Tough From Top To Bottom

The Doctor of Dunk is still operating at Louisville.

Virginia Tech still has the court wisdom of Solomon.

The Mule is expected to keep Florida State stubborn.

Darrell Griffith is THE doctor of dunk for perennial national power Louisville.

Dale Solomon is just a rising Virginia Tech sophomore but his hulking frame is expected to make Charles Moir a wise old coach.

Murray Brown is the Mule. He's so stubborn about his shot selection that he led the nation in percentage shooting and threatens to break Bill Walton's career accuracy mark with a senior season similar to last year.

The presence of Griffith, Solomon and Brown alone would tend to create excitement for the Metro Conference's fifth season.

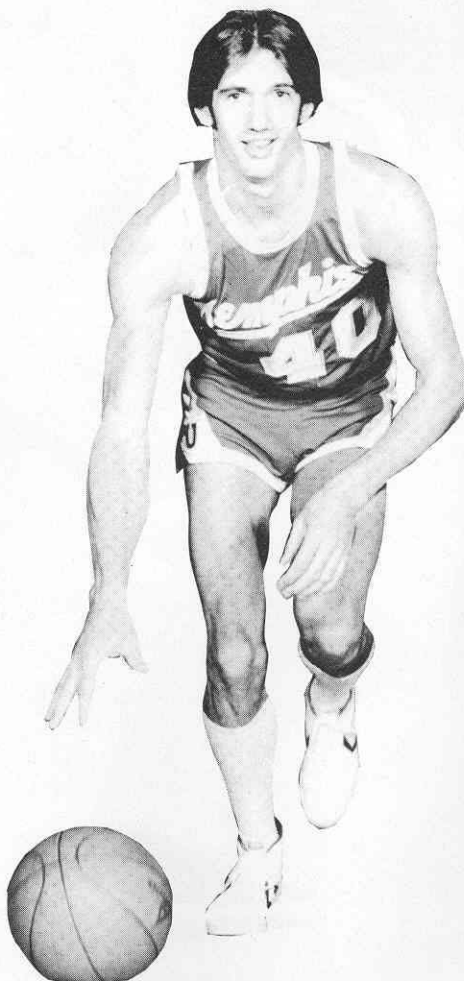
Instead, they help add to the loving confusion of a basketball grab bag, that when fully shaken, will produce mixed-up results.

In other words, the Metro will be at its toughest from top to bottom though the Darrell Griffiths and the Dale Solomons and the Murray Browns make the Louisvilles and the Virginia Techs and the Florida States the paper favorites.

It also means, explained Tulane's Roy Danforth in his most colorful Danforthism, "that when you go on the road now, you're liable to get your lunch in your hands."

The feeling is unanimous that this promises to become the toughest of Metro campaigns yet, with tournament time in Louisville offering a true second season. "The tournament," says St. Louis' Ron Ekker, "should be a ding-dong."

So should the regular season race.

"I expect the league to be much stronger," sighed Moir. "It should be great for the fans and tough on the coaches which is the way it's supposed to be. Lots of good matchups, I guarantee you that."

"I expect the league to be a lot tougher from top to bottom," said FSU's Joe Williams. "I think we'll be better but then everybody else will be better, too."

"From a conference standpoint--top to bottom--there's no question we're much stronger," said Danforth. "Virginia Tech won the tournament and

has the bulk of their players returning. Louisville won the conference, and basically has everybody back. Florida State has Dillard (Mickey) back and the other schools all had pretty good recruiting years."

"My personal feeling," explained Ekker, "is that it's much tougher than last year. We have three teams (Louisville, Virginia Tech and FSU) who have to be considered high caliber not only in our league but nationally. At least two, perhaps all three, deserve to be in the Top 20. When you have that caliber in the top of your league, you have to be strong. And the other four are probably better balanced."

Newcomer Dana Kirk of Memphis State thinks the Metro "is one of the, if not, THE toughest league in the country. There's a lot tradition. And this year looks to be the strongest. An up year with three teams deserving a shot at the Top 10 UNLESS they knock each other out."

So you see, the coaches believe.

Are they just sparring, looking for the winning opening?

Seeing is believing. Seeing the returning standouts on the rosters.

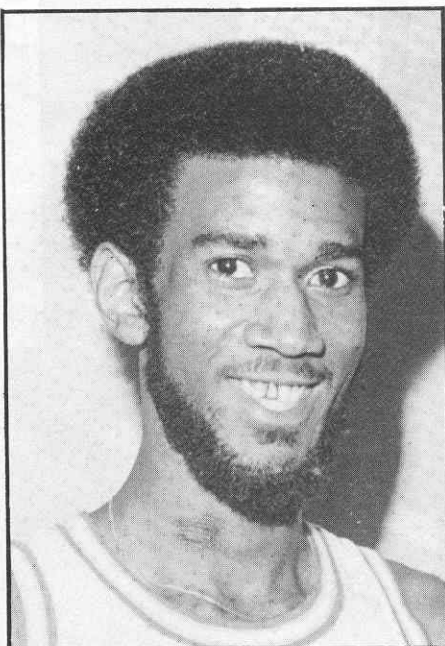
It's true that Louisville lost Larry Williams to graduation and Bob Turner to the books, but the Cardinals return Griffith, and redshirt Poncho Wright and freshman Rodney McCray and sophomore veterans Derek Smith and Scooter McCray. This won't be the biggest Louisville team ever put on the floor, but it will be quick and exciting. And, yes, they can all jump and dunk and intend to continue the label of Doctors of Dunk.

The 6-foot-3 Griffith, of course, is the catalyst. He leaps, he shoots, he rebounds and his defense has improved.

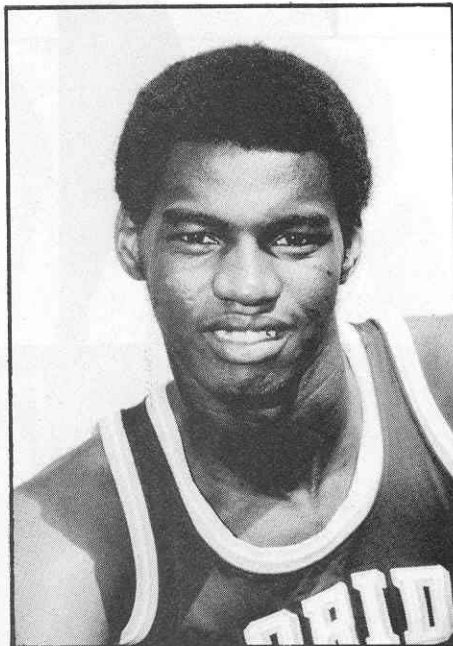
Williams is anxious to see Dillard back in action. He was only available for two games last year, averaging 20 points. Then the 6-2 junior (he got a medical redshirt last year) shattered his shinbone in a freak practice accident. He has worked hard to get ready to play.

"His leg seems to be doing fine," said Williams. "One leg is still not as strong as the other though it's stronger than the doctor thought it would be at this time."

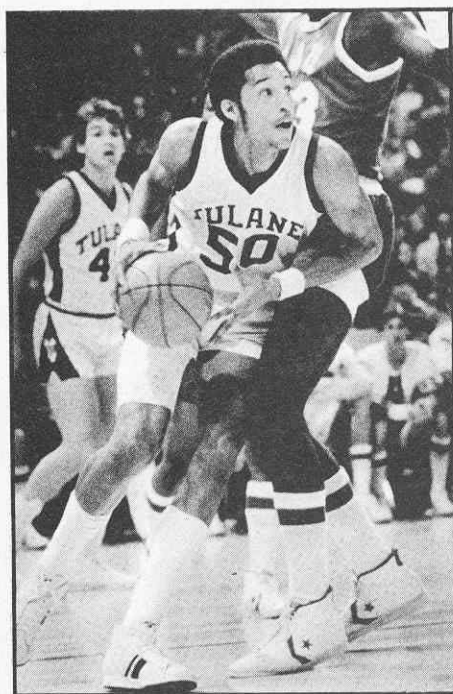
Dillard, Bobby Parks, Tony Jackson, James Bozeman, Ed Chatman and Brown all started at one time or all the time for FSU last year. All return and are complemented by 6-9 Elvis Rolle, a redshirt. Rodney Arnold, a 6-4 Furman transfer and redshirt, will be eligible after the first four games. Pernel Tookes also returns as a more confident player as a sophomore.



St. Louis senior Kelvin Henderson



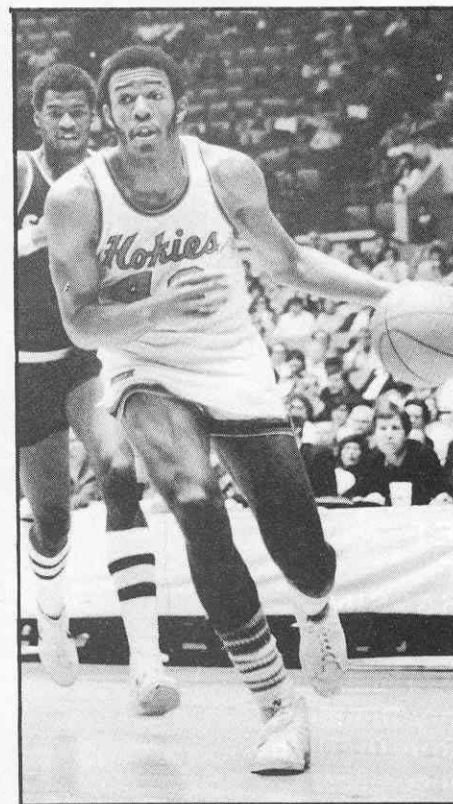
Florida State senior Murray Brown

Missing will be Kris Anderson, who will apparently be red-shirted while he works out his academic woes, and Donnie Cox, an Indiana transfer who is trying to regain eligibility at Lake City (Fla.) Community College.

Moir expects Virginia Tech to be improved. "We lost Ashford (Marshall) and Price (Tic)," he said, "and we'll miss them. We lost a lot of quickness, but I think we will shoot the ball better, and that more experience and maturity will help us become a better team."

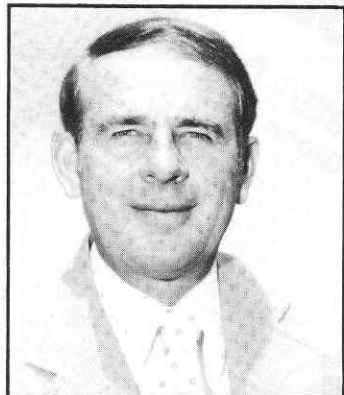


Virginia Tech senior Wayne Robinson

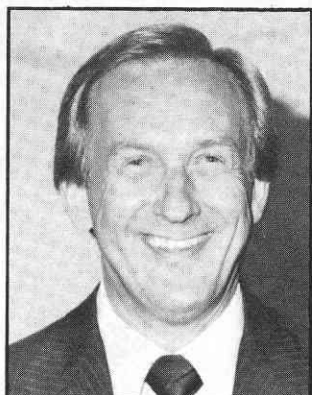

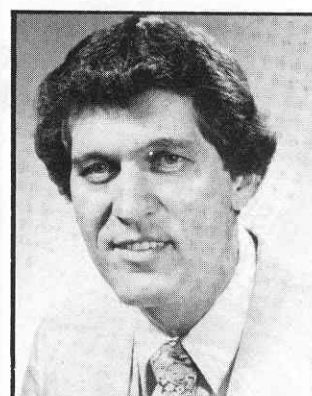

provides the outside spark and Moir has alot more where they came from.

Tulane will field its first all-Danforth team.

"Our strength is in our lower classes," admits Danforth. "It takes awhile to think along the same lines, learn the same philosophy as the coach. We've got a very young team with only three seniors on the squad. We will need to be mentally tougher."

But the majority of Green Wave players are now Danforth recruits. They understand what he wants. One of them, sophomore Joe Holston, was voted MVP by his teammates as a freshman. Another, Micah Blunt showed promise as a frosh, playing his best against the Metro's best big men. They complement senior leader Carlos Zuniga.

Ekker, on the other hand, has more

maturity in his lineup.

Four seniors and two seasoned junior college transfers are among his top eight Billikens.

"We feel we're better," he explained. "Not where I would like to be, but we have improved ourselves as a team. The kids coming back are better prepared to play with our system." Particularly 6-7 Kelvin Henderson, one of the Metro's top players a year ago.

"As the season moves along," Ekker promised, "things will change. We should be a different team in the tournament than we are in the beginning of the year."

Three returning senior starters, rising soph Bob Mueller, a pair of junior college prospects and an exciting freshman guard (LaTodd Johnson) figure to be Ekker's blend.

But youth will probably be served best at Memphis State. That's where Kirk will try to replace eight players in the program who no longer are around. EIGHT.

"We lost 63.7 of our 79.6 points," moaned Kirk.

Only guard Otis Jackson returns and

that's a starting point.

Then Kirk got rugged Dennis Isbell back in the program after a year's absence. He signed two Memphis prep stars to reestablish roots for the program. He added Steve Meacham, another ex-Tiger who has been out of the program.

"I'm just glad to use the term rebuilding, though," explains Kirk. "That means we've been there before."

"We will have to play hard, because we're not as talented as before. We have a new coach, a new system and new people. I doubt another team in the country has lost as many players as we have."

Among the new faces are 6-6 transfer Garry Taylor and 6-8 freshman A. Maceo Battle.

Cincinnati still has super quick Eddie Lee to show the way to a bevy of junior college newcomers, but Coach Ed Badger is still bemoaning the loss of Pat Cummings, one of the great centers in Metro Conference history. Rising soph Doug Schloemer gives the Bearcats another dimension with his jumping ability and enthusiasm.
