Tonight's Opponent . . .

Florida State University

Minnesota makes its second start of the 1980-81 basketball season . . . and second straight at home . . . tonight against the Coach Joe Williams' Florida State University Seminoles.

The visitors aren't strangers to Minnesota. They fell to the Gophers 88-74 in the 1977 Pillsbury Classic at Met Center. In addition, Florida State has beaten Minnesota twice . . . 112-91 in Tallahassee a year ago and 70-56 in the NCAA Regional Tournament at Dayton, Ohio in 1972.

But tonight does mark the first appearance in Williams Arena for the Seminoles, and the Gophers are expecting to face a powerful challenge at the hands of the invaders.

Coach Williams' contingent opened its season last Friday on its home court against Central Florida, so tonight also marks the first road assignment for the Seminoles this season.

The Seminoles are led once again by All-America candidate Mickey Dillard (20.4) at the guard slot. Joining Dillard in the backcourt is senior Bobby Parks (7.8) and junior Rodney Arnold (8.6). Arnold, still recovering from a hip infection is not expected to be able to play until mid-December.

At the forwards, the Seminoles have two 'new' players. Senior Kris Anderson, an academic casualty last year returns for his final campaign and James Bozeman enters his junior year after earning a starting berth last season only to tear an achilles tendon in practice.

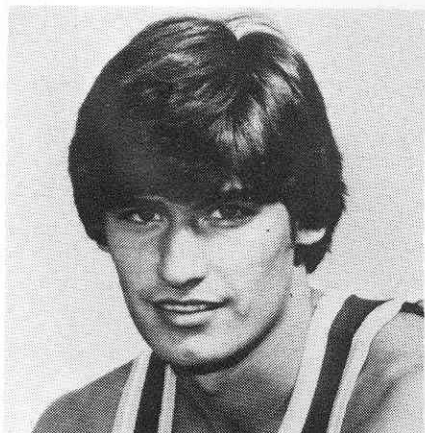
The center again is Elvis 'Big E' Rolle (15.3%7.9) who should receive inside help from Anderson and Bozeman.

The top recruit was 6-9 Oren Gilmore, Artis' brother, who is expected to see immediate action. Also off the Seminole bench, the best in three years, are returnees Pernell Tookes (4.1), Greg Collinsworth (1.1), Ed Young (0.7), Donnie Kuhl and Scott Matchett, and walk-ons Steve Dillard, Derrick Groomes and Hank McGrotha.

Coach Williams says, "a lot of our success will depend on how well our guards adjust to our new style of play. Last season our backcourt men had to play a scoring role. With this change of style they'll be more responsible for playmaking. If they can alter their style of play to playmaking AND scoring we should have a very good ballclub."

And that's what the Gophers will be facing tonight: a very good ballclub. Following tonight's contest, Coach Jim

Dutcher's cagers will head for Chicago where they will take on Loyola University Friday night. Next home assignment is December 17 against Marquette.

THE GAMES--Following an exhibition win over Marathon 011 (80-77) on Nov. 20, Florida State's basketball team opens the regular season with home games against Central Florida and Jacksonville and a trip to the Midwest to face Minnesota.

THE LAST MEETING--Friday's opening season contest against Central Florida marks the first time FSU and the Knights have faced each other on the hard wood. Florida State holds a 2-1 edge over the Minnesota Golden Gophers including a 112-91 verdict in Tully Gym in 1979. Against Jacksonville, the Tribe is 20-14. Last season, the Dolphins and Seminoles traded road wins, Jacksonville winning in Tully, 77-76, and Florida State taking a 64-55 verdict at the Coliseum.

THE COACHES--The Knights have had known only one coach in their 12-year basketball history. Gene 'Torchy' Clarke has 213-67 record including 200 wins in the last 10 years. The Gophers are led by Jim Dutcher who has amassed a 211-100 record in 11 years. In his five years at the Minnesota helm, Dutcher is 89-60. Tate Locke, the Jacksonville mentor, has a 197-147 report card in 13 seasons. In two seasons at JU, Locke is 39-20. Incidentally, since Locke arrived at JU, he and FSU head coach Joe Williams are 2-2 against each other.

The Tribe is led by third year mentor Joe Williams (SMU '56) who has a 275-167 record in 16 years of coaching. With the Seminoles, Williams is 41-19 including a 22-9 season last year and a trip to the NCAA Mid-east Regionals. Williams previous coaching stints have been at Jacksonville (1964-70; 92-61) where he took the Dolphins to the NCAA finals in the 1969-70 season, and Furman (1970-78; 142-87). Five times Furman was able to win the Southern Conference title and advance to the NCAA. Williams is also the only Division-I coach to take three separate teams to the NCAA playoffs.

THE TEAMS--Following a 25-4 season and a second place finish to Division II Regional Champion Florida Southern, the Knights find themselves in a rebuilding year at the guard position. Last year's leading scorer Bo Clarke (26.8 ppg) and backcourt mate Joe Jones (18.7) are gone, but returning are four year seniors Ruben Cotton (15.3) and Dean Rossin (6.2). The Knights top recruit was Jimmie Ferrell, a Navy transfer, who is expected to start at guard.

Minnesota, the NIT runner-up last season, looks stronger even with the loss of center Kevin McHale. Guard Darryl Mitchell and center Jim Breuer both earned All-NIT honors, and forwards Trent Tucker and Gary Holmes have both started the past two seasons. The Gophers and Seminoles play common foes Louisville and Marquette later in the season. Minnesota features its best bench strength ever with forwards Ben Coleman and John Wiley leading the way.

Jacksonville has the task of replacing center James Ray, one of the top players in the country last season. The heir apparent for Ray's slot is Linwood Davis (6-8, So.) with Barlow Taylor (6-9, 225), close behind. Returning are Mike Hackett (13.3) and Steve Tutson (8.4) at the forwards and Jimmy Martin at guard (8.4). Freshman guards Harvin Council and Garry Grier, both South Carolina All-Stars, are expected to provide immediate help.

LATER ON--Following these three games, the Seminoles will journey to Jacksonville to face Florida (Dec. 13, 7:30 p.m.), Auburn (Dec. 17, 7:30 CST) and then compete in Atlanta's Cotton States Tournament (Dec. 20-21) featuring Missouri, Georgia, Tennessee-Chattanooga and FSU. The Seminoles will open with the Tigers on the 20th at 7:00 p.m.
