Ham Wernke, the Indiana hotshot who wrote himself a name as a Florida State basketball star for the past four seasons, added a page to the Seminole baseball book yesterday.

With FSU trailing Wisconsin, 2-1, in the seventh inning, Wernke unloaded a home run with the bases full to propell the Seminoles to a 7-2 verdict over the Big Ten Badgers.

The funny part is that Wernke was hitting an anemic 200 when his inside - the - park blast bounced off the 450-foot right-centerfield wall.

RECORD NOW 10-3

It was good for four runs and provided FSU with its 10th triumph against three setbacks this spring, and its 100th baseball success since the sport was ushered in on the FSU campus in 1947.

Until Wernke's base-clearing stunt, a pair of southpaws, FSU's John Ash and Wisconsin's Pete Olsen, had been locked in a tight pitching duel. Olsen weakened in the seventh, though, giving up a hit and two walks before that man Ham came to bat.

Ash was very effective before retiring for a pinch-hitter in that seventh-inning uprising. He gave up only four hits, one a first-inning homer by Wiscon-

sin's Jack Nowka, and for the most part had the Badgers on his hip.

Righthander George Hehemann finished up creditably. Ash now has a 2-1 record.

SWEEP OF SERIES

A Centennial Field crowd of 700 or more watched the Semi-noles complete a series sweep over the Big Ten runnerup of 1954. FSU had stymied the Badgers, 3-2, on Max Long's pinch hit single in the last of the ninth inning Friday night.

Danny Litwhiler's boys are in pretty good shape for a crucial road trip upcoming this week. The Seminoles face Rollins, last year's NCAA finalists, at Winter Park Tuesday and Wednesday, and Miami at Coral Gables Friday and Saturday.
