

# FSU wrecks Tech

ATLANTA — Florida State's baseball team ended a seven-day layoff by scoring a week's worth of runs Sunday afternoon.

Frank Fazzini drove in four runs and Doug Little pitched seven innings of scoreless ball as the Seminoles beat Atlantic Coast Conference champion Georgia Tech 19-0.

It was FSU's 13th win in its last 16 games and pushed the Seminoles' record to 45-18. FSU collected 18 hits, six for extra bases.

Tech fell to 32-14-1 overall and suffered its worst defeat since Duke beat the Yellow Jackets 25-4 back in 1983.

FSU had been idle since April 21 because of exams.

"When you get both great pitching and timely hitting, you should win," FSU head coach Mike Martin said. "It was probably our best overall game of the year, but it certainly was not indicative of the type of team Georgia Tech has. I expect them to come right at us tomorrow."

The teams conclude the two-game series today at 7 p.m.

FSU jumped out early in the game, scoring three runs in the third. Luis Alicea's record-tying ninth triple of the season opened the scoring as he drove in Keith Kidd, who began the inning with a single. A walk, an error and run-scoring singles by Fazzini and Tommy Zoeller made it 3-0.

Fazzini, who had four RBIs on a 4-for-4 day, made it 4-0 in the fourth on his 26th home run of the season to deep center field. Fazzini keyed a six-run seventh with a two-run double, giving him 94 RBIs on the year.

While FSU was taking a 10-0 lead, Little was dominating Georgia Tech hitters. Little, now 11-2, allowed just three hits in his seven innings and let no Yellow Jacket runner past second base.

Little struck out five and walked just one, before giving way to Pete Brown in the eighth. Paul Thomas pitched the ninth inning and recorded two strikeouts. Seminole pitching was also aided by errorless fielding.

Florida State bats were not finished, however. Ed Fulton slammed a pinch-hit, three-run home run to cap off the seventh and Barry Blackwell triggered another six-run outburst in the eighth with a grand slam to center to up the lead to 16-0.

Back-to-back sacrifice flies by Vince Calandra and Blackwell helped add three more runs in the ninth as Seminole hitters produced their fifth-highest output of the season and their largest margin of victory.

Blackwell concluded the day with two hits in four at-bats and five RBIs. Alicea and Jimmy Jones each collected two hits for the Seminoles, while Bien Figueroa recorded a double and scored three times.

"I've said it before, but I need to repeat. Our guys always seem to score me a lot of runs and that really take the pressure off of me," Little said. "I thought my slider was working real well and I was able to throw the changeup for strikes."

Mike Loynd, 10-4 and winner of his last four outings, will go against Yellow Jacket ace Kevin Brown, 8-3.
