# DISPUTED VICTORY

Florida State University's Seminole baseball team came from behind Friday night to score a hotly-disputed 7-6 win over Middle Georgia college in a ten-inning game at Centennial Field. Lamar Brown scored the winning run on a wild pitch.

John Witt, who relieved Godfrey Knight in the ninth, got credit for his third victory of the season and the second win for him against the Georgia combine.

The dispute arose in the top of the tenth when Billy Parker, third sacker for the Seminoles, pulled the old hidden ball trick on a Georgia player to halt a threatened rally. The Georgia coach and players maintained that the ball was not in play when Parker tagged the runner. After a heated argument between the coaches and team members, the umpires ruled that the ball was in play.

## Knight Pitches Well

Knight pitched good ball, allowing seven hits while striking out nine, but he was given shoddy fielding support by his teammates who committed six miscues.

Dozier Allen, Lamar Brown and Billy Parker collected two hits each to lead a 12-hit attack on Georgia Pitchers Haynes and Patillo.

Allen rapped two doubles, and was deprived of a homer when he failed to touch third. Brown, Parker and Dago Murphy blasted triples.

The Teachers threatened to run away with the game as they practically ran the bases ragged with 11 steals, but the Indians counter-attacked with six.
