

Down three runs in the late innings of the first game, Florida State rallied for a 5-4 win, then shut out South Alabama 4-0 to complete a doubleheader sweep Saturday at Seminole Field.

Two-out singles by Dick Gold and Greg Gromek spurred the Seminoles to victory in the opener while two-run home runs by Gold and John Keith backed Gene Ammann's six-hit pitching in the nightcap.

Trailing 4-3 in the bottom of the seventh, the would-be last inning of the opener, Tribe leftfielder Dave Moates worked South Alabama starter Mike McFarland for a two-out walk.

After Moates stole second, Gold rifled a shot over short sending the speedy outfielder in with the tying run.

Gromek's game-winning hit came in the ninth and plated Moates, who had reached base on a fielders' choice and

moved around to third on a pair of infield outs.

A second-inning home run by South Alabama catcher Dave

Hudson sparked Eddie Stanky's team to an early 3-0 lead.

George Lott, the Tribe's ace lefthander, was the victim of Hudson's 370-foot, three-run blast. The big lefty walked Henry Daugherty to open the frame and Larry Wacker followed with a single. Hudson tied into Lott's first pitch, sending it high and far over the left field fence.

McFarland, a fast-balling righthander, kept the Seminoles in check throughout the early going and a fielding lapse by his teammates gave the Tribe a fourth-inning run.

Shortstop Jeff Hogan was safe on an error when his ground ball slipped through Wacker's legs at first.

A wild pitch sent Hogan racing to second and he was awarded third on an interference call by umpire Phil Shaw.

after two men were out, but McFarland ran into a little control problem and walked
