Time To Stand Up And Be Counted

Florida State hasn't played in a post-season tournament since the 1972 NCAA finals. The Seminoles hope their long wait won't be in vain.

When historians look back on Florida State's first season in the Metro Conference, they might somehow want to label it all "The 48 Hours of February".

In that span of time—February 5-7—the Seminoles were at their ultimate of

inconsistency—at their very best and at their very worst, against the very weakest and very strongest teams on the schedule.

It was rather ironic that it should workout that the two would be scheduled back-to-back on Saturday and Monday nights.

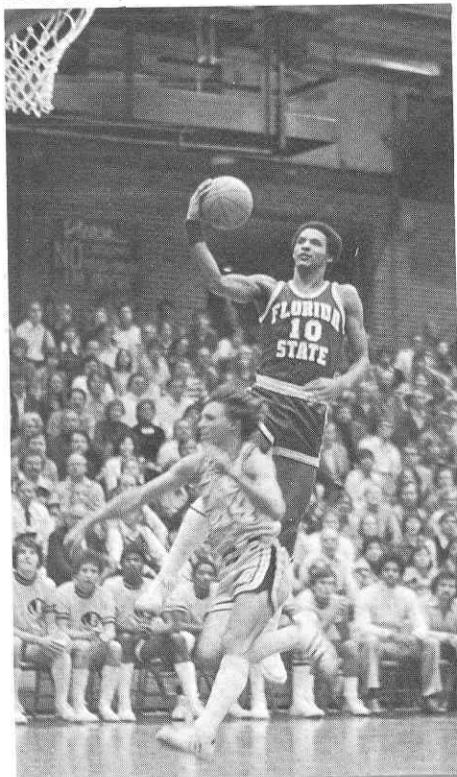
First, there was the hot Saturday night in Tully Gym in Tallahassee when the Seminoles made 68 per cent

of their shots and scored a single-game school record 139 points, beating hapless Baptist College, 139-67, for their second biggest winning margin in history.

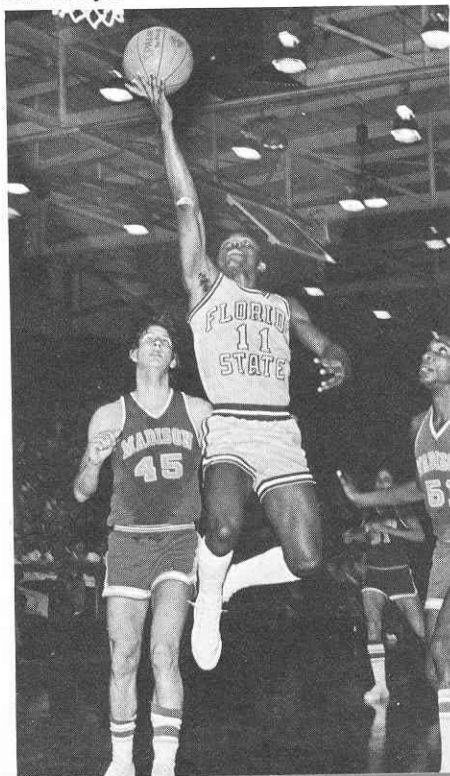
Then, two nights later in cold Freedom Hall, they made 42 per cent of their shots, scored 57 points and lost to Kentucky, 97-57, for the third worst defeat in history.

It's been that kind of a year," sighed Coach Hugh Durham. "Up and down,

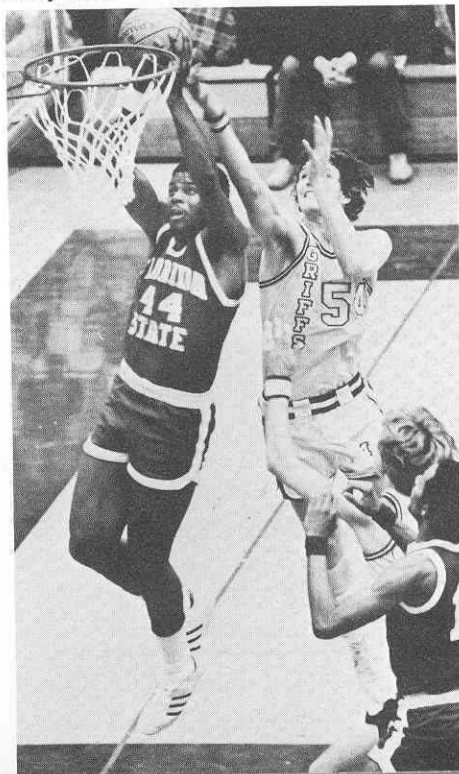
David Thompson

up and down, up and . . .”

“We have kinda looked at this whole season,” says Durham, “as getting ready for the Metro tournament. We had wanted to come up to the tournament with a building momentum . . . We thought we had it started twice, and then something would happen . . . and we’d have to regroup . . .”

This will mark the first post-season tournament appearance for the Seminoles since they reached the national finals in 1972.

It also will be the first time they have ever played in a tournament where the winner gets an automatic bid to the national championships.

“That’s what it’s all about,” says Durham. “It’s a new experience for us, and, naturally, we’re all very excited about it . . . We look at it as a great challenge with a great reward.

“What we did during the regular season doesn’t matter as much as it once did for us,” he explains. “We used to have to impress the NCAA selection committee. Now we have to win when the chips are on the table.”

Durham is counting on the fact that six of the seven teams (not including the No. 1 seed) starts even in the tournament.

“All you’ve got to be is consistently good for three games,” he deadpanned, knowing full well that the only consistent thing about the Seminoles has been inconsistency.

Through it all, however, stands the littlest Seminole with his finger stuck in the dyke.

He’s Carlton Byrd, the 5-foot-8, 140-pound point-guard, who is carrying on the “tradition of the little guard” at FSU.

The senior playmaker, who likes to challenge big men while driving toward the basket, sparks the Seminoles and generates crowd excitement.

“How Carlton goes, so goes the Seminoles,” says Durham, who has nominated him for “Little All-American” (players under six-feet). “He does whatever we ask him to do.

“It’s still a big man’s game,” adds Durham. “We have a tradition of a little guard, but we don’t go out purposely looking for the little man. I’ve always had one basic theory that if you’re good enough to play, you’re big enough.”

Byrd says the tradition was the reason he came to play at Florida State.

“I knew I’d get a chance, and that’s all I was asking for,” says Byrd, who got his chance and took advantage of it.

He took such an advantage that during the season he broke the Seminole career record for “most games played”, topping the old mark of 99 held by Greg Grady.

At the same time, he has found time to excel in the classroom, holding a 3.3 grade point average on a 4.0 scale in the school of physical education.

But, of course, Byrd’s more noted for his feats on the basketball floor, and fans love him for it.

“The fans themselves relate to the small guy,” says Byrd. “I guess that’s why they like me. It’s nice to be looked at and recognized.”

Byrd has averaged close to 14 points a game, ranking either second or third on the team all season, right behind David Thompson, who battled Tulane’s Jeff Cummings for scoring honors in the conference.

Thompson’s 20-point plus scoring average was built on some truly spectacular offensive nights.

“David has always been an outstanding offensive player,” says Durham. “He still hasn’t reached his potential as a defensive player or a team player. When he does, he’ll be an outstanding player, period.”

Durham is also hopeful that Harry Davis would show the form that marked his play as a freshman and sophomore.

Davis started his junior season by missing the first month of pre-season practice with an appendectomy, after being named the team’s MVP as a sophomore.

“I’m the first to admit that I haven’t played as well as I’d like or as well as I know I can play,” he said at midseason.

Near the end of the regular season David appeared on the threshold of returning to his old style of play. Part of Davis’ late improvement could be traced to the development of a couple of freshmen backup centers—Kris Anderson and Murray Brown.

“They both are coming around,” said Durham in the waning days of the season. “I’m gaining confidence in both . . . a little more and they may make us a more versatile team by tournament time.”

Wayne Smalls, like Byrd, are the only seniors on the squad, and Smalls has been one of those hot-and-cold players. Some very good games, and some not so good.

The fifth starter, James Smith, has been a steady performer, who averaged between 7-8 points a game during the season.
