Clemson 5, Florida State 1

TALLAHASSEE -- Billy McMillon went 4-for-4 and Keith Williams hit his 14th home run of the year to lead Clemson to a 5-1 victory over Florida State in Atlantic Coast Conference baseball action Sunday.

Clemson won the three-game series to even its ACC record at 11-11 on the year, while improving to 37-15 overall. Florida State fell to 39-14, and finished the ACC regular season 14-9. The loss gave Florida State the No. 3 seed, and a first-round bye, in the conference tournament, which begins Saturday in Greenville, S.C.

Clemson scored three runs in the third off FSU starter and loser Bryan Harris (6-4). Jeff Morris had an RBI single in the inning while Shane Monahan drove in two with a triple off the centerfield fence.

Florida State scored its only run in the second on Ty Mueller's leadoff home run, his sixth of the season. Clemson's Chad Phillips improved his record to 10-2, allowing only one run on six hits through six innings.

Clemson extended its lead to 5-1 in the seventh on Williams' two-run home run off FSU reliever Jeff Tam.

Mueller and Scott Schroeffel each collected two of Florida State's seven hits on the day to lead the Seminole offense.

Following a Wednesday game at Jacksonville, the Seminoles open play in the ACC Tournament Sunday, May 16 against the winner of the game between the fifth and sixth-seeded teams (yet to be determined).
