

Senior righthander Jerry Boxer tossed a one-hitter at Yale last night as Florida State's baseballers broke out of a two-game losing slump and downed the Bulldogs 7-0, to close out the second day of FSU's week-long invitational baseball tournament.

In the afternoon battle, Duke's unbeaten Blue Devils swamped Michigan State, 21-5, to take the tournament lead with a 2-0 mark.

Michigan State and Yale meet this afternoon. Tonight at 7:30 at Centennial Field Duke and the Seminoles renew the bitter rivalry which began last June at the NCAA regionals in Gastonia, N.C.

## TWO SOUTHPAWS DUE

The same hurler who won the final game over FSU at those regionals, southpaw Dick Burton, will hurl for Duke, while Seminole Coach Danny Litwhiler has also chosen a portsider, Jack Bristol.

As an added attraction to the contest, a special race between Duke's record-holding track star Dave Sime and the Tribe's fleet centerfielder Owen McCarron will be held just prior to the game.

A line single by second baseman Tom Molumphy to lead off the top of the seventh was the lone bingle against Boxer, who walked six and fanned 13 in chalking up his second win of the year.

Boxer's own wildness was all that kept him in trouble in the early innings, and only three men reached second against him after the second inning. He fanned four of the last six men to face him, including striking out the Tribe's pinch runner.

McCarron and Carlos Hendrix opened the Tribe first with singles against Yale right hander Dick Smith, then came two more singles by Robert Ron Cheney made his first of three errors to lead the bases.

SMITH COMES THROUGH—Smith walked Bob Rosell to force in the first Seminole tally. Then Dave Sacker Bill Hunt singled in two more to give the Tribe a 3-0 jump.

Smith walked Fred Twomey to open the last of the fifth. After the Tribe first sacker stole second, Lee Corso singled him home with the fourth Seminole run.

The Seminoles finished out the night's scoring in the seventh. Rosell walked, stole second and Hunt doubled him in. Another error by Cheney, a walk and a sacrifice fly by Hendrix scored the last two runs.

For the Seminoles it was their fourth victory against two losses.

this season, and evened their tournament record at 1-1. Yale now has a 2-5 mark for the season, and is 0-2 for the tourney.

The afternoon battle was all Duke as Coach Ace Parker's charges ripped three Michigan State hurlers for 17 hits and made a runaway of it from the start, aided by eight Spartan errors.

#### FOURTH STRAIGHT WIN

The victory was the fourth straight of the season for Duke, and the second in a row in the tourney. They defeated Yale, 8-4, here Monday.

Michigan State had opened its season Monday night by downing the homestanding Seminoles, 8-3.

Outfielders Sime and Pete Maynard were once again big guns for the Blue Devils, the former with a single, home run and three RBI's, the latter with three hits and three RBI's.

Maynard, who is just a sophomore at the Durham school, now has seven for nine for the tournament, including two home runs Monday, for a gaudy .778 batting average.

Sime had three hits Monday and is hitting an even .500 for the first two games of the tournament. Catcher Steve Crisfield had four RBI's with two hits, while first sacker George Atkinson with two hits and three RBI's and outfielder, Bernie Blaney with four hits also joined the Duke slugging parade.

#### FATZINGER GOES ROUTE

Harleigh Fatzinger, the Duke star for the Blue Devils, and drove in two runs in addition. Bill Mansfield, who absorbed eight runs in the first inning, was the loser for the Spartans.

Captain and catcher Bill Bates had a bases-clearing home run and outfielder John Russell had three hits for the losers.
