordele, Ga., who was the South's most sought

prospect. He's a freshman starter.

Last night the Seminoles played people you never heard of. They played 14 in all. Seven scored 11 or more points.

One newcomer, outside - hotshot Larry Warren, a sophomore, led team scoring for the second straight game with 20. Another newcomer, Eugene Harris, a freshman, scored just 11, but something happens when he goes into the lineup . . . THINGS happen, good things.

Other notable scorers were Otis Cole (14), Lawrence McCray, Greg Grady and Zach Perkins with 12 apiece, and Carlton Byrd with 11.

The Seminoles didn't mess - around much with foul - shooting. They were a hot 59.3 per cent from the floor, 48 of 81. They dominated rebounding 57 to 36 as Grady pulled off 17, McCray 10. In foul trouble - three in the first half and four soon after - the 6 - 11 - plus McCray didn't play all that much, just a little over half the time.

With 4:10 left in the first half the Seminoles switched to a zone defense. Biscayne failed to adjust, and got out - scored 16 to 2 from that point until intermission, when the Seminoles led 58-35.

Almost five minutes remained when Florida State scored its 100th point. After that the Seminoles practiced their "delay game." Literally. They just plain stalled. Deliberately.

Biscayne had a hot one in sophomore Arthur Collins, tops for the game with 25 points. Last year, well - coached, hustling Biscayne wasn't all that bad a team, finished 18-6. This year the Bobcats may not be all that bad, in their own league.

Among other things, the Seminoles seemed to be an unselfish group. There were a creditable 23 assists.
