N.C. State 8, Florida State 0

RALEIGH, NC -- For the first time in at least 19 years, Florida State went hitless in a college baseball game, thanks to the mastery of North Carolina State pitcher Terry Harvey. Harvey threw a complete game no-hitter at the Seminoles as N.C. State took the opener of a three-game Atlantic Coast Conference set from FSU, 8-0 in Raleigh Friday.

It was the first no-hitter thrown by an opposing pitcher at FSU since Head Coach Mike Martin's arrival in 1976. There is no record of the last time Florida State was no-hit.

Florida State hit just two balls out of the infield all day and Harvey allowed only five FSU runners to reach base. He walked four and struck out 11 to improve his record to 7-0 on the year. One Seminole also reached base on an error. After walking two hitters in the first inning, Harvey allowed only three baserunners the rest of the way.

Fifth-ranked FSU dropped to 23-5 overall, 7-2 in the Atlantic Coast Conference with the loss. N.C. State, ranked seventh, improved to 24-2, 5-0.

Harvey would get all the run support he needed in the first inning when Pat Clougherty doubled to drive in Rob Bark and Tim Tracey. Tracey was N.C. State's hitting leader on the day with three hits, including a solo home run in the fifth that made the score 6-0, and an RBI double in the seventh that completed the Wolfpack scoring. Bark also picked up three hits for NCSU.

Starter Bryan Harris (3-2) took the loss for FSU. The two teams resume the series Saturday with righthander Paul Wilson (6-1) on the mound for Florida State.
