

## The Home Opener!

In what promises to be one of the weekend thrillers in collegiate football, tonight's action here on the beautiful TCU Stadium turf brings together the TCU Horned Frogs and the air-minded Florida State Seminoles.

It is the home opener for the Frogs and the first contest of the season for the Florida folks, and everything points to

a dandy evening of entertainment.

TCU kicked off 1965 play last week in Lincoln against the nation's top-ranked team, the Nebraska Cornhuskers. With probably its finest team in history and an overwhelming favorite for its third straight Big Eight championship, Nebraska showed class en route to a 34-14 triumph over the

visiting Purples.

Despite the 20-point margin, the Cornhuskers found out they were in for a ball game. Jumping off to a quick 14-0 lead, the Huskers had tough sledding until a pass interception gave them a 21-7 budge just before intermission. Outweighed at least 20 pounds per man, the Frogs still showed a tough running game, and came out of the contest with some

bright points.

Many thought the Nebraska outfit was as good as its pre-season rating. And the Horned Frog observers felt this Purple machine showed promise of being better than its predicted sixth place finish in the rugged Southwest Conference race. Not a real championship contender at this stage but a ball club that might be capable of bringing one of the top teams left on the 1965 slate down to size. It looks real interesting.

#### FSU Was 9-1-1 In 1964

The Seminole fans are anxious to take a look at their eleven tonight. It was quite a team in 1964 that Bill Peterson showed the opponents, including TCU, with the Seminoles racking up a 10-0 verdict right here on this same turf last season. Peterson's lads, sparked by that amazing aerial combination of Steve Tensi and Fred Biletnikoff and a terrific defense, plowed under nine opponents in 11 games. Only a tie with Houston and an upset loss to Virginia Tech ruined the perfect season. And the best moment in FSU's young major college career probably came in that 36-19 waltz over Oklahoma in the Gator Bowl.

Tensi and Biletnikoff are now in pro football, but several top-flight offensive personnel return, along with nearly all

that defensive group (eight starters return). Quarterback Ed Pritchett looks like he can fill Tensi's big shoes, and he has some top-notch receivers. Halfback Phil Spooner, the club's top rusher with 516 net yards, is back for a final fling. And Fullback Wayne Giardino a starter the last half of 1964, was FSU's No. 3 gainer.

In that defense is a lot of talent. Linebacker Bill McDowell and Middle Guard Jack Shinholser heads the returnees, while the big Pennie brothers, Frank (6-4, 252) and Charles (6-4,

240) give the FSU crowd fine tackle play.

This is the rubber game in the three-game series. TCU won the opener in the rain and mud at Tallahassee in 1963, 10-0. Then last year, FSU won here, 13-0.

#### Frogs To Bounce Back?

Frog Coach Abe Martin, fielding his 13th Purple team, is anxious to see how his youngsters will react after the big

meeting with Nebraska.

We played one whale of a football game last Saturday,' he said. "I can easily see why they were rated No. 1. We made some mistakes—but I was real proud of our overall effort. We were outmanned from the start, but we just seemed to continue to carry the fight to them. This team has something, and I look for it to improve with each outing."

It was no secret that the running of the two sophomores, Fullback Kenny Post and Halfback Steve Landon showed promise. Post, a rugged 195-pounder and star of the fall drills, ran for a net of 86 yards against a defense that held National Champion Arkansas to a net of 75 yards in the Cotton Bowl. Landon, a 192-pounder, added 46 more, including a nifty four-yard TD jaunt. End Joe Ball, one of the four captains, enjoyed perhaps his finest hour with his overall play.

On defense, the performances of End Larry Perry, the two guards, Porter Williams and Gary Cooper, and linebacker On defense, the E. A. Gresham, a bright 215-pound newcomer, were highlights. Safety Frank Horak, tabbed the finest in the League, led all tackles, and made several nice gains on punt and

kickoff returns.

#### Nix, Shabay To Lead Purple

Senior Kent Nix, who owns one of the finest arms ever to hit the Frog campus, and strong Sophomore P. D. Shabay will lead the Frogs from the important up-back slot tonight. Landon and Post are the running backs, while David Smith, an experienced junior, probably will get the call at wingback ahead of Soph Charles McKissick.

Ball and Sonny Campbell, the SWC's No. 2 receiver last year, who made a brilliant play for his 10-yard TD pass from Nix against Nebraska, will be the ends; Bobby Barker, another star this fall; and junior Adon Sitra, will man tackle; Russell Stout, the team's most experienced player and burly Butch Gilliam are the guards; while big and improved Jim

Nayfa is center.

Defensively, Perry and Doyle Johnson are due at end; rugged Ronnie Nixon and Soph Charles Herrington at tackle; with Williams and Cooper, one of the captains, in the middle. Gresham and quick Bobby Nelson are the linebackers. In the secondary, regarded one of the finest in many years, Dan Jones, John Richards and Horak all return from 1964.

#### Arkansas Is Next



Q'OTES FROM FLORIDA STATE COACH BILL PETERSON:

"We just didn't hit anybody and we didn't make the big play. Our defense played a good game and gave us plenty of scoring opportunities, but we couldn't take advantage of them. On the other hand, TCU made the big play when they had to. They seemed to be keyed up and played well.

Phil Spooner hurt a knee in the first quarter and was able to play only one play in the second half. This hurt us, even though Joe Petko played a good game. Spooner's injury does not seem weekens to be serious, and he should play against Baylor next week. I think the key play of the game came when we let their quarterback run the ball out to midfield mins when we had him bottled up deep in their territory. We are going to have to work a lot harder on our blocking."
