()Florida State 6, Arizona State 5 (10 innings)

TALLAHASSEE -- Florida State's Tony Liebsack hit a two-out double off the right field wall in the bottom of the 10th inning to score a pair of runs and lift Florida State to a 6-5 victory over top-ranked Arizona State in exciting college baseball action Friday.

Liebsack's double came on a 1-2 pitch from ASU reliever Scott Dodd, 3-1, and scored Chris Brock, who had walked to start the two-out

rally, and pinch-hitter Marc Dunbar, who singled.

The double capped a tremendous college baseball game that saw ASU take a 4-3 lead in the top of the ninth; FSU come back to tie the game in the bottom of the inning, and Arizona State forge ahead again, 5-4, in the top of the 10th.

Florida State reliever Kenny Robinson, 1-0, picked up the victory with one inning of work. Robinson pitched the 10th in relief of Ricky Kimball.

Kimball took over for Seminole starter Roger Bailey in the eighth with FSU clinging to a 3-1 lead. He allowed a double by Jim Austin which scored Clarke Rea, bringing the Sun Devils within one at 3-2.

Kimball pitched out of the eighth, but surrendered a pair of runs in the ninth on three hits and a sacrifice fly as Arizona State claimed its first lead of the game at 5-4. In the ninth, ASU's Todd Steverson doubled and scored on a single by Mike Scialo. Scialo advanced on a single by Rea and scored on a sacrifice fly by Bill Dunn.

FSU came back in its half of the ninth, though, off Arizona State reliever Tony Pena. Pena relieved starter Sean Rees, who pitched eight innings and surrendered three earned runs on six hits while striking out five. Pena, though, was not as effective. After one out, he loaded the bases with a hit batsman and two walks. Dodd then came on and induced Eduardo Perez to hit a grounder to third base to score the tying run and send the game into extra innings.


In ASU's half of the 10th, Kurt Ehmann led off with a double to center off Kimball. Robinson then replaced Kimball, but gave up a single to Kelly. When FSU centerfielder Brock bobbled the ball, Ehmann scored. Robinson then retired the next three batters to set the stage for Liebsack's ninth-inning heroics.


Besides Liebsack, Perez was the hitting star for Florida State with a pair of hits, including a sixth-inning solo home run which broke a 1-1 tie. Perez drove in three of FSU's six runs. Four ASU players accounted for eight of the Sun Devils' 11 hits as Steverson, Rea, Austin and Kelly each had a pair of hits.

Florida State's victory, before a crowd of 3,465, improved its record to 4-0 on the year. Arizona State saw its seven-game winning streak come to an end and its record fall to 8-2. The three-game series continues Saturday at 2:30 p.m. at Dick Howser Stadium.
