MADISON DUKES

The Madison College Dukes, playing without All-America forward Sherman Dillard, rolled to important victories over Roanoke College and Hampden-Sydney in their last two games.

The victories upped Madison's record to 15-5 as the Dukes drive toward their goal of a berth in the NCAA Division II South Atlantic Regional Tournament.

The Dukes defeated Roanoke College 102-78 here at Godwin Hall last Saturday night and then handed Hampden-Sydney its first home court loss of the season 77-58 Tuesday night. Madison outscored the Tigers 47-30 in the second half to break open a tight game. Madison led 30-28 at the half, but then Pat Dosh and David Correll took over and the Dukes widened their lead early in the second half.

Dosh, playing perhaps the finest game of his Madison career, scored a career-high 23 points, pulled down 10 rebounds and had seven assists. The 6'4" sophomore from Kensington, Md., has now scored 61 points and grabbed 30 rebounds in Madison's last three games.

Correll scored 20 of his game-high 24 points in the second half against Hampden-Sydney and also led all players with 14 rebounds.

Freshman guard Roger Hughett was also in double figures for the Dukes with 12 points. Hughett, who has started the last three games in place of the injured Dillard, has now scored 41 points in Madison's last three contests.

Madison set a school single-game record with 61 rebounds against the Tigers and senior guard Joe Pfahler established a new Madison single-season assist record. Pfahler, from Allentown, Pa., had 10 assists against Hampden-Sydney and now has 131 assists for the season. The old record of 126 assists was set by Wilbert Mills during the 1973-74 season.

Dillard, who has a bruised tendon of his right kneecap, is a doubtful participant in tonight's game. The 6'4" junior is averaging 24.6 points a game and was ranked 17th among Division II players in the nation in scoring in the latest statistics released by the NCAA.

Florida State is the fifth Division I team that Madison has played this season. The Dukes have a 2-2 record against Division I opponents. Madison defeated V.M.I. (82-76) and East Tennessee State (90-77), and lost to Memphis State (104-80) and George Washington (80-70).

Following tonight's game against Florida State, the Dukes go on the road for three straight games. Madison will be at the University of Maryland-Baltimore County on Tuesday (Feb. 17) and at George Mason University next Saturday (Feb. 21). The Dukes then travel to Roanoke for a re-match with the Maroons on Wednesday, Feb. 25, before returning home to play the final game on their 1975-76 schedule against Washington & Lee University on Saturday, Feb. 28.

**Madison Single Season Assist Record

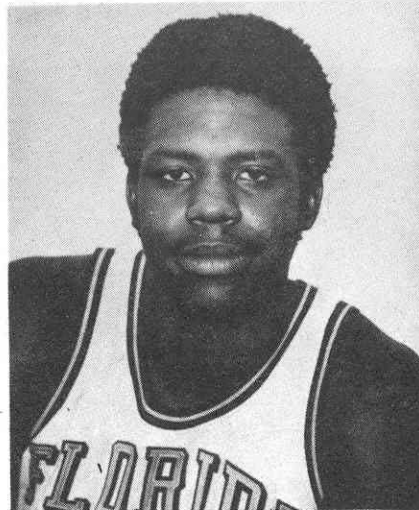
The powerful Seminoles of Florida State University bring a 15-5 record to Godwin Hall tonight. Florida State has defeated the likes of Jacksonville, Eastern Kentucky, Southwestern Louisiana, South Florida, Stetson, Rollins and Memphis State.

Memphis State is the only common opponent for Madison and Florida State. The Seminoles beat Memphis State by 21 points, while Madison lost to the Tigers by 24 in Memphis.

Florida State has lost to the nation's number-one-ranked team, Indiana, as well as to ninth-ranked Washington, eleventh-ranked Alabama, Oregon State, and Illinois State.

The Seminoles feature a balanced scoring attack led by 6'8" sophomore forward David Thompson, 6'7" sophomore forward Harry Davis, and 6'4" senior guard Larry Warren. Thompson is averaging 13.1 points a game, Davis 12.0, and Warren 10.6 points a game.

Florida State's top nine players are all averaging at least 6.5 points a game.

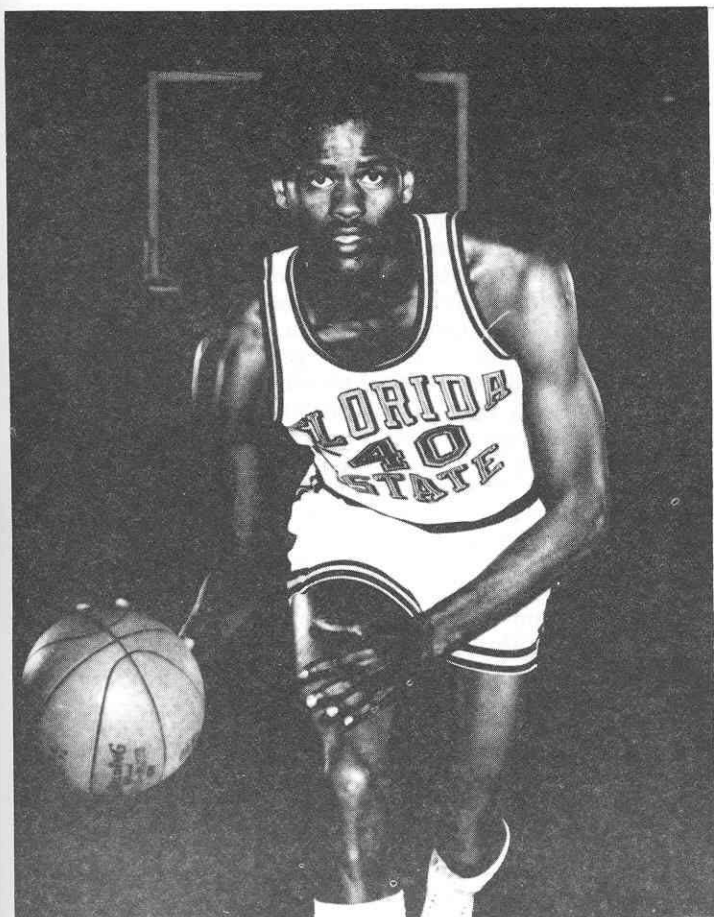

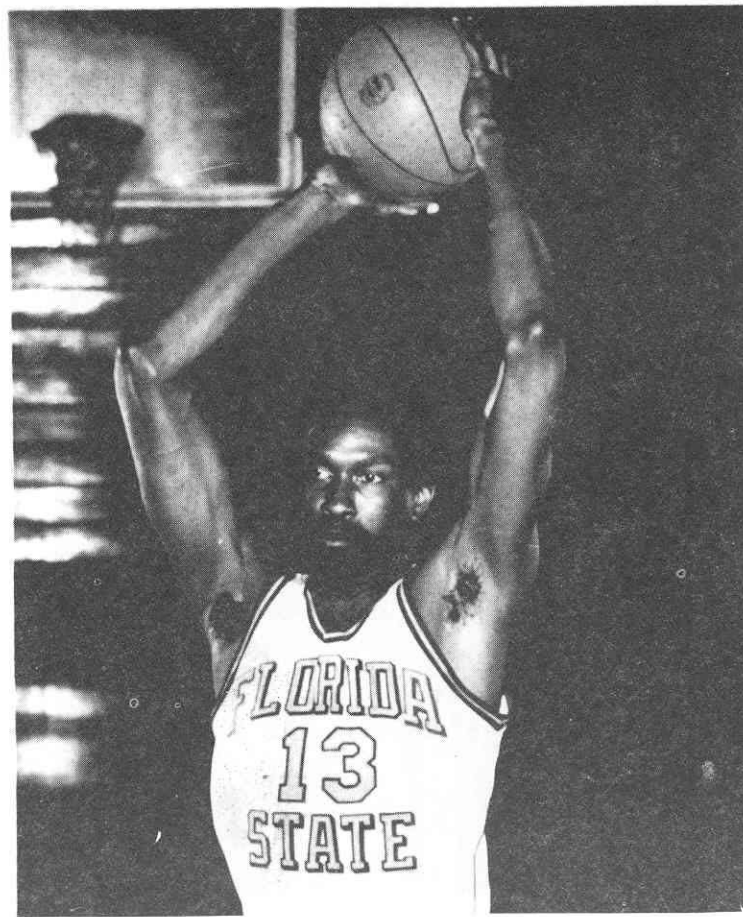
Thompson is Florida State's leading rebounder with an average of 8.1 a game, while 6'9" senior center Greg Grady is averaging 7.2 rebounds a game.

The Seminoles, who reached the finals of the 1972 NCAA tournament, have compiled an 18-8 record each of the last three seasons.

Hugh Durham is in his tenth season as head coach at Florida State. He started the 1975-76 season with a coaching record of 169-73, placing him 13th among all active coaches with a .698 winning percentage.

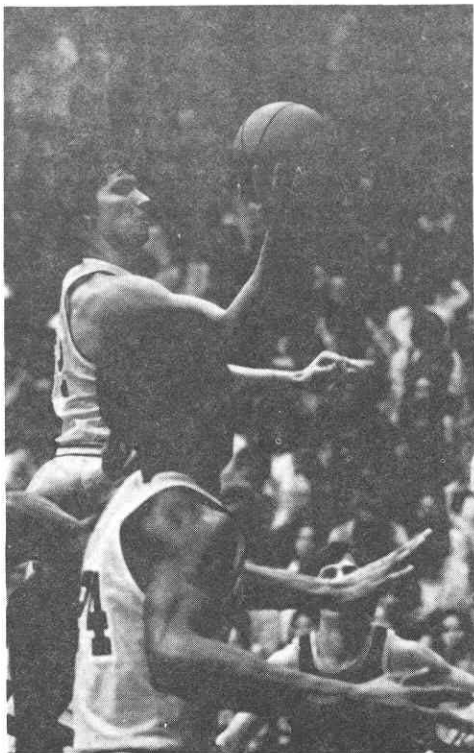

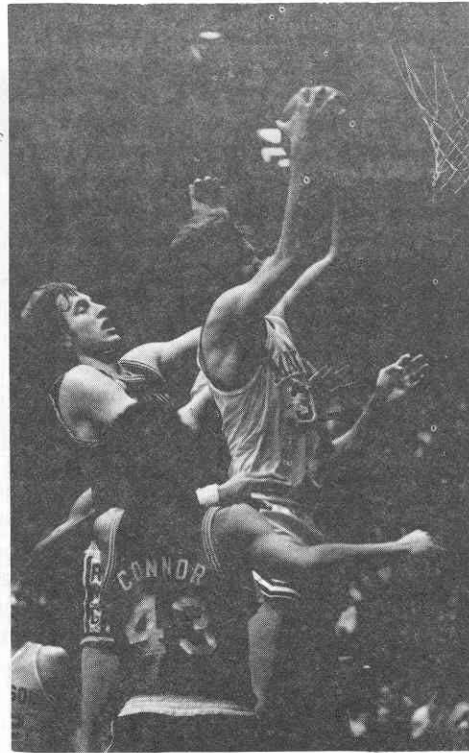

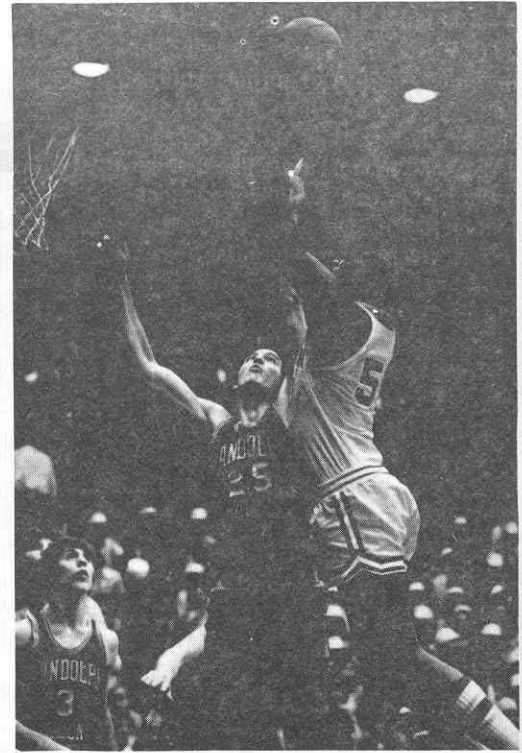

HUGH DURHAM - SEMINOLES' COACH

Over the last nine years, Florida State's basketball program has become recognized as one of the most successful in the nation. It is no coincidence that the same period marks the tenure of Hugh Durham as head coach. Actually, there may be no better measure of the Seminoles' success than the fact that Durham's lifetime coaching record of 169-73 has placed him 13th among all active coaches with a .698 winning percentage.

Winning on the court is only part of Durham's story, however. During his tenure Florida State has become a favored recruiting ground for the pros. No fewer than nine Seminoles have been drafted by the pros with several now active, including NBA All-Star and MVP Dave Cowens, of the Boston Celtics.

Durham's teams have been winners in all but his first season as head coach. That first year saw an injury-riddled Tribe struggle to an 11-15 record. Since that time, no Durham coached team has won fewer than 17 games. The 1969-70 squad finished 23-3 and the 1971-72 Seminoles went all the way to the NCAA finals before settling for a 27-9 record. Durham's teams are 4-2 in post-season tournament play and have garnered six in-season tournament titles and placed second in a half dozen more. His teams are noted for aggressive play, marked by a fast-paced offense and pressure defense.

The Florida State head man has been associated with the Seminoles for 19 years as either a player or a coach. As a Florida State player, Durham was one of the finest guards to play for the Seminoles. His three-year varsity scoring total of 1,381 points ranks sixth on the all-time list.

Following his graduation he was named coach of the freshman team and still holds the record for best winning percentage with a 9-1 record. He became a full-time assistant to Bud Kennedy in 1961 and was named head coach in 1966 following Kennedy's death.

During his tenure as an assistant coach, Durham also served as coach of the Florida State golf team and his squads were highly successful, winning 48 of 54 dual matches. One of Durham's recruits in golf was Hubert Green, former PGA Rookie of the Year and now one of the tour's most consistent players and a leading money winner.

Durham and his wife Malinda have three sons, David 15, Doug 10 and Jim 7.
