TRIBE TRIVIA

Florida State is making its sixth trip to the College World Series and its first since the Seminoles lost a tough 2-1, 15-inning decision to Southern California in 1970. Overall, this is Florida State's 14th appearance at the NCAA playoffs. The Seminoles first received the district bid in 1956 and won their first District Title a year later.

Seminole Head Coach Woody Woodward is no stranger to the College World Series even though this is his first season as a collegiate coach. As an FSU player, he made trips to the CWS in 1962 and 1963. The fans in Omaha are likely to remember him as well as he was selected to the CWS Silver Anniversary All-Star team in 1972.

Florida State's .303 team batting average is the third highest ever recorded by a Seminole squad. The highest team BA is the .321 mark registered by the 1955 club and the second highest is .312 in 1960.

Of this year's College World Series field, the Seminoles have played only South Carolina and Texas. Florida State holds a 2-1 edge in their meetings with Texas, while South Carolina has a 2-1 advantage on the Seminoles.

The Seminoles' 15 shutouts this season ties the school record set by the 1970 team. Pitcher Danny O'Brien, who has five of the shutouts, pitched three of them against 1974 CWS runner-up Miami. The most recent one was a 1-0 contest in the opening round of the South Regional Tournament.

Playoff pressure will be nothing new to several of Florida State's players. Three members of the squad, Guillermo Bonilla, Carlos Lezcano and Carlos Rodriguez, "have been there before" as members of the Puerto Rican American Legion National Champion teams of the last few years. Senior Captain Randy Davidson was twice named to the National JC All-Tournament team and played a significant role as a member of the U.S. team which won the World Amateur Baseball Tournament in 1973.

Several of the Seminoles have family ties with the major leagues. Outfielder Jim Busby is the son of Atlanta coach Jim Busby, Sr. Another Braves coach, Ken Sylvestri, has son Kenny as a reserve pitcher for the Tribe this year, while St. Louis Cardinal Director of Player Personnel Bob Kennedy's son Terry is the Seminoles left-handed designated hitter. The family lines do not end there, however, as outfielder Carlos Lezcano has a cousin, Sixto, playing with the Milwaukee Brewers and pitcher Danny O'Brien's brother-in-law is Detroit Tiger catcher Bill Freehan. The most frequently asked about relationship is not there. Outfielder Steve Tebbetts, has no known family ties with former big leaguer, now scout, Birdie Tebbetts. Steve has, however, inevitably picked up the nickname.

Florida State's games at the series will be broadcast back to Tallahassee by WINT radio. Dave Voss, a former Mississippi State baseball player and Ed Littler, a former Seminole performer, will handle the broadcast duties. Although the Florida State regular season games were not carried on radio this season, both announcers have handled Seminole play-by-play chores in previous years. Littler did the audio for several telecasts of FSU games this season over WFSU-TV in Tallahassee. A possible statewide network is being worked on.

Florida State's team headquarters at the College World Series will be the Omaha Hilton Inn, 16th and Dodge Streets. The Seminoles are scheduled to depart Tallahassee via Eastern Airlines at 7:45 a.m. Thursday, June 5 and arrive in Omaha at 11:30 a.m. Their Service Club Host for the tournament will be the Concord Club.

THE LINEUP

WAYNE MEARS, CATCHER -- Excellent defensive performer. He takes charge behind the plate. Has good arm and a quick release that make him tough to steal on. Has struggled with the bat most of the season, but has been showing considerable improvement the last third of the season and hit over .300 during the last 15 games.

JIM FOXWELL, FIRST BASE -- Will come into the tournament with the second leading average on the team. Was platooned most of the season, but has seen considerable duty against righthanded pitching as well as left. A senior and three-year starter for the Seminoles, has hit a school record 33 doubles and brings a career .301 batting average into the tournament. Good defensively at first.

RANDY DAVIDSON, SECOND BASE -- As complete a college baseball player as there is in the country. Is not blessed with a lot of "natural talent", he works hard for everything he can get. Was second leading hitter on club a year ago and has a respectable .325 mark now. Holds season and career records for stolen bases. A superb defensive player, his biggest plus is his consistency. Not easily rattled, he knows the game and the play to be made either offensively or defensively. Best all around player on the club. All District, first team in 1974, JC All-America.

WINDLE HIGGINBOTHAM, SHORTSTOP --- JC All-America at shortstop who had enough versatility to play first base for Seminoles last year. Back at short this season, he combined with Davidson to give the Seminoles their best keystone combination in several seasons. A quality performer with ability to make all the defensive plays at short. Consistent hitter with ability to hit .300.

GUILLERMO BONILLA, THIRD BASE -- The best "pure hitter" at FSU in several seasons. He comes to play. Outstanding offensive performer who led the team in hitting as a freshman. Will bring a .336 average into the tournament. Adequate defensive third baseman who has been making improvement in the field. Was a much steadier performer in the field this year than last.

CARLOS LEZCANO -- Outstanding defensive outfielder. Has good speed and uses it well to "go get the ball". Has thrilled crowds with excellent defensive plays all season. Hitting is picking up steadily and he was carrying a .300 average over last half of the season to raise mark to .286 for the year.

JIM BUSBY, CENTER FIELD -- Fine all around player. Is the team's leading home run hitter and has raised his average nearly 40-points over last 12 games of the season with a torrid .429 mark during that span. In the field, he directs traffic for the outfielders. Has all the tools to be an outstanding defensive player. Good range, strong arm and a sure glove. Uses his speed well offensively and defensively. Has 22 stolen bases and can bunt for the base hit. Son of Atlanta Braves coach and former major leaguer.

STEVE TEBBETTS, RIGHT FIELD -- Has had best season of all the Seminole regulars. Hit above .400 most of the year, settling for a .391 season-ending mark. Can hit with power (five home runs), but also uses outstanding speed to get a number of "leg hits". Third basemen rarely give him much room. Strong arm and sound defensive mechanics in the outfield. Stole 31 bases in 38 attempts this season.

BILL DANIEL, FIRST BASE - Platooned most of the season with Jim Foxwell at first seeing duty against righthanded pitching. A streak hitter who is devastating when he is hot. Can also play the outfield and has seen duty as DH. A solid defensive performer. Had double and only home run hit in South Regional, driving in five runs in Seminoles' 6-5 win in the final game.

CARLOS RODRIQUEZ, INFIELDER - Has ability to play second, short or third without any appreciable loss defensively to the club. Freshmen with excellent potential. Has hit .286 in limited action, including six doubles and two game-winning RBI. An exciting ballplayer and favorite of the fans. Sent winning run home with fine squeeze bunt against LSU in second round of South regional.

BEN CURRY, DESIGNATED HITTER - Used primarily as righthanded DH most of the season. Finished year with a .357 average.

RICK McGLONE, CATCHER - Reserve catcher, who could be a starter for most clubs in the country. Has done an excellent job whenever called upon. Has excellent potential offensively and is a solid defensive performer.

THE PITCHERS

DANNY O'BRIEN - Three-year performer who has really come into his own. Pitched superbly all year. Has three shutouts over Miami to his credit and five in all on the year. Pitched 11 complete games in 16 starts, giving up just 31 runs in 130 innings for a 1.59 ERA. Excellent walk-strikeout rotation (42 to 122). He is a smart pitcher, using control and an assortment of pitches to beat you.

LARRY JONES - The other half of the Seminoles brilliant one-two punch. Unbeaten in 15 decisions this season. Completed half his 16 starts. Struck out 120, walked 55 in just under 120 innings. Has earned run average of 1.92. Has big league fast ball that is his major weapon, but also uses excellent slider effectively. When he has all his stuff he is extremely tough as five shutouts and three one-hitters this season show. Gomez Plate Award Finalist.

DANNY OWEN - Only had five starts this season, but he made the most of them for four wins. A control pitcher, he uses an assortment of pitches to overcome hitters.

MIKE KELLEY - Worked as reliever last year and has done as good job this season as a starter. Has eight starts in 11 appearances and a fine 6-1 record. Is excellent college pitcher, with good curve, a sneaky fast ball and good control.

LARRY ROTHSCHILD - Bullpen ace all season. Will be used in either long or short relief. Has garnered eight saves this season in 16 appearances. Has excellent attitude toward his role as reliever. Comes to ball park ready to go everyday. Had a save in LSU game and was credited with win in second Miami contest at South Regional.

JOHN NICHOLAS - Short relief specialist who has done excellent job. One of just two lefties on the roster. Saw limited action, but was tough when called upon. Came to Florida State from Manatee JC without a scholarship.

CRAIG EATON - His 3-4 record is deceptive. Has pitched extremely well in several outings only to wind up on short end of the score. Was called upon in relief after Miami scored four first inning runs in South Regional final and shut them out until the eighth. Has good control and a wide assortment of pitches.

BOB MAYER - Sophomore lefty who has been impressive in limited action this year. Is extremely tough when he has everything under control. Will be used as starter or in relief roll when a lefty is needed.

1975 College Baseball All-America Team

OMAHA, Neb.--A pair of undefeated pitchers and a raft of .400 hitters top the 1975 All-America College Baseball team announced today by the American Association of College Baseball Coaches (AACBC).

Earl Bass of South Carolina and Jim Gideon of Texas, a pair of 17-0 performers who have led their teams into the College World Series, are the pitchers named to the team.

Seven of the nine hitters named to the 11-man first team are hitting above the .400 mark.

Joining Bass and Gideon on the first team are: Hank Small, South Carolina, .397; Randy Duarte, Iowa State, .405; Jerry Maddox, Arizona State, .376; Keith Moreland, Texas, .424; Dennis Walling, Clemson, .421; Dave Stegman, Arizona, .402; Steve Kemp, Southern California, .435; Rick Cerone, Seton Hall, .405; and designated hitter George Wiecker, Davidson, .448.

"This has to be considered one of the top-hitting all-America teams we've ever had," said Erv Huether of South Dakota State University, chairman of the AACBC all-America selection committee.

Kemp, who joins Walling and Stegman in the outfield positions, is the only left-handed hitter in the lineup. Small, at first base, and Maddox, who earlier was selected as the Lefty Gomez Plate Award recipient for 1975, at shortstop, are the only seniors on the team, along with Bass and Gideon. All other players are juniors.

Following is the complete list of all-America players for 1975:

FIRST TEAM
