## 'Canes nip FSU again

MIAMI — For the second straight game, Florida State took a 3-2 lead into the bottom of the seventh inning, and for the second straight game, Miami did something about it.

An Alex DeJesus home run tied the score, 3-3, and in the eighth, Randy Guerra's opposite-field, bloop triple scored two runs to give the Hurricanes a 5-3 win Saturday over the Seminoles at Mark Light Stadium.

The win for Miami completed a two-game sweep of the Seminoles in the teams' first regular season meetings in two years. Friday night, the Hurricanes prevailed, 4-3.

Seminole Jack Emerick, as he did Friday, saw his bid to be a hero wiped out. The junior hit his second homer in as many games Saturday, tying the score at 2-2 in the fourth inning.

FSU took the lead 3-2 in the sixth, when Emerick led off with a double, advanced to third on an infield out, and scored on David Mobley's deep fly ball to center field.

Mobley, playing first base with Don Milner sidelined with an injured wrist, hit his third homer of the year in the second to get FSU on the board after Miami scored two first-inning runs off Seminole pitcher Jim Riley.

Riley, who lost his first game to make his record 5-1, gave up no hits from the second to

the sixth inning, while his teammates built their temporary lead.

The pitcher ran into trouble in the sixth, giving up two hits. But he was bailed out once when catcher Craig Ramsey picked Howie Shapiro off second base, and again when Ramsey alertly hustled to third base to tag Tony Brewer out on an attempted double steal.

Miami won the game in the eighth when Lee Gullette led off with a single. Shapiro walked and Ron Batter, who had doubled home the first Miami run, moved both runners over with a sacrifice bunt. Brewer fanned for the second out, but then it was Guerra, who drove in Miami's second run in the first inning on an infield out.

This hit travelled a little further and was worth more. Guerra poked a 2-2 pitch into short left field. John Gagnon gave it a try, but couldn't reach the ball. It bounced all the way into the corner, and Gullette and Shapiro scored.

Rob Rajsich pitched a scoreless ninth inning in relief of Hurricane winner Jeff Morrison (8-0) to nail down the win.

The Seminoles, 26-7, play at St. Leo today in a noon doubleheader. John Wolfer (4-0) and Rick Holloway (5-2) pitch for FSU.
