Alabama's Crimson Tide rolled into Tallahassee like a tidal wave yesterday and the Big Red swept a doubleheader from Virginia Tech and Florida State, 9-0 and 4-3, respectively.

In the afternoon contest the 'Bamans' showed their muscle, rapping five extra base hits while routing the VI Gobblers.

the Seminoles, the Tide capitalized on Florida State's sloppy play in the field and weak bats.

In games today, Alabama was to go against Virginia

Tech at 11, and against Penn State at 3, Florida State plays Penn State at 7:30.

Alahama started fast against the Seminoles, when catcher Ed Yarnell let a third strike slip him allowing George Johnson to take first.

First baseman Joe McCorquodale followed with a twoout home run which cleared the trees in right field.

-- Florida State threatened-in the home half of the first, when Harry Greene walked, was forced at second by Dick Gold who went to third on a wild attempt to double him up:

The Seminoles could not

score however as Lance
Hitchcock popped to the third
baseman to end the inning.

Gold became the first of four Tribe runners to be left at third.

Third baseman Bill Zeiglen led off the third inning for the Seminoles with a sharp single to center. He moved to second when Greene walked and scored the Tribe's first run as Roy Mewbourne singled sharply to left.

'Bama leftfielder, Jack Traffensted, booted the ball on the play allowing Greene and Mewbourne to move to second and third with just one out.

After Gold bounced out to.
 second, Hitchcock walked to
 load the bases, but Yarnell lined
 ed out to short to end the threat.

Alabama added a run in the seventh as Tommy Limbaugh opened with a single to center. And went to second on another passed ball. Seminole hurler Mary Stringfellow then uncorked a wild pitch moving the Tide runner to third and Bill Parker followed with an infield single to drive in the run.

The Tribe came back with single tallies in the seventh and eighth to tie things up. An inning opening walk to Zeigler set up the Tribe's second run. A wild pitch moved Zeigler to second, and when Stringfellow squared around to bunt Zeigler raced to third as the Alabama third baseman charged in leaving the base uncovered.

Stringfellow finally worked reliefer Jack Glover for a base on balls putting runners at first and third with no outs.

After-Greene-struckout, another wild pitch allowed Zeigler to score for third.

A walk to Mewbourne and another wild pitch put runners on second and third with one away, but Stringfellow was cut down at home on a fielder's choice, and after Hitchcock walked to load the bases, Yarnell ground out to short.

In the eighth a walk to pinch hitter John Daughtery, a sacrifice by Jeff Hogan and Zeigler's third single of the night produced the tying run.

Alabama scored the winning run in the ninth on a single by Lynn Bailey, a sacrifice and a single by J. C. Renelli. Renelli's single was to short leftfield, but leftfielder Hitchcock bobbled the ball momentarily allowing Bailey to scamper home ahead of the throw.

The Seminoles threatened slightly in the bottom of the ninth, but left two men stranded without a score.

Stringfellow went the distance for the Tribe, scattering nine hits while striking out eight. He did not walk a man. Glover was credited with the win in relief.
