

Wisconsin's home run happy Badgers face Florida State in the semi-finals of the FSU Invitational baseball tournament here tonight at 8 at Centennial Field.

Both teams are locked in a first place tie with 4-1 records but the Seminoles downed Wisconsin earlier in the tourney 5-3. FSU's lone loss was to West Virginia, 13-12.

The Seminoles, who came back yesterday with a wild 13-10 win over Illinois, will go with Max Long in the semifinal contest. Wisconsin Coach Art Mansfield has nominated John Aehl to try again against Florida State. Aehl was the losing pitcher in the Badgers' only setback and Long has hurled four straight triumphs.

THREE BIG ONES

Wisconsin upped its homer total to 16 yesterday by hitting three in rolling over Notre Dame 9-2. West Virginia defeated Brown 15-4 in a night contest.

Another semifinal game today pits Illinois against West Virginia at 3:30. In a consolation contest Brown was scheduled to play Notre Dame.

The two semifinal winners clash tomorrow night at 8 for the tournament championship. An afternoon doubleheader will establish the No. 3 and No. 4 tourney clubs.

Florida State scored six runs in the sixth and then cut short a ninth inning Illini spurge.

FSU jumped off to its usual first inning lead with four runs on two singles, a walk, two errors and Bob Rosell's two-run triple.

HITLESS FOR FOUR

Illinois went ahead 6-4 in the fifth after John Ash hurled no-hit ball for four frames. But the Tribe lefthander was chased on three hits, a walk and an error. George Mahemann finished out the inning, giving up

one hit. The performance earned him the decision.

The Seminoles got back into the lead with the big sixth. Hits by Fred Twemay, Owen McCarron and Lee Corso and a walk, balk and two errors accounted for the 10-6 margin.

FSU picked up another in the seventh on Phil Hunt's double and added two in the ninth inning on three singles and a free pass.

Fred Kenny walked the first three Illinois batters to face him in the ninth and Tom Garcia was called in to pitch. On the first toss the Illini's Ern Lindbeck lined a double which scored two runs. A fielders choice and Bob Shoptaw's bingle let in two more but Garcia retired the side without further damage.

TRIO FOR TWOMEY

Twomey chipped in three hits to pace an 11-hit FSU attack against five Illinois pitchers.

In Wisconsin's victory over Notre Dame, John DeMeritt and Bill Rubin connected for their third home runs of the tournament. DeMeritt hit one in the second with none on and Rubin blasted a home run in the third which scored three runs. A bases-empty blast by Wayne Kelliher in the fourth accounted for the Badgers' 10th homer of the tourney.

Sheldon Rusch buried his second straight complete game by limiting the Fighting Irish to seven hits. One was a home run by Jim Cusack in the eighth with no one on base.

Carl Norman and Don O'Haver combined to toss a four-hitter as the West Virginia nine took advantage of 11 errors to whip Brown.

PAIR OF LEADERS

Vic O'Bryan contributed half of Brown's hits and Jack Rabbits had a pair of safeties for the Mountaineers.

Norman, who allowed only three hits in the seven innings he worked, struck out six and walked five in gaining his first win of the tourney.
