Atlanta, Ga. – The No. 8 Florida State Seminoles (35-13, 15-2 ACC) ended a four-game losing streak with a 6-2 win over No. 10 Georgia Tech (32-14, 11-9 ACC) in front of 2,458 fans at Russ Chandler Stadium.

Nick Rogers' put the Seminoles up 1-0 in the top of the second inning when he ripped a two-out single to right center, stole second and came around to score on a pair of Yellow Jacket errors.

Georgia Tech took the lead with two runs in the bottom of the third. With the bases loaded and one out, Victor Menocal grounded to the hole at shortstop. Jeff Probst came up with the ball, but his errant throw to second allowed two runs to score.

The Yellow Jackets increased their lead to 5-1 with three more in the bottom of the fifth. Richard Lewis walked, Bryan Prince singled and Jason Basil walked to load the bases. Menocal knocked in Lewis with a sacrifice fly to left and, after the two runners advanced on a groundout, Derik Goffena picked up two RBI with a single to left.

With the help of two Seminole errors, Tech scored six runs (five unearned) in the seventh to put the game away at 11-1.

FSU added one in the eighth when John-Ford Griffin scored on Karl Jernigan's sacrifice fly and the Yellow Jackets scored one in the bottom of the inning on a homer by Jason Perry for the final margin of 12-2.

Next up on the FSU schedule is a three-game series at Maryland (May 4-6).
