PLAY - BY - PLAY

FIRST INNING

Florida State: Marzan drops a single into left center field. Sorrento slices a single into left field. Alicea grounds into a 6-4 fielders choice as Sorrento is forced at second and Marzan goes to third. Figueroa grounds into a 3-6 fielders choice as Alicea is forced at second. Marzan scores on the play (RBI). Mangham beats out a bouncer to short advancing Figueroa to second. Taddeo grounds out 3-1.
One run, three hits, no errors, two left.

Arizona: Hinzo grounds out 5-3. Hale pops out to the second baseman in shallow right field near the line. Senne is caught looking.

No runs, no hits, no errors, none left.

FLORIDA STATE: 1
ARIZONA: 0

SECOND INNING

Florida State: Fulton lays down a bunt down the third baseline for a single. Blackwell chops a single over the third baseman's head into left advancing Fulton to second. Clayborne lays down a sacrifice bunt down the third baseline and Heredia can't come up with the ball (E-1), loading the bases. Marzan pops out to the catcher behind the plate. Sorrento hits a grand slam homer over the right field wall at the 370' sign (4-RBI's). Alicea grounds out 4-3. Figueroa grounds out 6-3.

Four runs, three hits, one error, none left.

Arizona: Trafton hits one to dead center field wall at the 420' sign for homer #15 (RBI). Strong walks. Millay grounds out 4-3, Trafton moves to second. Johnson goes down swinging.

Alexander walks. Rohde grounds out 4-3.

One run, one hit, no errors, two left.

THIRD INNING

Florida State: Mangham pops out to short. Taddeo chops one over the pitchers head but is thrown out 6-3. Fulton goes down swinging.

No runs, no hits, no errors, none left.

Arizona: Hinzo grounds out 5-3. Hale grounds out 3-1. Senne walks on a full count.

Trafton grounds a single through the hole into left advancing Senne to second. Strong flies out to the first baseman in foul territory.

No runs, one hit, no errors, two left.

FOURTH INNING

Florida State: Blackwell lays down a bunt single down the third baseline. Clayborne goes down swinging. Marzan singles into right field advancing Blackwell to third. Sorrento grounds into a 4-6-3 double play.

No runs, two hits, no errors, one left.

Arizona: Millay walks on a full count. Johnson flies out to the right fielder in right field. Alexander grounds out 5-3, Millay moves to second. Millay moves to third on the wild pitch. Rohde strikes out 2-3.

No runs, no hits, no errors, one left.

FIFTH INNING

Florida State: Alicea pops out to the catcher in fair territory. Figueroa grounds out 6-3. Mangham grounds a single back up the middle. Mangham steals second. Taddeo goes down swinging.

No runs, one hit, no errors, one left.

Arizona: Hinzo goes down swinging. Hale lays down a bunt single down the third baseman and Blackwell charges the ball and just misses throwing him out. Senne grounds a sharply hit single down the line to left advancing Hale to second. Hale advances to third and Senne to second on a wild pitch. Trafton is hit by the pitch, loading the bases. Strong hits a sacrifice fly to left field scoring Hale from third. Senne holds at second. (RBI) Millay pops out to the third baseman in foul territory.

One run, two hits, no errors, two left.

ARIZONA: 2

SIXTH INNING

Florida State: Fulton grounds out 4-3. Blackwell lines a single just past the outstretched arm of the third baseman into left field. Clayborne goes down swinging. Marzan is caught looking.

No runs, one hit, no errors, one left.

Arizona: Johnson doubles off the left center field wall. Alexander singles into left center field advancing Johnson to third. Rohde lines a single up the middle scoring Johnson from third (RBI) and advancing Alexander to second. Hinzo lays down a bunt single down the third baseline loading the bases. Hale hits a sacrifice fly to center scoring Alexander from third, Hinzo remains at first (RBI). Hinzo steals second. Senne homers over the left center field wall below the scoreboard scoring Hinzo and Rohde in front of him (3-RBI's). Doug Little replaces Loynd on the mound. Trafton lines out to the center field in center. Strong doubles off the wall into right field and is safe at second on a close play. Strong advances to third on a wild pitch. Millay grounds out 4-3. Five runs, six hits, no errors, one left.

SEVENTH INNING

Florida State: Sorrento grounds out 4-3. Alicea goes down swinging. Figueroa grounds out 4-3.

No runs, no hits, no errors, none left.

Arizona: Johnson lines out to the center fielder in center field. Alexander lines a single through the hole into left. Rohde singles into right field on a hit and run advancing Alexander to third. Hinzo grounds into a 5-4 fielders choice as Rohde is forced at second and Alexander scores from third (RBI). Hinzo steals second. Hale goes down swinging.

Onerun, two hits, no errors, one left.

EIGHTH INNING

Florida State: Mangham grounds out 6-3. Taddeo flies out to the right fielder in right center. Fulton flies out to the right fielder on the warning track.

No runs, no hits, no errors, none left.

Arizona: Senne grounds a single through the hole into left. Senne steals second. Trafton walks. Steve Kovensky replaces Little on the mound. Senne advances to third and Trafton to second on a wild pitch. Strong grounds back to the pitcher, 1-3. Millay walks on a full count, loading the bases. Dave Shermet pinch runs for Millay. Johnson hits a sacrifice fly to center scoring Senne from third and advancing Trafton to third and Shermet stays at first. (RBI). Shermet steals second. Alexander pops out to the second baseman.

HOW DOES THE BYE WORK FOR THE WINNER OF GAME 11?

By winning tonight's game, a team is assured of a berth in the championship game, whether it is played Sunday or Monday, and no worse than a second-place finish in the championship.

The bye comes into play only if tonight's winner (Arizona or Florida State) loses on Saturday. That would mean three teams remain and would guarantee a Monday championship game. Sunday's Game 14 would then pair the other two survivors for the right to play the team with the bye (tonight's winner) on Monday for the championship.

HOW IMPORTANT IS WINNING GAME 11?

It depends. While it is true that the winner tonight is guaranteed a berth in the title game, how many times does that team actually win the championship?

Would you believe only three times in the past ten years? We are using ten years because the 1976 CWS was the first year the winner of Game 11 received a bye if three teams remained after Game 13. Prior to '76 the team with a bye was determined by lot among the three survivors. The following lists the undefeated team after Game 11 and which team actually won the championship:

LOYND, HEREDIA BOTH SHOOTING FOR RECORDS TONIGHT

Florida State's Mike Loynd will be going for an all-time Division I record tonight, but Arizona's starter, Gilbert Heredia, is also trying for a record.

Loynd enters tonight's game with 20 wins, tying him with Hawaii's Derek Tatsuno who did it in 1979. Loynd can only TIE the collegiate record, set by Alan Fowlkes of Cal Poly Pomona (a Division II school) in 1980.

Heredia can set an Arizona single-season record with his 16th win tonight. He is currently tied with three Wildcats: Don Lee (1956, 15-0); Dave Breuker (1974, 15-1); and Craig Giola (1976, 15-5).

SESSION ATTENDANCE RECORD SET

Last night's crowd of 12,832, set a Session 6 record. The previous record was 12,012, in 1981. Overall attendance is currently 72,337, 4,541 off the record pace last year.

QUOTES FROM FLORIDA STATE --

Coach Mike Martin --

"

You just have to give most of the credit to Heredia. We got off to a great start and then the last seven innings we didn't get a sniff. You guys may wonder why we stayed with Mike Loynd as long as we did. The young man has pitched out of those jams all year. That's why he's won 20 games. Arizona just did a good job of getting the key hits when they needed them.

We're just like three other teams in this tournament. We've got three losses and tomorrow is a new day. We know Oklahoma State is going to be tough. I guess it'll be the Cowboys and Indians. We are not going to fold our tents.

FROM PITCHER MIKE LOYND --

"I've never felt like that before out on the mound. Sitting around that hotel for four days really took it out of me. The pulled muscle in my back didn't bother me at all. I didn't have any pop on the ball. I had to stop twice in the bullpen just to catch my breath. Sitting around just wore me out."

Arizona coach Jerry Kindall--

It was another great comeback. That's tenacity. When we were down, we got tough. It wasn't fate or destiny; it's hard work.

Loynd was impressive. If he has his slider going he's very effective. But our hitters adapted. We had them protect the outer half of the plate and lay off the breaking ball. Many of his strikeouts this year were probably on bad pitches, so we had our guys be discerning at the plate.

Trafton's home run gave us hope, then we had to rely on Gilbert (Heredia). If we could hang in there and put some men on base, we could stage a rally. Loynd is outstanding, but Gilbert is every bit as good.

Heredia---- My catcher (Steve Strong) helped me settle down when I got in trouble. Usually the ball moves well when my mechanics are right. At first the mound was too 'new.' Eventually I wore some holes and got more comfortable. I can spot the ball better after a while.

I got inspired when we went ahead, and then I was mentally tough.

Chip Hale--- We're a good team as long as we play hard--and we did, even when we were down.

Mike Senne-- Seeing Sluggo (Todd Trafton) made (after being hit by a pitch) and sensing that he wanted to charge the mound, but being smart and running to first really pumped us up. We had heard so much about Loynd being an intimidator. It doesn't work with the Wildcats.

Kinda, ll----- (Ron) Fraser will maximize his talent. We can't be arrogant or cocky. We'll hold nothing back and take nothing for granted.
