# JOE WILLIAMS

Head Basketball Coach

Entering his third year at the Seminole basketball helm, Florida State head coach Joe Williams has proven he intends to leave his mark at the Tallahassee school as his three predecessors before him.

A native of Morton, Mississippi, the likeable mentor accepted the task of guiding the nationally-touted Seminole program in 1978 after previous coaching stints at Jacksonville and Furman where his teams combined for a 234-148 record.

Following a rebuilding program his first season when the Seminoles finished with a 19-10 mark and a second place Metro finish, the Williams led squad broke into the NCAA playoffs last year. The Tribe finished with a 22-9 record including another second place Metro outing and a win over Toledo in NCAA Mideast Regionals.

Williams' career coaching mark now stands at 275-167 (.662) over a 16 year span. Williams is also the only NCAA coach to take three separate teams to the NCAA playoffs on three separate occasions.

Florida State was Williams' first collegiate assignment in 1962 when he was freshman coach for the late Bud Kennedy. He advanced to Furman in 1963 as an assistant coach before taking the top job at Jacksonville in 1964.

During his first season at Jacksonville, the Dolphins advanced to the NAIA national playoffs in Kansas City. Five years later, Jacksonville was pitted in the NCAA championship game against powerful UCLA and finished with a 27-2 mark. In the six year period Williams had molded the Dolphin program into one of the country's most respected achieving a 92-61 mark.

He returned to Furman following the banner 1969-70 season at Jacksonville and was to become the school's winningest coach. In seven of eight seasons, the Paldins had winning records and Williams' mark was 142-87. Five times Furman was able to win the Southern Conference title and advance to the NCAA playoffs.

Williams played and learned basketball under Abe Lemons (currently head coach at Texas) at Oklahoma City University. He received his bachelor's degree from SMU in 1956 and later earned his master's from Florida in 1968.

# This Is Florida State

Florida State University — the home of more than 20,000 Seminoles — has a campus that starts at the top of one of Tallahassee's famed seven hills, and rolls gently downward and westward across 340-odd acres.

Founded in 1857 as the Seminary West of the Suwannee, its heritage is evidenced in the wide range of architectural struggles to preserve history and keep up with modern times and air conditioning. Yet it still ranks as one of the South's last few bastions of campus greenery — the kind that combines the blossoms of camellias, azaleas and dogwoods with moss-hung oaks that are, in some cases, as old as the University itself, if not older.

From the Gothic towers of Westcott at the eastern entrance to the campus, to the modern glass and steel structures of its Science Complex on the west, Florida State University has moved forward in time and growth more rapidly than many of its newer

counterparts in the State University System. Its enrollment has quadrupled since it became coeducational in 1947, following nearly half a century as the Florida State College for Women.

Today, its 14 schools and colleges offer students the opportunity to pick and choose from more than 100 career options offered in arts and sciences, business communication, criminology, dance, education, home economics, law, library science, music, nursing, social sciences, social work, theater and visual arts programs.

The University is a member of the Academic Common Market and has overseas study centers in Florence, London and the Panama Canal Zone. Summer programs of study are offered in law at Oxford, in hotel and restaurant administration in Switzerland, and in comparative studies of economic and social systems in Yugoslavia.

The location of FSU in the Capital City of Florida offers unusual opportunities for study and research in

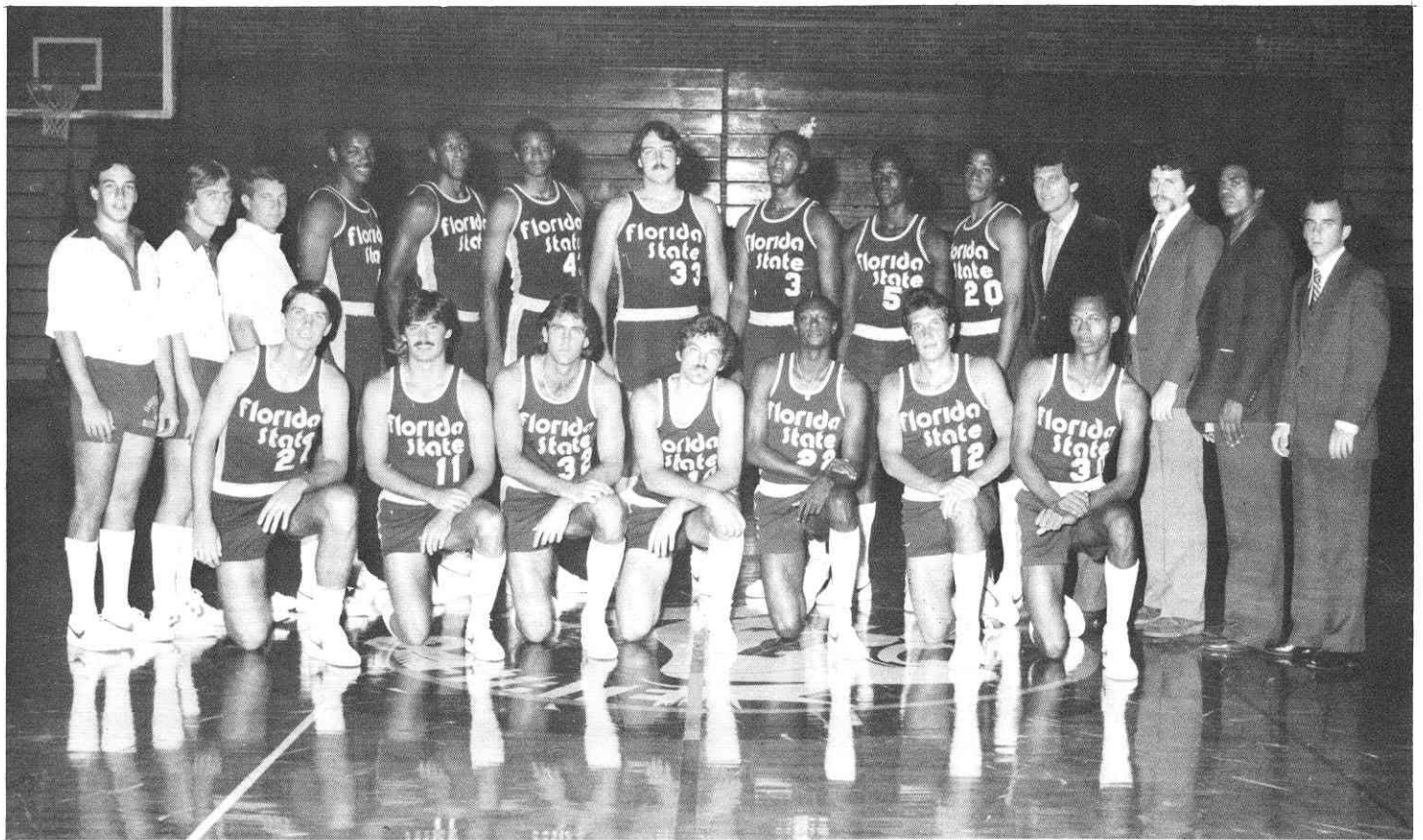
the social and policy sciences, and an optimum environment for internships and on-the-job learning experiences for students in many fields of study.

The University operates major laboratory facilities for nuclear, marine and computer research. The Florida State nuclear physics laboratory is ranked one of the top four in the nation by the National Science Foundation. Because of this ranking, it has been recommended for higher funding.

Florida State is also the home of the Flying High Circus, the only collegiate circus in the United States. The Circus has delighted audiences the world over with breathtaking, highly-skilled performances that rival professional circuses. The student performers have earned a national reputation as a high-caliber student troupe. Their traveling show is primarily an aerial and stage presentation with approximately 90 students performing during a two-hour show.

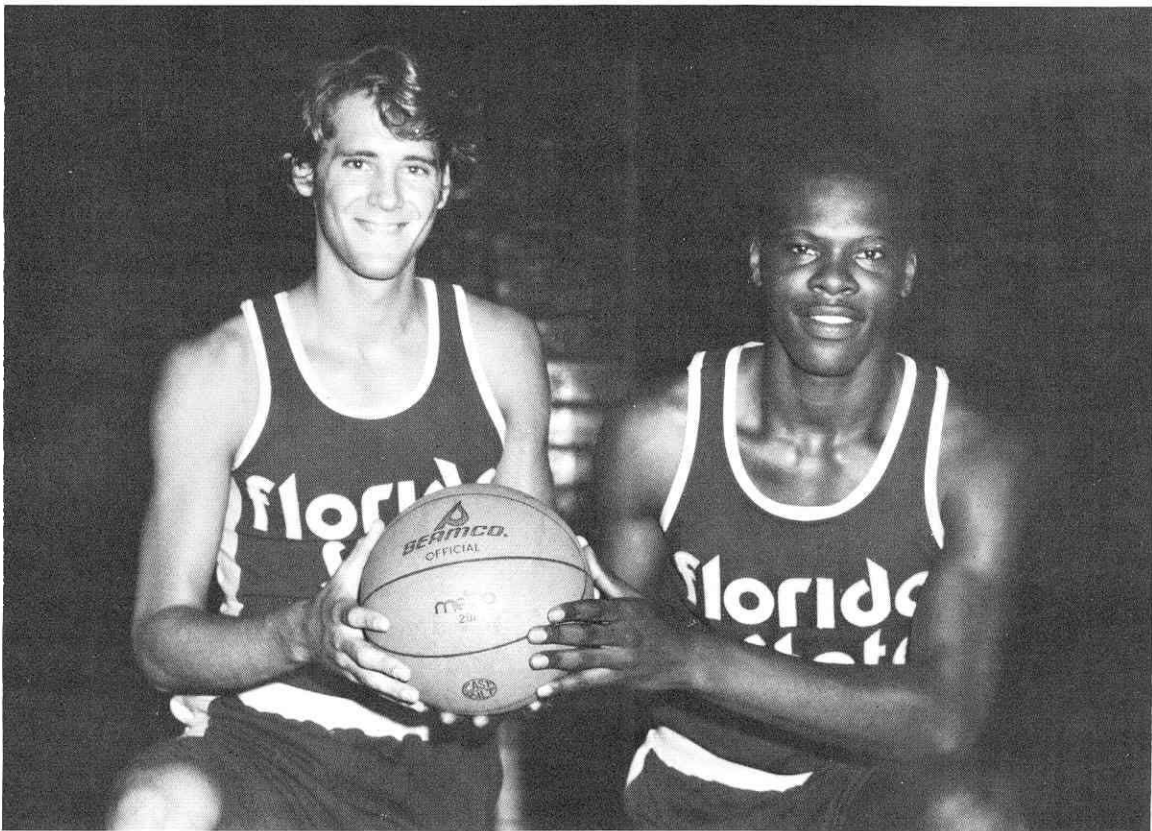

Wilkes, son of Stetson coach Glenn Wilkes, played for Clemson last season where he averaged just under two

points per game while playing point guard. Wilkes best assets are his ball handling ability and his free throw accuracy. Wilkes also played for Deland High School and led them to 13th place ranking nationally his senior season.

Johnson, a former player under Seminole Assistant coach Steve

Williams at Pensacola High School, comes to Florida State from North Carolina Charlotte. While competing at NC Charlotte, Johnson averaged seven points and four rebounds while competing in all 27 games. Johnson is expected to see action for the Tribe in the small forward position.



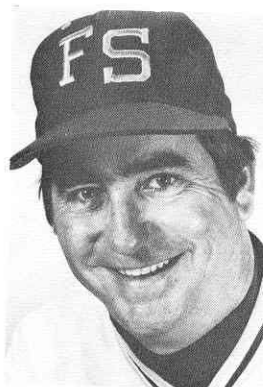

FLORIDA STATE vs. JACKSONVILLE  
Saturday, December 6, 1980  
Tully Gym Tallahassee, Florida

THE GAME--Tonight's contest marks the third game of the season for both teams. Florida State is 1-1, scoring a 57-41 victory at home in the opening game against Central Florida, then falling 79-66 vs. Minnesota on the road. The Dolphins also hold a 1-1 report card. JU opened with a 57-44 loss to Wake Forest away, but came back with a 90-60 verdict over Eckerd at Jacksonville.

THE LAST MEETING--The last time these two squads met (2/16/80) the Tribe came away with a 64-55 win on the road. The Seminoles revenged a 77-76 defeat to the Dolphins earlier last season at Tully Gym. An interesting note shows JU's Tate Locke 2-2 against Seminole mentor Joe Williams since arriving at Jacksonville.

THE COACHES--The Seminoles are led by third year coach Joe Williams (SMU '56) who has a 275-168 record in 16 plus seasons of coaching. With the Seminoles, Williams is 42-20 including a 22-9 season last year and a trip to the Mideast Regional. Williams' previous coaching stints have been at tonight's opponent Jacksonville (1964-70; 92-61) where he took the Dolphins to the NCAA finals in the 1969-70 season, and Furman (1970-78; 142-87). Five times Furman was able to win the Southern Conference and advance to the NCAA. Williams is the only Division I coach to take three separate teams to the NCAA playoffs.

Jacksonville is Tate Locke's fourth coaching assignment. Locke previously worked with Army (2 years; 40-15), Miami of Ohio (4 years; 56-42), Clemson (5 years; 62-70) and now with JU (3 years; 40-21).

OFF THE BENCH--Look for the Seminoles to call upon Pernell Tookes (6-6, Jr., 8.0/2.0) or Oren Gilmore (6-9, Fr., 5.0/4.0) first off the Seminole bench. Against the Minnesota Golden Gophers, Gilmore tallied nine points, seven in the first half. Tookes, a steadily improving player, started none, but played in all 31 Seminole games last season. JU will counter with freshman Harvey Council and Garry Grier, both former South Carolina All-Stars. The Dolphins should also use Steve Tutson, Terry Bruch, and Linwood Davis, a local product from Tallahassee Leon.

NEW FACES--Those seeing the Seminoles for the first time this year will see some new faces flanking head coach Williams. Joining the Seminole staff this season is former Pensacola High School coach Steve Williams, a Florida graduate, and former JU player Rex Morgan. Morgan played under Williams for the Dolphins and coached one year under Tom Waskin at JU. Morgan also played three seasons with the Boston Celtics.

ALMOST NEW--Seminole forwards James Bozeman and Kris Anderson are back this season from redshirted years in 1979. Bozeman tore his achilles tendon in pre-season practice, while Anderson was an academic casualty.

NEXT--The Tribe will journey to Jacksonville to play another state rival Florida, December 13, at 7:30 p.m. The Dolphins will host another Tallahassee team, The Florida A & M Rattlers, December 9.

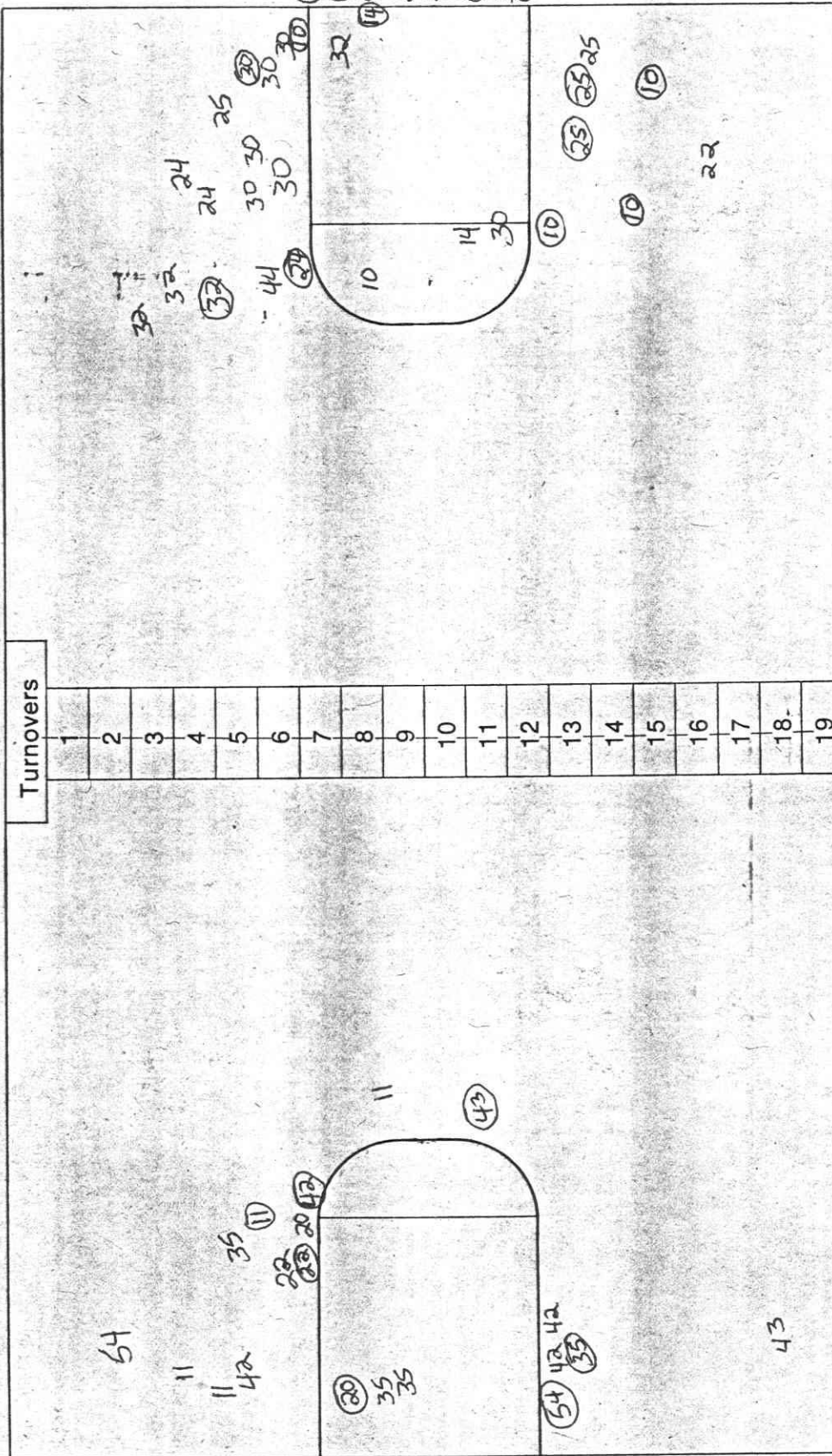
