

GASTONIA, N. C.—Florida State's Baseball team gets its second crack at Clemson's Tigers here at 7 p.m. in the NCAA-District 3 finals.

The Seminoles earned the right to face Clemson by virtue of belting Georgia Tech in the nightcap of a Friday double-header, 16-9.

WORST SETBACK

In the first game, Clemson handed Coach Danny Litwhiler's team its worst defeat in the history of the sport at FSU, 24-2. The game went 3 hours.

Litwhiler plans to throw Frank Davis, Sophomore right-hander from Miami, against the Tigers. Davis, 9-8 for the season, won the first game of the tournament, 3-2, over George Washington. Should the Seminoles win the 7 p.m. affair, they'll have to face the Tigers again at 9. Clemson, the Atlantic Coast champion, won the district last year.

Charlie Rodgers, first baseman from Jacksonville, led the Seminole attack in the nightcap with four hits in five trips to the plate, including a home run and a triple. The lanky junior drove in six runs. Second baseman Bob Clem chipped in with two hits in four at-bats and drove in four.

FRASER'S FIFTH

Ron Fraser, one of three seniors on the club, picked up his fifth win of the year against only one loss. Fraser tired in the ninth inning and gave way to Carl Nelson.

In gaining their 22nd win of the year, the Seminoles spanked five Tech pitchers for 13 hits. ~~They also drew 17 walks in a~~ 3-hours-and-50-minutes game that ended at 1:45 a.m.

Clemson's hitters went on a rampage in the first game and set a number of NCAA batting marks.

The Tiger batters rapped five FSU pitchers for 23 hits, a new NCAA playoff record for a single game. They tied the NCAA record for most runs scored, 24, and for most total bases, 37.

Bob Cline, lefthanded pitcher, tied the record for most hits by an individual player in one

game, 5, set by FSU's Rodgers last year against this same Clemson club.

In addition to getting five singles, Cline limited the Seminoles to three hits, with two of them coming in the first inning.

LONESOME RUNS

Nell Martin opened the inning with a base hit to left and was followed by Rodgers' base knock to right Jack Dull. Tallahassee third baseman hit a long fly to center which Clemson outfielder, Doug Hoffman misjudged, allowing Martin and Rodgers to score the only FSU runs.

In an afternoon game, Georgia Tech eliminated George Washington, 7-2.
