Southpaw pitcher Buz Reynolds checked Florida State's hard-luck Seminoles on seven hits and contributed three safeties as the Hatters handed FSU its first Florida Intercollegiate Conference baseball loss, 8-7, here yesterday.

Coach Danny Litwhiler was due to send the Seminoles' leading hurler, freshman Tommy
Carcia (3-0), to the mound this afternoon in an effort to salvage a series split with Doc Johnson's Hatters.

Stetson shortstop Dick Saltrick broke up yesterday's game with a two-out, two run single past third in the ninth inning.

## LONG VICTIM

It was the second one-run setback for PSU, and , oddly, junior Max Long was the victim of both. Long dropped a 7-6 decision to Georgia here a couple of weeks back. The other Seminole loss was to Amherst, 9-7, in 10 innings, They've won seven.

Stetson, which squared its record at 3-3. The stylish lefthander walked eight, but struck out seven and was strong in the clutches as FWU stranded 10 base-runners.

Long fanned M. a one-game high for FSU this spring; but was tagged for 10 hits and issued six walks. hours, 41 minutes as Reynolds and Long, between them, walked 14, struck out 18, uncorked four with nitches and hit one batter. Second-sacker Billy Campbell

was the only Seminole to gather, more than one hit. Campbell drove home three runs with two well-timed singles and ran his hitting streak to seven games.

First baseman Fred Twomey kept his record of hitting safely in every game alive when his fifth-inning blooper to short left-center fell-for-a-double.

## FAULTY START

Long got an ominous start when Reynolds poled a triple to deep center with the sacks loaded and two outs in the second. FSU picked up an unearned run in the third, but Stetson got a pair in the fourth on two singles, a walk, and a sacrifice fly.

Campbell singled home two runs for FSU in the fourth and the Seminoles moved ahead, 6-5, with three runs in the fifth. The go-ahead tallies came on Fred Twomey's Texas League double, two walks, and Campbell's smash over second.

A hit batsmen, Reynolds' single, and an infield out moved across a Stetson run and tied it at 6-all in the sixth. That set the stage for Saltrick's gamewinning blow in the ninth,
