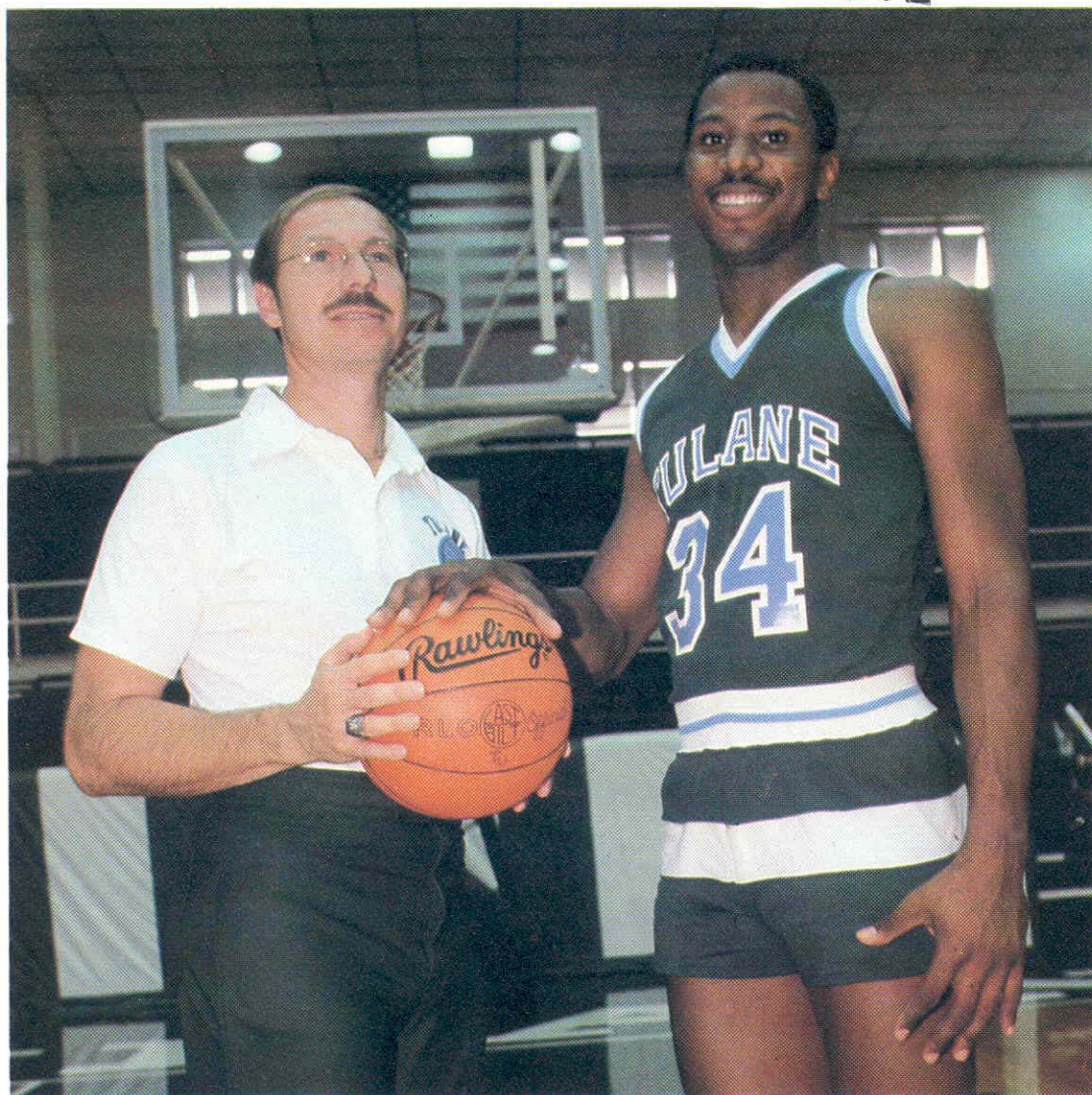

# Florida State Women Up Against Top-Ranked Competition

Florida State got a taste of big time competition last week when it faced Old Dominion in Norfolk, VA. But a greater challenge lies ahead this week. TWO ranked teams — Memphis State (17th) and South Carolina (9th) — will be playing the Lady Seminoles in addition to a strong Southern Mississippi squad. All three games will be played in Tallahassee.

Florida State, 16-2 on the season (as of this writing, the Florida A & M games has not been played), is fresh off road trips to Gainesville and Virginia. Early in the week, FSU avenged an early-season defeat administered by the Gators and won 86-79. Then in Virginia, FSU beat Virginia Tech (93-82) but lost to Old Dominion (100-65). Plagued by foul trouble, injuries and an all-around lack of height against ODU's "twin towers" of 6-8 Anne Donovan and 6-5 Janet Davis, Florida State did not have its best day.

But this squad can not be ignored. It still has a chance to prove it deserves national ranking and what a better way than against top ranked competition. What transpires this week may be more important than the outcome of the Old Dominion contest.

Super Soph Sue Galkantas, already the

third all-time leading scorer in FSU's women's basketball history, will be presented a basketball sometime this week for reaching 1,000 career points. It's amazing that it has only taken the 6-0 forward a year and a half to reach that milestone. If Galkantas can keep up the pace, she would become the first basketball player at Florida State — man or woman — to score 2,000 points. She could also become the second woman to grab 1,000 rebounds in a career. Cherry Rivers (now a part-time assistant with the program) was the only previous player to do it in a career.

Galkantas is averaging 20.4 points in 1982 and she's pulling down 9.4 rebounds each game. She owns seven of the 12 30-point games in Lady Seminole history and two have come this year. Against Kent State, she had 30 points and seven rebounds and her numbers against Virginia Tech were 33 and 13.

Slick-shooting guard Lisa Foglio has scored in double figures in each one of the Lady Seminoles games and is also averaging three assists. Her best game came against Miami of Ohio when she had 30 points, seven rebounds and four assists. She is presently

ranked 18th in the nation with her 59 percent field goal accuracy.

Senior Laine Lasseter, hobbled recently from a knee injury, is the squad's third leading scorer with an 8.8 average. Close behind Lasseter is LeeVayne Oliver (7.9) and Glenda Stokes (7.6). Stokes is averaging 7.6 rebounds, too, and has been playing outstanding defense. Against Virginia Tech she had 21 rebounds, a career high for the Eatonton, Ga. native.

Tribe Tidbits: Memphis State will play FSU in the Leon County Civic Center beginning at 5:15 p.m. Monday (Jan. 25) . . . the South Carolina game will be played in Tully Gym at 7:00 p.m. Wednesday (Jan. 27) and the Southern Miss game is scheduled to be played after the men's game — around 3:30 p.m. — on Saturday (Jan. 30) in the Civic Center. . . South Carolina has been in the top twenty rankings consistently over the past five years . . . the Lady Gamecocks were as high as second this year but their coach, Parr Parsons, left the school amid controversy . . . South Carolina forward Evelyn Johnson is the sister of Los Angeles Laker star Magic Johnson . . .

## Wiggins Leads Seminole Star-Studded Cast

It may be a Mitchell Wiggins Epic, but there is also a star-studded cast performing this year in the Florida State Basketball Movie.

While Wiggins has remained the team's leading scorer and rebounder since gaining eligibility against Auburn, the other Seminoles in the starting lineup and players coming off the bench have also aided in the Tribe's winning ways. Point guard Tony Williams has been in double figures all season and tops the team in steals and assists. Against Virginia Tech in one of the squad's best wins of the year, Williams hit a crucial basket late in the game and guided the offense throughout the contest.

Forward Michael Johnson has also been in twin figures all season, is second on the team in assists and had 13 points against Virginia Tech including an opening game slam dunk. At the other forward, David Speights has been a pillar of strength. Like the rest of the FSU starters, Speights too is in double figures and is high on the team in total rebounds. His high point game this year has been a 20 point effort in an overtime win against Jacksonville at the Florida Four Tournament.

Coming into his own in his sophomore season, center Oren Gilmore rounds out the starting five. Averaging over ten points per game, Gilmore has had several exceptional performances against top competition. Against Georgia earlier this season he scored a career high 21 points and against Virginia Tech he added 16 points and grabbed seven

rebounds. In that Tech contest, Gilmore held All-Metro Conference player Dale Solomon to 16 points and only three rebounds.

When the team needs to spell a player, FSU has received needed help from its bench. The first player off the pine has been freshman Maurice Myrick who has seen playing time in every game. A versatile player, Myrick can play either forward or guard and has helped the squad by chipping in over seven points a game.

Helping in the center slot have been Bobby Miles and Raphael Phillip. Miles, a sophomore who gained eligibility with Wiggins, has scored nearly four points per game and has played steady defense. An intimidating player, Phillip has missed the last seven games with a broken foot, but played in every contest until his injury.

Reserve point guard Ronnie Watson has played in all but one game this season for FSU and has done well. He has been able to lead the offense, make things happen on defense and has hit probably the two biggest free throws of the year. With FSU up by just two at Virginia Tech, Watson calmly went to the line in a one and one situation and hit both shots to seal the FSU win. Also at guard are Scott Wilkes and Booney Crawford. Both Wilkes and Crawford have seen limited action, but when called upon have lived up to their preseason expectations. Both are good ball handlers, able to run the complex FSU offense and are team leaders.

While a great supporting cast will win you an Oscar nomination, it takes a big star to

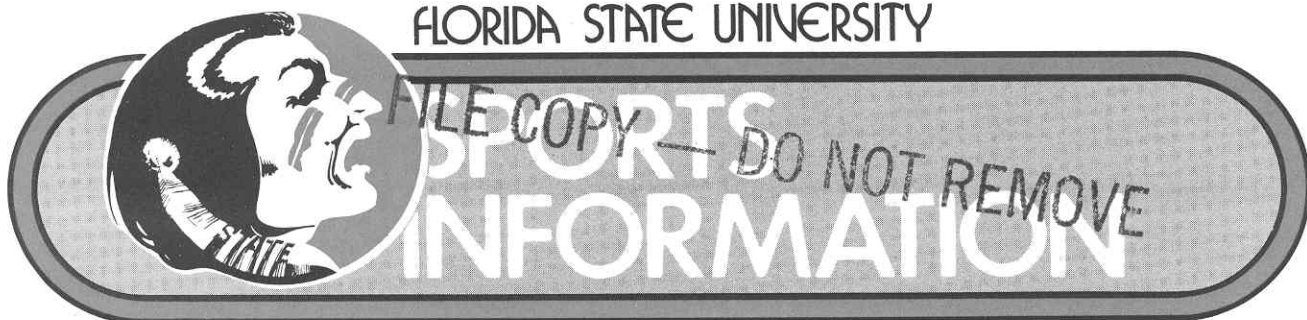
win the award. In Wiggins, Florida State has that star. In nine games, Wiggins has averaged over 25 points and 10 rebounds. He has scored 37 points twice — ninth all-time single game record for FSU — and has been held under 20 just once. He has a single game high 15 rebounds — tops on the team — and has led the squad in that category seven times. For his efforts he has been named the Metro Conference Player of the Week twice — the only player in the league to earn that distinction — and was the Honeywell Player of the Game in a nationally televised contest on CBS.

"We have a very balanced team," said FSU head coach Joe Williams. "We're a young squad and everyone wants to contribute. This has to be one of the most unselfish teams I've ever coached. Players are giving up shots to feed their teammates for easy baskets. I see us only improving the remainder of the year."

While Williams is quick in praising the entire squad, he also has several kind words for the latest FSU superstar.

"Mitchell (Wiggins) is one of the top five players I've ever coached," Williams said. "He can do everything. He can go to basket, shoot from the outside or pass off to another player for a basket. Before its over he will be one of the best players ever to play at Florida State."

THE GAME--Tonight's contest matches Metro Conference foes Tulane and Florida State. The game marks the first outing for the Seminoles since the team played Tulane February 1, at New Orleans. The Green Wave's last game was two nights ago when the squad defeated Cincinnati 53-39.

THE LAST MEETING--When the two squads met nine days ago, Tulane was victorious taking a 66-53 decision. The Green Wave led by as many as 13 points in the first stanza, but FSU cut the lead to two 53-51 with 3:13 remaining in the game before the home team went on to outscore the visitors 13-2. Tulane took advantage of a 33-18 rebounding edge, and converted on 22 of 32 free throws compared to FSU's five of six from the line. The Green Wave's Paul Thompson led all scorers with 22 points followed by teammate John Williams with 17. High man for FSU was Oren Gilmore with 14. Overall, FSU holds a 15-5 series advantage.

LATELY--The Tribe has won six of its last eight games including a 71-65 victory of Louisville January 30. Tulane has been slightly hotter capturing six of its last seven contests.

FIVE OF A KIND--Seminole scoring this season has continued to be balanced. All five starters for the Tribe are averaging in double figures, and four of the first five are grabbing 4.9 rebounds per game or more.

MITCHELL STILL TOPS--Although he has been held under 20 points the last two outings, FSU guard Mitchell Wiggins still leads the team in scoring (24.4) and rebounding (9.5). His .560 (144-257) field goal percentage is also first on the team.

BACK TO WORK--The nine day layoff between games is the longest stretch this season the Tribe will be idle. There has already been a one week layoff, and there will be another seven day break, but the nine days off is the longest rest.

THE COACHES--The Tribe is led by fourth year coach Joe Williams (SMU '56) who is 68-40 in three plus seasons at the FSU helm. Williams' previous coaching stints have been at Jacksonville (1965-70; 92-61) and Furman (1970-78; 142-87). Overall Williams' coaching ledger is 302-188 in 17 plus seasons. Tulane is guided by first year mentor Ned Fowler who joined the Green Wave after serving at Tyler Junior College in Tyler, Texas. At Tyler, Fowler's coaching mark was 83-22.

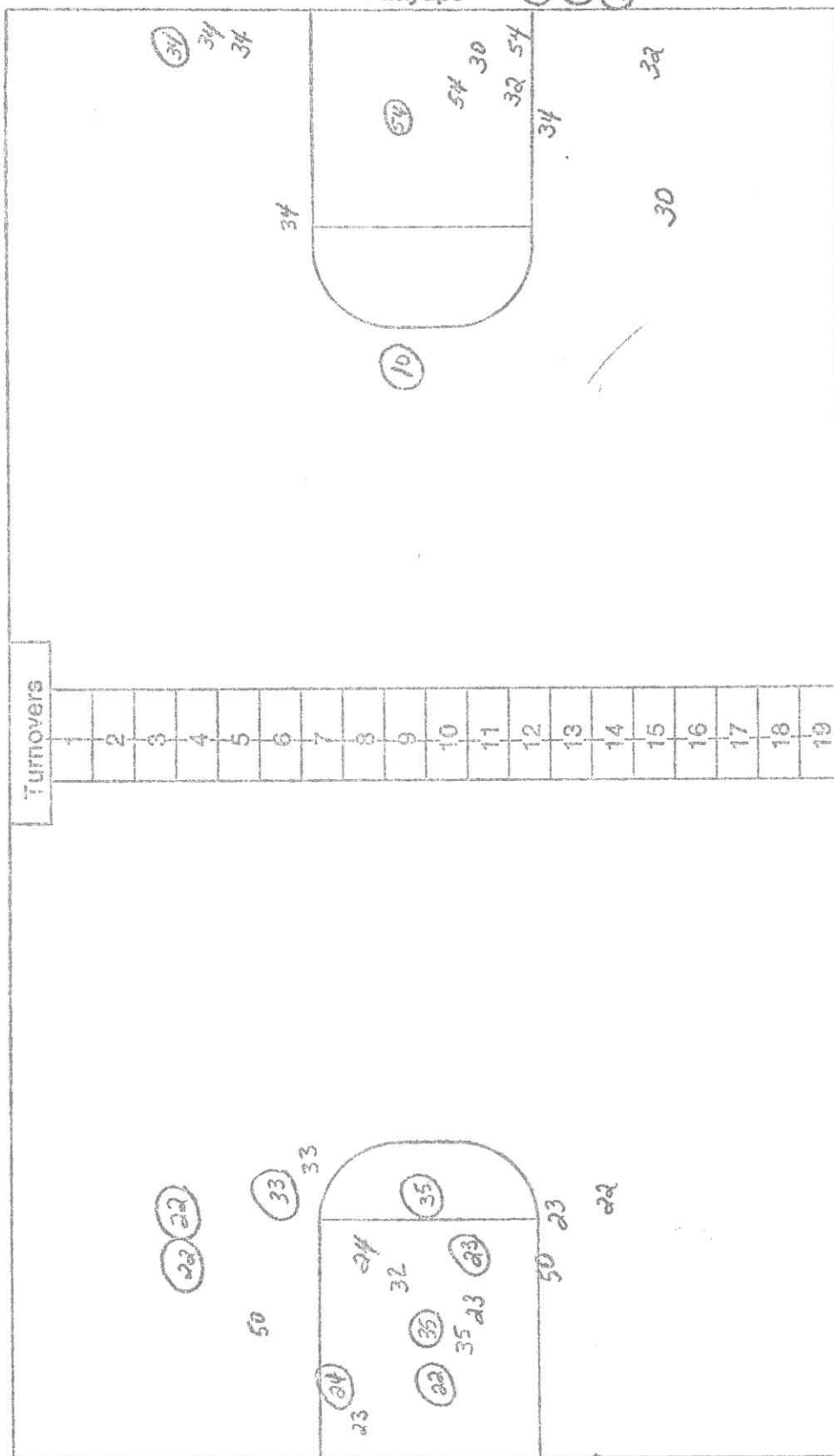
## BASKETBALL SHOT CHART
