TALLAHASSEE -- Kenny Felder drove in three runs with a single and a home run, and Ty Mueller's two hits scored another four as Florida State blasted Minnesota 12-4 before a crowd of 3,175 at Dick Howser Stadium Saturday.

FSU, which improved to 9-2 with the victory, scored four runs in the second, three in the third, and five in the fourth off Minnesota starter Eric Slagle, 0-1, and reliever Scott Bakkum, who came on in the third. Each gave up six runs on five hits and walked three.

FSU starter Jimmy Lewis improved his record to 3-1 despite giving up seven hits and walking six. Lewis was helped by three double plays turned by the FSU infield during his five-inning stint.

Minnesota, 0-2, took a 1-0 lead in the second when John Kopfer walked, stole second, advanced to third on Steve Calvert's single and scored on a Lewis wild pitch.

FSU came back with four runs in its half of the second, including two on Mueller's single, which plated Pedro Grifol and Chris Roberts, who had both singled. The Seminoles' scored again in that inning on Link Jarrett's double, which scored Tony Liebsack.

Felder led off the FSU third with a solo homer to left, his first home run of the season. After one out, Roberts reached on an error, Mueller walked, and Chris Brock singled to score Roberts. Liebsack's sacrifice fly scored Mueller.

Minnesota loaded the bases with one out in the fourth on Calvert's second hit of the game and a pair of walks. Brent Gates' line out to left scored Calvert, but the other runners were stranded when Mueller made a running catch at the centerfield wall of Tom Doyle's deep fly.


The Seminoles put the game away in the fourth with five runs on four hits. The big blows in that inning were Felder's two-run single with the bases loaded, and Mueller's two-run double.

Minnesota picked up two more runs in the eighth off Florida State reliever John McNeese. The Golden Gophers outhit the Seminoles, 11-10 as five UM players collected two hits apiece.

The two teams conclude the three-game series Sunday at 2 p.m. at Dick Howser Stadium.
