TALLAHASSEE--He appeared in 17 games this season, started 15 and completed 10. He won 15 games and did not lose, including two games in the College World Series. He pitched eight shutouts and the first eight innings of a ninth early in the season. He had one string of 41 1/3 scoreless innings and another of 29.

He set at least a dozen school pitching records and led his team to second place in the College World Series where he was chosen "Most Outstanding Player."

Those are some of Gene Ammann's pitching accomplishments for 1970. But perhaps what is even more amazing is what he did not get - Ammann did not make All-America. He was not even nominated.

The Southeastern District III selection committee passed the Seminole junior over and placed him on the district second team. Only first team choices are considered for All-America recognition.

In three years of varsity performance, Ammann won a record 31 of 33 decisions.

Among his other Florida State standards were lowest ERA (0.66 season and 1.43 career)

career strikeouts (311) season wins (15) and season shutouts (eight).

Ammann had another year of eligibility left, but elected to enter pro ball following his fine 1970 performance. He signed with the Milwaukee Brewers and will soon be assigned to the Jacksonville Suns of the Southern League (AA).

"Gene is one of the finest pitchers in college ball," said Seminole Coach Jack Stallings. "He proved that beyond a doubt in Omaha. His selection as the Series' Outstanding Performer confirmed it."

In the Omaha tourney Ammann gave up just two runs against the two hardest hitting clubs in the tournament. He shutout Arizona on two hits and yielded a pair on seven hits to Texas.

"We will certainly miss Gene next season," said Stallings. "But I can't blame him for wanting to sign. The Brewers made him a fine offer.

"It is just a shame that he did not have a shot at All-America this year. It was about the only individual honor he did not get."

Ammann was just one of a bullpen full of Seminole pitchers who carried the Tribe into the finals of the College World Series.

Five hurlers had ERA's below 2.00 with three below 1.00. Ammann's 0.66 was not the lowest. That honor was carried by big Tom Henson, who posted an 0.31 in 29 innings of work.

Lefty Pat Osburn, who set a season strikeout record with 154 (four more than recorded by Ammann) had an 0.92 mark, while compiling a 12-2 record.

As a team, the Seminoles set records for lowest ERA (1.49), strikeouts (528), shutouts (15) and lowest opponents batting average (.186)

Only three of the 10 regulars are seniors, but like Ammann, juniors Osburn and Mike Slade have been drafted and could sign. If they do, that will leave just four returning.

TALLAHASSEE--Despite a season ending slump that saw his average tumble 97-points in 18 games, Florida State All-America second baseman Dick Nichols managed to hang on and win the Seminole Batting Title for the second straight year.

The Jacksonville senior, who was drafted by the Boston Red Six, completed the season with a .338 average, after entering the last third of the season with a .425 mark.

The 5-6 "mighty-mite" set a new school record for at-bats (237), hits (80), doubles (17 and stolen bases (34) for a single season. He also set a career mark with 24 coubles.

Right behind Nichols in the batting race was third baseman Ron Cash. Another All-District choice, Cash finished the season at .335, collecting 72 hits, including eight doubles, six triples and three home runs.

His 47 runs-batted-in were high for the team and fell just four short of Jim Lyttle's record of 51.

Outfielder John Grubb and shortstop Greg Gromek were the only other Seminoles to finish the season at or above .300.

Grubb collected eight hits at the College World Series to give him a total of 70 for the season and a final average of .303. Gromek went hitless in CWS play and saw his average tumble 40-points to an even .300.

Outfielder Larry Cocks started the series well, collecting two hits in each of the first three games, but he was held hitless in the final three and his average dropped to .292.

Greg Schnute, who was injured in the Seminoles' 5-1 loss to Texas, had four hits in 10 plate appearances to finish the season at .276. Catcher Harry Saferight wound up at .269 with first baseman Doug Kasimier finishing up at .255.

At the CWS the Seminoles' team batting average dropped to .277 even though the Tribe had more hits, 553, than in any previous season.

The Seminoles also set new team records for games played (59) and victories (49).

The team win percentage, .839, however, did not equal the .854 (35-6) set by the

Spirit, pitching and balance have been the three main ingredients in Florida State's success this season.

The Seminoles have had more impressive looking teams--teams which have hit more home runs, made more spectacular plays and scored more runs, but none surpassed this club in winning.

When the 1970 Tribe defeated Auburn on May 19, it was win number 40, breaking the 1966 record of 39 wins.

All season the Seminoles have had team balance at the plate that has rarely given opposing pitchers a breather. From the first man in the line-up through the bottom of the order the Tribe has been a threat.

The team batting average has been between .280 and .290 all year. A half dozen Seminoles are above or near .300 in their batting averages. Those same six are all within seven or eight of each other in the RBI department.

There is also a strong bench. Pinch hitters are hitting close to .300 with several key hits and RBI included. Coach Jack Stallings can make changes in the line-up without fear of losing much ability.

The pitching corps is headed toward a record ERA. All 10 hurlers are capable of throwing with, or against any team in the country. Gene Ammann and Pat Osburn are the two workhorses, but Mike Slade and Carl Gromek have seen considerable duty, as starters and in long relief. John Ferguson, Tom Henson and Don Harbaugh are capable of middle and long relief, while Al Cleveland and Mac Scarce have been excellent short men.

One of the big factors, however, has been the togetherness of this club.

There is no reliance on "one or two big men," one player said. "We know every man will have to do his job if we are to win, so everyone works together and works a little harder."

#### THE LINE-UP

- DICK NICHOLS, SECOND BASE -- The only two-year starter on the club. Strong candidate for All-District and All-America honors. Hit above .400 most of year. Good defensive player and always hustling at game time. Doesn't have great speed but set stolen base record. Works at getting the good jump.
- GREG SCHNUTE, CENTER FIELD -- Fine defensive outfielder. Has good speed in outfield and on bases. Has not hit for high average, but has contributed several key hits.
- JOHN GRUBB, RIGHT FIELD -- Has come up to expectations during latter half of season. A couple of injuries slowed him early. Has good speed and a picture swing at plate. Can hit with authority. Good defensive outfielder.
- RON CASH, THIRD BASE -- Fine all around ball player. Not flashy in field but he gets the job done. One of best hitters on club. Hits ball hard. All-District candidate.
- HARRY SAFERIGHT, CATCHER -- May also play first base or outfield. Good hitter, he started slow but has played better in latter part of season. Adequate defensive catcher as well as at other two spots.
- IARRY COCKS, LEFT FIELD -- Started as infielder, has made a good adjustment to outfield. Has developed strong, accurate arm and can go get the ball.

  Steady hitter, he has been improving all year.
- GREG GRCMEK, SHORTSTOP -- One of most consistent performers at plate all year.

  Has ability to make tough play at short, but will also look bad occasionally on easy one. Strongest arm on club.
- DOUG KASIMIER, FIRST BASE -- Has improved with bat during season. Gained much needed confidence. Best defensive first baseman. Hits right-handed pitching better than left.
- JOHN KEITH, CATCHER -- Shares catching duties with Saferight. Good defensive catcher. Blocks ball well. Can hit with authority, but is a streak hitter.

#### THE PITCHERS

- GENE AMMANN -- His third year on the varsity, holds career win record. Has shown marked improvement over last year. Has good slider, curve and "sneaky" fast ball. Good control makes him tough to beat. Biggest fault is losing his concentration. Definite All-District and All-America candidate.
- PAT OSBURN -- First year with varsity after coming from Manatee JC. Is a definite pro prospect. Has good fast ball, curve and slider. Has ability to throw ball by batter. Generally keeps ball down, making him most effective. Another All-District and All-America candidate.
- MIKE SIADE -- Would be No. 1 man for most teams in country. Good fast ball and curve. Arm trouble slowed his progress early this season, but is in top form now. Gives Seminoles as strong a No. 3 man as there is in college ball.
- MAC SCARCE -- Top short relief man. He has big league stuff. Never far from plate and almost always around knees. Is very effective for three innings or so. Arm trouble keeps him from going longer.
- CARL GROMEK -- Spot starter and long relief man. Not overpowering, but has good control and breaking pitches. Reacts well under pressure, which makes him good relief man. Brother is regular shortstop.
- TOM HENSON -- Another spot starter and long reliefer. Arm trouble kept him out most of mid-season, but late appearance showed he is back in top form. Throws hard.
