complete turnabout from Friday's two afternoon games. Maryland won both those contests, rapping out 32 hits and 19 runs.

The Terrapins, now in second place in the tourney, defeated Holy Cross, 12-2 and then edged Illinois 7-6.

Three games today wind up the four-day round robin play. Illinois and Holy Cross open things with a 1 p.m. contest. The Seminoles will meet Holy Cross at 3:30 and Maryland at 7:30.

A win in either game would give the Tribe, now 4-0 in tournament play, the championship.

Osburn turned in his best performance of the season, completely dominating the strong Illini lineup. He walked only two, one in each of the first two innings, and struck out 12 to run his record to 5-0.

The Seminoles got him the only run he needed when Illinois pitcher Jerry Brackett walked the first four men he faced.

The Tribe added another run in the first, two in the second and another in the third and for practical purposes, the contest was over.

Ron Cash led the Seminoles' eight-hit attack with a pair of singles. Greg Gromek, recovering from a beaming suffered in Wednesday night's Illinois game, added a two-run single.

Greg Schnute had the Tribe's only extra base hit, a run-scoring triple in the second.
