Clemson 7, Florida State 6

TALLAHASSEE -- Clemson's Shawn Satterfield singled in Mike Hampton in the eighth to give Clemson a 7-6 victory over Florida State in Atlantic Coast Conference baseball action Friday night.

The win improved Clemson's record to 36-14 overall, 10-10 in the league while Florida State dropped to 38-13, 13-8.

Satterfield's game-winning hit broke a 6-6 tie after Florida State had taken a 6-5 lead on Mike Schmitz' two-run home run in the seventh. Keith Williams then led off the Clemson eighth with a home run off FSU reliever Jeff Tam to tie the game at six.

After an error by FSU second baseman Chad Sheffer put Shane Monahan on base, John Nedeau relieved Tam and faced Hampton. He reached on a fielder's choice and eventually scored the game-winner.

Nedeau, one of four FSU pitchers on the day, took the loss to drop to 2-3 on the year. Andy Taulbee, who had given up Schmitz' home run, earned the win to improve to 8-2 on the year. Scott Winchester pitched the final two innings for the Tigers to earn his ninth save of the year, breaking Clemson's single season save record.

Jeff Morris led Clemson's 11-hit attack with four singles. Williams had a single and a double in addition to his home run. FSU pitchers walked a season high 13 batters, but Clemson stranded 15 in the game.

Three Florida State players picked up two hits apiece, including Schmitz, Ty Mueller and Mickey Lopez.
