

Florida versus Florida State. Make it football, baseball, or even checkers; the natural rivalry is there. And now add basketball to that list.

Beginning this year, and for the first time in nine years, the Gators and Seminoles will face each other in basketball. This year's game will be the only meeting in the 1978-79 roundball season of the two schools, but when construction is completed on new coliseums at each campus the series will become a home-and-home affair.

The Jacksonville Coliseum is the showplace for this year's game and the people who have the opportunity to view the game in person should be entertained by two exciting clubs.

"Jacksonville is always a good place to play," says Gator Head Coach John Lotz.

"The people in Jacksonville always turn out for good basketball and I think tonight's game will be one of the best they have seen."

Both Lotz and Joe Williams, the Seminoles' first year coach who is no stranger to Jacksonville fans, agree the resumption of the series is a great boom to basketball in the state.

"I feel this series will be good for college basketball in the State of Florida," Williams says. "This will be the biggest game in the state each year because of all the alumni from Florida and Florida State."

Lotz agrees.

"As it is in football, this could turn into one of the finest rivalries in the South. Interest is at an all-time high, and with the new coliseum's at each school a Florida-Florida State game can only get bigger and better."

Both Williams and Lotz agree the renewal of the series will also aid basketball in general in the state.

"I am sure this rivalry will spark more interest in basketball all over the state," says Williams.

"This game will be a boost not only to both schools, but for basketball in Florida," adds Lotz.

So sit back and enjoy what should be the, "start of something big".

Game Notes

Tonight's meeting between Florida and Florida State is the first time the two teams have met on the hardwood since 1969. In all, the Gators and Seminoles have played 23 times with Florida holding an 18-5 advantage. The series began in the championship game of the 1951 Gator Bowl Tournament; a game Florida won 61-51. Twice more the Gators and Seminoles were to meet in tournament action and the two teams split. Florida won again in the first round of the 1954 Gator Bowl Tournament 82-79, but FSU gained a measure of revenge with an 88-68 championship game victory in 1969. . . Speaking of the Gator Bowl Tournament, this year's field appears to be another solid one. In addition to Florida and Jacksonville, area fans will also see Pittsburgh and Massachusetts. . . When the Gators travel north to Hempstead, New York in ten days, it will be a homecoming of sorts for five members of the team. Four players, Malcolm Cesare, John Corso, and Mike Aldridge who all attended Holy Trinity High School, and Mike Milligan who prepped at Lutheran High School will be going back "home". Assistant Coach Ed Visscher, who coached at Lutheran for the past 17-seasons, will also be back in familiar surroundings. . . For Florida's Cris Collinsworth, this will be a tough night to root for one team. While Cris' loyalties are with the Orange and Blue, he will surely be pulling for the Seminoles and number 24; a fellow by the name of Greg Collinsworth who is his brother. . . For you fans unable to watch the Gators in person this year, you will have four opportunities to see them on television. The TVS Television Network will broadcast the Florida-Mississippi State game from Starkville, Miss., on Saturday, Feb. 17, and the Gator's final regular season game against Georgia in Alligator Alley on Saturday, Feb. 24. The Gator's conference opener against defending NCAA champion Kentucky on Wednesday, Jan. 3, and the Florida-Ole Miss contest from Oxford on Monday, Jan. 15 will be televised by Doug Layton Productions and can be seen in selected areas...

Rebuilding will be on the immediate

agenda for the Florida State Seminoles in the 1978-79 basketball season. With four starters, including three of the top four scorers missing from last year's NCAA tournament team, new coach Joe Williams will have his work cut out for him as he attempts to keep the Seminole fortunes on the upswing.

Lost from last year's 23-6 team which captured the Metro regular season crown are all-conference forward Harry Davis, forward David Thompson and guard Eugene Harris through graduation.

Speedy guards Tony Jackson and Mickey Dillard, both juniors, will be called upon to carry much of the load and provide the needed experience. Jackson, the only returning starter, was the Seminole's playmaker last season while leading the Metro Conference in assists (166) and steals (73).

Scoring in double figures in 23 games last year, Dillard will be called upon to continue his point production of last season. He was Florida State's second leading scorer with a 13.7 average and was selected to the second team all-Metro. As FSU's sixth starter, Dillard was also one of the conference's top free throw shooters, connecting on .733 of his attempts from the charity stripe.

Across the front line only reserves Murray Brown and Hank Mann return at forward. Brown, a junior, saw action in all but one game in 1978 and average 6.0 points. Mann, a one-time starter and the only senior on the FSU roster, averaged 4.0 points a game while playing in 27 contests.

Williams landed three good prospects in sophomore Ed Chatman, a 6-3 guard who averaged 20.5 points at Gulf Coast Community College last year; and freshmen Pernell Tookes a 6-6 forward from Orlando and 6-5 Greg Collinsworth from Titusville.
