The Seminoles are making their 13th appearance in the NCAA Baseball playoffs. Only three teams have been to more playoffs; only two, Southern California (with 76) and Texas (with 48) can claim more tournament victories than the Seminoles who have won 37.

Florida State's last appearance in the baseball playoffs was in 1970. The Seminoles swept past Mississippi State, Maryland and East Carolina for the right to represent the Southeast at the College World Series. In Omaha, the Tribe defeated Arizona, and Dartmouth before losing to Texas in the third round. After coming back to eliminate Ohio, the Seminoles defeated Texas, 11-2, for the right to meet Southern Cal, which had drawn a bye, in the finals. That last game went 15 innings before USC captured the championship, 2-1. Florida State's Gene Ammann was named the tournament's Outstanding Player. The Tribe righthander won two games and finished with a 1.00 ERA. The Seminoles gave up only nine runs in six games, the second best defense ever in the tournament.

The selection of the baseball Seminoles capped an outstanding year for Florida State Athletic teams. Four teams--football, basketball, tennis and baseball--have been tapped for post season competition. The football team following an 8-3 season played in the Fiesta Bowl; the basketball squad was runner-up to UCLA in the NCAA Basketball Championships. This is the second year (1967-68 being the other) that the Seminoles have had their football, basketball and baseball teams in NCAA post-season competition. The only other team in the country to do so twice is Texas. Oregon State and Notre Dame have each done it once.

TRIBE TRIVIA

Florida State played three of this year's tournament teams--Jacksonville (1-3), Virginia (2-0) and South Alabama (2-4) during the regular season.

Florida State has played all but one of the five teams which will be appearing in the 1972 District III tournament. The Seminoles hold a 14-5 advantage over Jacksonville, 11-6 against South Alabama, 6-0 versus Mississippi and 2-0 against Virginia. Only Richmond has never been on the field with the Seminoles.

Of the six teams competing in this year's tournament, only Florida State and Mississippi have been to Gastonia previously. Both the Rebels (1969) and the Seminoles (1970) were district winners their last time at the tournament. Florida State Assistant Trainer Doug May, who is accompanying the Seminoles, and a graduate of Ole Miss, was with the Rebels in 1969 and then with the Seminoles in 1970. If Florida State meets Ole Miss it will be the first time May has been on the opposite side of the field from his alma-mater.

Florida State's District III games will be broadcast in Tallahassee by radio stations WTNT/WOMA-FM, which have carried all the Seminole home games and a portion of the road contests as well.

That 'New Look' For District 3 Tournament

The District 3 NCAA Gaston Shrine-sponsored baseball tournament here this year will definitely have "new look."

Four of the participating teams are playing here for the first time in the 17th annual event. Teams seeing their first action here will be South Alabama, Jacksonville, Virginia and Richmond.

The other two, Ole Miss and Florida State, are familiar faces. In fact, the Seminoles of Jack Stallings will be competing in their 13th tournament here at Simms Park and they lead the all-time standings with the most wins (47) and the most titles (five).

As for Ole Miss, the Rebels have led a charmed life in Gastonia. They've been here three times and have won three titles. They've captured 10 wins in 11 games and enter this year's event with eight straight wins in the double-elimination event.

The tournament has a new format this year, what with six teams participating instead of the customary four. There will thus be a schedule of three games for the first three days.

The three games on Thursday and Friday (June 1-2) are scheduled for 10 a.m., 2:30 p.m. and 7 p.m. On Saturday, the slate shows a double-header, starting at 1 p.m., and a single game at 8 o'clock that night.

The championship game, or games, will be played on Sunday afternoon, June 4, starting at 2 o'clock. If the team which goes into the final day without a defeat, loses, a second game with the same foe will follow immediately.

Monday, June 5, is held open as a rainout date for the tournament.

Taking a look at the teams participating, South Alabama has raced to a season in which they've won over 40 games and come here as the nation's second-ranked collegiate baseball team.

The Jaguars have an All-America pitcher candidate in Stan Butkus, and three other standout performers in outfielder Gary Conley, shortstop Steve Gaskin and leftfielder Ernie Rousseau.

Former major league player and manager Eddie Stanky coaches the Jags. Other standout South Alabama pitchers are southpaw Mark Hoffman, Bruce Kombrinck and Mike Tice.

Jacksonville comes here with a 36-12 record and is coached by Barry Myers. Rightfielder Rich Katz leads the team in batting with a .397 average. Third baseman Rick Shannon stands at .376 and shortstop Tommy McMillan at .349. Pitcher-first baseman-outfielder Guy Ezzell leads the team in RBI with 45 and has the team homer lead with 11.

Larry Bryant and Steve Nichols give the Dolphins a strong 1-2 mound punch. Bryant has an 11-3 mark while Nichols is 12-4. Bryant has the top ERA with 1.60. Nichols has struck out 110 to lead the team in that department.

Through games of May 16, Florida State had a 41-19 record. The leading batsmen were Tom Rosa, .331, John LiBrandi, .330, Herb Sikes, .321 and Rick Snyder, .316.

LiBrandi was the RBI leader with 54. In pitching, Marty Rice had a 12-3 record while Bill Fuller was 9-5 and Dave Fernald 8-5 as the biggest winners.

Virginia, after starting off slowly, came on like gang-busters to win the ACC title. They finished with an overall record of 16-13 and won the loop laurel with a 9-4 mark. Centerfielder Robbin Marvin led the team in batting with a .307 average.

He was the only .300 hitter, although third baseman Jonathan Williams hit .295 and first baseman Steve Sroba .273.

Virginia is awfully quick on the basepaths. They stole no less than 46 bases in 48 attempts and Marvin had a perfect 17-of-17.

Pitching-wise, Mike Judkins is 4-1 with an ERA of 1.82. Steve Brindle is 4-3 and Dave LaCross 3-2.

Ole Miss comes here with a 23-13 record under first-year coach Jake Gibbs, former Yankee catcher. They were 17-3 against SEC opposition.

Right fielder Paul Husband leads the team in batting with a .351 mark while leftfielder Kevin McMahon is hitting .321, shortstop Steve Dillard, .306 and centerfielder Norris Weese .305. The RBI leader is Husband with 32.

Pitching-wise for the Rebels, Jim Pittman is 8-1, Barry Gaddis 6-2, Hank List 4-3 and Mike Park 3-0.

Richmond, champs of the Southern Conference, was paced in hitting by shortstop Reggie Dunnivant through games of May 12 with a .368 mark. Centerfielder Less Keenam was standing at .309 and first baseman Roger Hatcher at .293.

Hatcher doubles as a pitcher and was standing at 6-0 through May 12, while Al Selby was 5-2.

The winner here advances to the College World Series in Omaha, Neb., later in June. Proceeds from the local tournament go to the Shriners Hospital in Greenville, S. C.
