HURRICANES DOWN SEMINOLES 4-3
...Berg double wins game in 12th

CORAL GABLES, FL -- Dave Berg's two-out RBI double in the 12th inning scored Mike Metcalfe from second to give the University of Miami a 4-3 victory over Florida State Saturday at Mark Light Stadium in front of a season high crowd of 3,663.

In the 12th, Metcalfe hit a high bouncer back to FSU pitcher John Nedeau. Nedeau rushed the throw, as Metcalfe was safe on an infield single and went to second on the throwing error. Luis Hernandez walked, and Bruce Thompson struck out before Berg won the game for Miami.

The Seminoles (35-10) scored all three of their runs in the top of the first to take a 3-0 lead. Mickey Lopez and Mike Martin recorded back-to-back singles and Doug Mientkiewicz hit a sacrifice fly scoring Lopez for a 1-0 lead. Mike Schmitz then stroked his sixth home run of the year for the 3-0 margin.

Miami (27-15) scored a single run in the bottom of the frame when Hernandez led off with a single, stole second and third and scored on a throwing error by FSU catcher Martin. Hernandez tied career highs in stolen bases and hits in a game with three in each category.

The 'Canes cut the lead to 3-2 in the fifth when Metcalfe tripled and scored on a Hernandez single.

In the seventh, a hit batter, a single by Hernandez and two consecutive walks to Thompson and Berg scored Metcalfe, evening the slate at 3-3.

Miami starter Jose Prado pitched a career-high 10.1 innings, the longest outing by a Miami pitcher since Joe Grahe went 12 innings on April 8, 1988 ag ast Florida State in Tallahassee. Prado allowed three runs on nine hits, while fanning five and walking only two.

Danny Graves relieved Prado with a runner on first and one out in the eleventh and struck out both Link Jarrett and Randy Hodges to end the threat. Graves has allowed only one of his last eight inherited runners to score. Graves (6-3) earned the win, pitching 1.2 innings of relief, striking out three.

John Nedeau (2-2) took the loss, in relief of starter Jonathan Johnson.

Earlier in the night, the University of Miami retired the #1 jersey of former head baseball coach Ron Fraser. The third winningest baseball coach in NCAA Division I history (1,271) won national titles in 1982 and 1985 while guiding the Hurricanes to a an NCAA record 20 consecutive regional tournaments, a string that continues a year after his retirement. Fraser's jersey is the eighth number the UM has retired.
