✓ FLORIDA STATE SEASON IN REVIEW

Florida State has been given new life with its invitation to participate in the East Regional of the NCAA post-season baseball playoffs.

Many Seminole baseball followers thought the chances of the Garnet and Gold making their 17 appearance in the playoffs went out the window when Tulane took a 5-2 verdict in the championship game of the Metro Conference Tournament on May 6. A Metro title would have given the 'Noles an automatic berth in the NCAA South Regional.

Instead, the Seminoles have received one of the 13 at-large invitations and a second chance.

It would have been very hard, though, for the tournament committee to overlook the Seminoles of head coach Dick Howser, who will be trying to make his third consecutive World Series appearance. But, a trip to Omaha would be his first at the collegiate level. He is completing his first year at the Seminole helm after 10 seasons as the third base coach of the New York Yankees, including the last two when they won the world championship.

Check these Seminole facts...

- ...the record was 43-15-1 and included a 16-game win streak;
- ...against teams invited to participate in the NCAA post-season tournament the Seminoles were 9-8;
- ...the team clubbed a record-breaking 81 home runs during its 59-game schedule;
- ...against Memphis State in the third round of the Metro Tournament, FSU batters hit six home runs, establishing a new school record breaking the old mark of five set a week earlier vs. Florida;
- ...seven Seminole batters--six regulars--finished the season with batting averages of .317 or better;
- ...Seminole batters were not only adept with the bat, but knew what to do once they reached base--final regular season stats show a total of 91 stolen bases with Bruce Huff and Mike Fuentes leading the way at 22 apiece.

So, what are these Seminoles? Let's take a look, position-by-position.

CATCHER--Juniors Jack Emerick and Craig Ramsey alternate here and there is very little difference between the two. Emerick finished the season hitting .262 in 38 games while Ramsey batted .257 in 37 tests. They both have good enough sticks that Howser on occasion has used one or the other as the designated hitter. They can also cut down runners attempting to steal. Emerick tossed out nine enemy base stealers during the season while Ramsey nailed six.

FIRST BASE--Don Milner was hampered in the early part of the season by a wrist injury. He has returned to the lineup and now holds down the starting slot, although he sometimes gets relief help in the late innings. His .282 batting average includes 19 extra base hits--10 doubles, two triples and

✓ seven homers. Milner's .988 fielding average is tops among the infielders.

SECOND BASE--All-American candidate Craig Patterson holds down this spot. A poor Metro Conference Tournament performance took his average below .400 for the first time in five weeks. His final regular season average was .392 with a school record 91 hits in 232 trips to the plate. He also drew 31 walks. He bats third and drove home 62 runs during the season.

SHORTSTOP--Sophomore Don DeLoach from Tallahassee drew the starting assignment this season, filling in for departed All-American Bob Benda. DeLoach has had some problems in the field, committing 23 errors, but has been more than adequate at the bat where he hit for a .300 clip while appearing in all 59 games. Bats in the second position where he collected 73 hits, including nine home runs, 11 doubles and two triples. He also picked up 35 base on balls.

THIRD BASE--After platooning Dave Mobley and Doug Casey early in the season, Howser now consistently starts Mobley. Casey is used in the late innings, however, when Mobley moves to first as a replacement for Milner. Mobley has had an off season at the plate, batting just .265 with nine home runs. He is three round trippers shy of breaking the career record of Terry Kennedy, now the property of the St. Louis Cardinals. Casey is the 'old man' of the team at 26, but age doesn't slow him down. In 30 games he batted a neat .367 with 22 hits in 60 attempts.

OUTFIELD--Firmly fixed as the starters are Ronnie Traylor (left), Mike Fuentes (center) and Bruce Huff (right). Fuentes has been one of the season's major surprises. After collecting just six official plate trips last spring, he has been a permanent starter in 1979 and is second on the club in batting with a neat .373 average. That includes a club leading 16 home runs and school record 70 RBIs. He possesses good speed and will go into the East Regional with 22 stolen bases in as many attempts. Traylor was platooned early in the season, but is now a permanent starter and has proved his worth with a .317 average that includes seven homers and 36 RBI. Huff has become one of the most valuable leadoff batters in Seminole history. His .336 average tells just part of the story. He also has picked up 46 walks and stolen 22 bases.

DESIGNATED HITTER--If college baseball would pick a "Rookie of the Year" freshman Jeff Ledbetter would be a leading candidate. This freshman from Clearwater, Fla., was one of four FSU players to make the All-Metro Conference team. He played in 47 games and hit 12 home runs and had 51 RBI, the third best on the club. He was being benched early in the season when the opposition would throw a lefthander, but when Metro Tournament time came, Howser elected to use "Treetops" against all pitching.

PITCHING--Righty Dick Wiggins (11-3, 2.94) is regarded as the top starter. He drew the opening nod in the Metro Tournament and will have same assignment for East Regional. After that, Howser can call upon righty John Wolfer (9-0, 3.13), righty Rick Holloway (5-5, 4.87) and righty Jim Riley (8-4, 4.84). Holloway and Riley are both seniors and have had their problems during the season. After losing on April 1 at St. Leo, Rick didn't throw for 30 days before beating Georgia Tech, 5-2. He has lost his last two starts and been plagued by wildness, but the Seminoles have only scored three runs in his behalf. Riley started the season at 7-1 but has lost three of his last four starts and seen the ERA balloon from 1.83 to 4.84. Relief chores belong to walk-on Ken Smith (2-1, 3.76), Ken Fischer (1-0, 4.40) and Rick Hatcher (2-1, 5.08).

DICK HOWSER
Head Baseball Coach

Last summer Dick Howser managed the greatest baseball team in America during a nationally-televised Monday night game against the Kansas City Royals.

Today, Dick Howser has traded in his New York Yankee pinstripes and is now a first year baseball coach at Florida State University, coaching the Seminoles in their 17th NCAA Regional appearance. The move from New York to Tallahassee marked the return of Florida State's first All-American baseball player and ended his nine-year stint as the third base coach of the Yankees.

Howser, at age 42, accepted the Florida State job last September before helping the Yankees to their second straight World Championship. The close of the 1978 season marked Howser's 18th as a professional since he was tabbed an All-American shortstop for the Seminoles in 1957 and 1958.

In his first season as a collegiate coach, Howser stands 43-15-1.

Howser, who was born in Miami but later moved to West Palm Beach, first arrived on the Florida State campus in 1955. He promptly led the Seminoles in hitting the next year with a .422 average. Despite his slight build, 5-9 and 160 pounds, Howser played a major role in leading Florida State to the College World Series with a team leading .364 batting average in 1957.

After being selected to All-American honors again in 1958, Howser was selected the Florida Amateur Athlete of the year and signed a professional contract with the Kansas City Athletics.

It took him just three seasons to break into the big leagues and 1961 was a big year. As the captain of the Athletics that year, he hit a solid .280, scored 108 runs and had 29 doubles. He not only made the All-Star team that season, but he was also named the American League's Rookie of the Year. Once again he was honored by his home state which named him the Florida Pro Athlete of the Year.

The next season Howser suffered a broken hand and missed nearly three months of the season. Only in 1964, then with the Cleveland Indians, was he a regular for an entire season. He finished his playing career with the Yankees in 1968 after posting a lifetime batting average of .248. A year later, Yankee manager Ralph Houk named Howser as a replacement to the legendary Frank Crosetti as the Yankee third base coach. Crosetti ended a 29-year career as a player and coach.

Howser immediately began laying the groundwork for a coaching career. He managed the New York Yankee winter league instructional program from 1970 to 1975. During his Yankee tenure he held the job at third base under four managers -- Houk, Bill Virdon, Billy Martin and Bob Lemon.

Howser began spending part of his off-season in Tallahassee in the mid-60's. He and his wife Nancy, a former airline stewardess and Tallahassee native, has spent about four months a year in Tallahassee since 1975.

SEMINOLE FIELD

Seminole Field, located on campus, is one of the nation's outstanding college baseball fields. Picturesquely located on the western end of the campus, it is surrounded by pine trees, is fully lighted and has a seating capacity of 3,500. The playing surface is kept in top playing condition year-round (for it is used 10 to 11 months of the year) by the FSU Grounds Department. The infield grass is 419 Bermuda and the "skin surface" is a special red clay and sand composition that affords the fastest possible draining and drying time. In the event of inclement weather there is tarpaulin to fully cover the infield quickly and easily.

The outfield is also planted in Bermuda and is level and true. The fences are 321 down the right field line going out quickly to 346 in right-center and 411 in center field. The left field is 340 going out to 363 in left-center.

The lights, which have been in place since the mid 1960's are equal to many minor league fields. Even teams which rarely, if ever have played under lights previously, have found little problem adjusting to night baseball at Florida State.

In addition to the main field, there are two other on-campus diamonds available for use. Both are within easy access to Seminole Field and will provide excellent practice areas for competing teams.

Modern restrooms and a large well-equipped concessions stand assure the fans of comfortable and convenient facilities at all times.

Located adjacent to Florida State's Doak S. Campbell football stadium, Seminole Field has outstanding parking facilities with easy access via a pedestrian tunnel which alleviates any dangerous highway crossings. This fully paved parking area will make it possible to offer all fans free, convenient parking.
