FSU became the fourth of the eight-team field to be ousted from the series. Western Michigan and Holly Cross were eliminated Tuesday, while Penn State was boot- I ed out yesterday by Texas in a e 6-4 game that went 10 innings.

in Wednesday's nightcap, Arizona rapped first-pegged Missouri ti 6-4 to remain the series' only undefeated team. In today's fourth C round action, Arizona tangles with Texas after Missouri meets USC.
