Florida State 7, Miami 0

TALLAHASSEE -- Righthander Paul Wilson hurled his third shutout of the season to lead fourth-ranked Florida State to a 7-0 win over 12th-rated Miami in the opening game of this three-game series at Dick Howser Stadium.

A crowd of 4,547, the largest of the season, witnessed Wilson strikeout eight and walk just two to improve to 8-2. It was the fifth complete game of the season for the sophomore from Orlando, Fla.

The Seminoles, who have won four straight, are 29-7. The Hurricanes fall to 22-12. The two teams meet again Saturday at 7 p.m. Freshman righthander Jonathan Johnson (5-0) will take the mound for Florida State. The game will be televised live by the Sunshine Network.

Wilson held the 'Canes scoreless, and Florida State exploded for six runs in the eighth inning. Designated hitter Mike Schmitz led off the inning with his fifth home run of the year, a towering drive to the deepest part of the park. It was the fourth home run by Schmitz in the last five games.

Scott Schroeffel added a two-run single and Mike Martin scored two runs with a double as Florida State gave Wilson six insurance runs and a 7-0 lead.

The Seminoles had jumped out front in the second inning, getting all the support Wilson would need on a sacrifice fly by Ty Mueller.

Wilson settled down after dodging first inning trouble with help from his defense. He walked the first two Hurricanes before Dave Berg bounced into a double play, moving leadoff hitter Luis Hernandez to third. The inning ended when Hernandez was thrown out at the plate by FSU shortstop Link Jarrett on a double-steal attempt.

The only other Miami runner to reach third base, Rick Elstrom in the fourth, was also thrown out at the plate. After a one out double, Elstrom went to third on a ground out. He was thrown out trying to steal home.

Jarrett led a 10-hit FSU attack with a perfect 3-for-3 night that included a pair walks. Mickey Lopez was 2-for-2 with two walks, Schmitz collected two hits and Randy Hodges drew four free passes.

Miami starter Kenny Henderson, who limited FSU to one run on five hits through seven innings, fell to 3-3. Keith Tippet led the Miami offense with two singles.
