

GAINESVILLE — Florida State's baseball team closed its regular season on a dismal note Saturday, losing a double header to rival University of Florida 2-1 and 3-1.

However, the Seminoles have a good chance this weekend to cure their injured pride in the NCAA District 3 region tournament in Gastonia, N.C.

The Gators won the first game, a seven-inning contest, in the bottom of the last inning coming from behind just as it had in Tallahassee last Saturday.

And, just as last week, FSU ace lefthander Wayne Vincent was the unfortunate victim.

With two men out, Gator centerfielder Danny Orr walk-

ed after working Vincent to a full count. Orr attempted to steal second and FSU catcher Ed Yarnell fired a perfect strike to second that would have nailed the runner, but second baseman Dick Gold dropped the ball.

Mike Picano then hit a high chopper in front of the plate and Vincent, going to first on the play, threw high, Orr scoring and Picano moving around to third. Richard Trapp followed with a line-shot base hit to left to win the game.

Florida State picked up its only run in the sixth as Mason singled to right, went to third when Gator pitcher Kelly Prior's attempted pick off throw was wild, and scored on

a single to left by Tom Whitaker.

Florida came from behind in the second game also as the Seminoles jumped off to a short-lived 1-0 lead in the first.

After one man was out, Mike Easom walked and stole second base. He then scored on Mason's single to deep right center.

However, the Gators quickly tied the score in the bottom of the inning. Picano drew a base on balls, and when he attempted to steal second Gold dropped another perfect throw from his catcher — this time Bobby Jordan. Trapp, who got all three runs batted in in the
