

Florida State senior lefthander Jack Bristol came within one pitch of a coveted no-hit pitching performance as the Seminoles humbled Rollins, 7-1, for the ninth straight triumph at Centennial Field last night.

Bristol got the Tars down on no hits for eight and two-thirds innings before Rollins' freshman Jimmy Brown spoiled his no-hit bid with a clean single in right-center.

Brown took two pitches before then fouled off three pitches before striking out. Bristol struck the next four batters in succession, gave a home run to freshman pitcher Ray DeMat.

Brown then singled Rollins' freshman J. C. Seavage on three pitches to end the game.
