Marshall vs. Florida State

First Inning --

Marshall -- Ramella beats out infield hit, advances to second on throwing error by Patterson. Severino walks. Allie sticks out swinging. Rulli singles up the middle to Dead bases. Rosiek hit into fielders choice, scoring Ramella. Severino advances to third. Berkery ~~strikes~~ out swinging. One run, two hits, one error, two left.

Florida State -- Gilbert flies to shallow left field. Benda reaches first on error by 2B Lewis. Patterson flies to left. Benda thrown out attempting to steal second (Rulli to Lewis.)
No runs, no hits, one error, nobody left. MARSHALL 1, FLA. STATE 0

Second Inning --

Marshall -- Wilson grounded out to shortstop. Butler grounds to short who overthrows first. Butler advances to second. Lewis walks. Ramella walks to load the bases. Joe Nichols replaces DeLoach on the mound, DeLoach leaves after allowing one run, two hits and three walks. Benda grounds to the firstbaseman who throws to second to force Ramella. Butler scores. Lewis scores on wild pitch. Severino advances to second. Severino steals third. Allie ~~strikes~~ strikes out swinging.
Two runs, no hits, one error, and one left.

Florida State -- Mobley grounds out to third. Traylor flies to deep right field. McDonald grounds to third who under-throws to first. Milner flies out to second base.
No runs, no hits, one error, one left. MARSHALL 3, FLA. STATE 0

Third Inning --

Marshall -- Rulli flies to ~~left~~ right. Rosiek takes called third strike. Berkery flies to short.
No runs, no hits, no errors, and nobody left.

Florida State -- Rigby flies to centerfield. ~~Rigby~~ Huff attempts bunt, thrown out by catcher. Gilbert grounds to first.

Marshall -- Wilson grounds to third. Butler grounds to short. Lewis grounds to first.

Fifth Inning --

Marshall -- Ramella grounds out to the pitcher. Severino slams double to deep right-center field. Allie strikes out swinging. Rulli singles sharply to centerfield scoring Severino from second. Rosiek grounds out to third.
One run, two hits, no errors and one left. MARSHALL 4, FLORIDA STATE 0

Florida State -- Traylor grounds out to second. McDonald singles to leftfield breaking up DeYoung's no-hitter. Milner pops-up to short. Rigby walks. Huff grounds out to third.
No runs, one hit, no errors and two left. MARSHALL 4, FLORIDA STATE 0

Sixth Inning --

Marshall -- Berkery flies out to leftfielder in foul territory. Wilson pops-up to short leftfield. Butler flies out to left.
No runs, no hits, no errors and nobody left.

Florida State -- Gilbert grounds to short who underthrows first. Benda walks. Patterson grounds out to third but advances runners to second and third. Mobley pops-up to shallow right field, runners hold. Traylor strikes out swinging.
No runs, no hits, one error and two left. MARSHALL 4, FLA. STATE 0

Seventh Inning --

Marshall -- Lewis flies to centerfield. Ramella lines out to centerfield who makes catch on run to his left. ~~RAMA~~ Bounces out to first, Severino.
No runs, no hits, no errors and nobody left.

Florida State -- McDonald flies out to centerfield. Milner walks. Rigby grounds out to short, Milner advances to second. Huff bunts to pitcher who muffs ball, Milner moves to third and Huff is safe with a hit. Gilbert pops-up to first.
No runs, one hit, no errors and two left. MARSHALL 4, FLORIDA STATE 0

Eighth Inning --

Marshall -- Allie walks. Rulli flies to centerfield. Rosiek grounds to pitcher who throws to second to force Allie, Rosiek safe on fielders choice. Berkery grounds out to first base.
No runs, no hits, no errors and one left.

Florida State -- Benda grounds out to third. Patterson flies out to centerfield. Mobley doubles down leftfield line. Traylor grounds out to second.
No runs, one hit, no errors and one left. MARSHALL 4, FLA. STATE 0

Ninth Inning --

Marshall -- Wilson doubles to left-center field. Ken Fischer replaces Joe Nichols, who leaves after allowing one run on three hits. Dave Helmer pinch hits for Butler. Helmer grounds out to the pitcher. Lewis strikes out swinging. Ramella walks. Severino grounds out to second.
No runs, two hits, no errors and two left.

Florida State -- McDonald flies to rightfield. Milner strikes out swinging. Rigby walks. Huff bunts out infield hit. Gilbert bounces out to the catcher.

COACHING QUOTES:

Jack Cook (Marshall Coach):

"This was a sweet win for us. Coming into the tournament, people said, 'Marshall who?'"

"To win a game like this is just a great win for our program."

"It helped a great deal to get some runs early. We were very nervous, tight, and unsure of ourselves in our warm-ups. But, all the butterflies were gone after we got on the score board."

Referring to Albie DeYoung's pitching performance: "He pitched a fabulous game. It was one of the guttie t performances that I've ever seen. The last several innings he was worn out. His body was tired, but his head and his heart were not."

"Albie didn't really pitch as well as he can. He is usually ahead of the hitters, but today he was behind on the count most of the time."

Woody Woodward (Florida State Coach):

"DeYoung a very, very good game. We did not play ~~nixxany~~ aggressive baseball today. Not to take anything away from a fine performance ~~fr~~ by Marshall but we were a ~~n~~ below average team. The fact remains that they out played us."

"Four days without practice had to hurt us but Marshall hasn't played a game since May 3 so you can't use that as an excuse." (Florida State has been idle since Sunday and unable to practice due to rain)

"We have been a come-from-behind team all year but it finally caught up with us. We had a couple opportunities but the lefthander (DeYoung) threw strikes."
