

Three Duke University pitchers held Florida State to only four hits yesterday while their mates were managing two late-inning bursts that were good for seven runs and an 8-4 victory in the first of a two-game series.

The two teams were scheduled to meet again this afternoon at 3 on the East Campus diamond. Max Long, veteran right-hander, was given the nod by Seminole Coach Ralph Matherly. Long has won four and lost none this season.

Jim Atwood, sophomore right-hander, had the Blue Devils under control going into the seventh inning yesterday. The Seminoles jumped to a quick two-run lead in the first inning, taking advantage of Duke starter Don Snowberger's wildness.

EARLY SCORING

After Ken Boyce drew a free pass, Billy Campbell beat out a bobbler to deep short and Cooter Mills walked to fill the bases. Tom Moore lashed a long fly to centerfield, scoring Boyce from third. Successive walks to Bob Hudson and Gary Ashley forced in another run.

Duke pushed across one run on their half of the second inning on two singles and an error. Lead-off man Jake Tarr cracked a line single to centerfield and advanced all the way to third as Hudson let the ball get by him and roll to the left-center fence. W. D. Fesperman then lined a one-bagger to left, scoring Tarr.

FSU added an unearned run in the bottom of the sixth. With one out, Carlee Hendrix slapped a long drive to the right field fence which the Duke outfielder got a glove on but couldn't hold. Hendrix went to third on the play and came home on an infield out.

Atwood had allowed only three hits in the first six innings. He weakened in the seventh, however, and the Dukes started showing their power. Two singles, a double, and two Seminole errors gave the Blue Devils four runs and a 5-3 lead.

FSU got back one of the runs in the eighth. Fred Twomey lead off with a walk and came home

on Hudson's long triple off the rightfield fence. Hudson died on third as Duke hurler Hal Turner retired the next three batters in order.

Left-hander Bobby Walts relieved Atwood in the ninth but couldn't hold the classy Blue Devils. Doubles by Fesperman and Tarr, a single and a walk were good for three final runs. Reliever John Rudisill sent the Seminoles down one-two-three in the bottom of the ninth to wrap up an 8-4 win.

Campbell got two of the Seminoles' four hits. Shortstop Cooter Mills was held hitless for the first time this season. All-American outfielder Al Spangler, Fesperman, and Tarr led the Blue Devils' 10-hit attack with two safeties each.
