Behind 5-1 going into the bottom of the sixth, Florida State pounded back with its biggest power display of the season and collared the University of Florida's baseball team 7-5 before 2,500 yelling fans here last night.

Ed Yarnell and Jeff Hogan won

It with home runs in the seventh.

LaDon Boyd, the unbeaten sophomore righthander, boosted his pitching record to 9-0. The Gators reached him for 10 hits, but he fanned nine, walked just three in going the route.

Florida State plays its last home game today at 2 p.m. Lefthander Wayne Vincent (8-2) figures to

start for FSU, opposing Kelly prior (5-1).

The Seminoles, awaiting this weekend an almost certain invitation to compete in the District 3 playoffs, now stand 28-9. It's 30-9 if you count two scheduled games against Tampa as forfeits. Coach Fred Hatfield started counting them that way after he learned that Tampa later played a game against University of South-Fiorida. Tampa, in cancelling the games, said it was disbanding the team for the season.

It was the Seminoles' 12th straight victory — or 14th straight, counting Tampa.

Supposedly a relatively weak-hitting team, Florida State lashed three Florida pitchers for two homers, two triples, two doubles in a 10-hit total. Jim Courier, UF left-hander with a 5-0 record, departed with the score tied 5-5. Jack Frake (2-3) was the loser in relief.

It was 5-4, Florida, with one out in the bottom of the seventh. Hatfield called on Yarnell to pinch-hit for Mike English, and the big catcher slapped Courier's last pitch of

the game 365 feet over the leftfield fence to tie it 5-5.

Dave Fuller, the Florida coach, promptly yanked his starter, and called on Franke, another lefty. After Boyd struck out, Jeff Hogan, the

sophomore guard on the basketball team, slammed a 360-foot homer over the right-center wall, making it 6-5.

An insurance run came on Roy Mewbourne's triple and Dick Gold's single. Mewbourne sparkled biggest, however with his centerfield catches, including a notable robbery on Nick Nicosia's long ball to deep left-center.

Florida hitters were led by -leadoff--man--Danny--Orr--withthree singles, Richard Trapp -and-Skip Lujack had two hits abiece.

Chuck Cone and Mike Easom, with two hits each, -were the only Seminoles withmore than one.

Oddly, 11 of 12 runs scored in n, the game came after two outs. Yarnell's homer, with one out. ie was the lone exception.

FSU scored first, in the sccond on Cone's triple and Easom's single. Florid?, now n 23-9, tied it in the third when Ed Gross lived on an error and c scored on Trapp's single after an infield out put him on second.

The Gators went ahead 3-1 in the fourth on Tom Banks' 350--foot-homer with Dan Cushman o base via an infield hit. Florida pushed it to 4-1 in the fifth on Orr's single and Lujack's double, and to 5-1 in the li sixth on singles by Courier, Orr and Trapp.

Mewbourne's walk started something going for FSU in the sixth. Tom Whitaker singled. Lance Hitchcock was safe on an error, scoring Mewbourne. Cone doubled to left-center, chasing in two runs, but was out at third trying to stretch the hit into a triple.

That made it 5-4, and set the stage for Yarnell and Hogan.

Boyd tightened up. leadoff man-in the seventhsingled, but the Gators got. nothing off him the rest of the way. He set the side down 1-2-3 in the last two innings.
