WAKE FOREST COACH GEORGE GREER

"The first inning lost us the ballgame. If you only get three hits and only score one run against FSU...they're going to score runs.

"(Tim) Davis beat us earlier this year. He's got a great strikeout-to-walk ratio. He's throws for strikes and if you can do that against college hitters, you're going to get them out. DeFranco didn't pitch a bad ballgame. He's not a strikeout pitcher, so you're not going to get a lot of strikeouts with him. You're going to get ground balls and we made a couple of good plays on ground balls."

FLORIDA STATE COACH MIKE MARTIN

"Basically I was very pleased with the discipline at the plate. I thought our guys got the key hits. That's something that you've got to have in tournament play.

"I though the key to that (the first) inning was the great at bat that Kenny Felder had, working himself from an 0-2 situation to a walk. Then Robert got the basehit to enable Mueller to get something to hit. Of course Ty is swining the bat very well right now.

"Tim Davis was the key to this ballgame. When you get a guy on the mound who gives up three hits for eight innings, you've got to credit the starting pitcher and Davis was in complete control out there. He did an outstanding job.

On Monday's game against Clemson:

"Clemson is a good a ball club as there is in the country. It will be a real challenge and we're looking forward to it. (When thinking about the Clemson sweep of the March series) I start getting bad feelings so what we like to do is move on the the next day. We're looking forward to the competition. Clemson's got a class ball club, an outstanding coaching staff and this is what college baseball is all about, just line up and compete."

Notes: Tonight's win was Florida State's sixth consecutive victory and its first in ACC tournament play.
