TALLAHASSEE, Dec. 1--Florida State's final football statistics tell a story of one of the most frustrating years in Seminole history.

Although they finished with a 4-5-1 record, the Seminoles finished the season with an edge in just about every statistical category. The edge is a slim one, just as the margin between winning and losing was slim for FSU in all but two games.

Florida State outscored its ten opponents, 121-119, and outgained them, 2692-2517. FSU's opponents scored one more touchdown than did the Seminoles, but the kicking of sophomore Pete Roberts gave FSU 21 points to provide the margin.

Defensively the Seminoles caused 21 fumbles and recovered 14. FSU fumbled only 13 times, losing only five. On the other hand, the Seminoles gave up the ball on pass interceptions 15 times, while the FSU secondary was able to come up with only five enemy aerals.

Most of the records set by the 1965 Seminoles reveal the frustrating aspect of the season. The Seminoles threw more passes than any FSU team ever, 256, and quarterback Ed Pritchett broke an individual pass attempt record set by Steve Tensi last year.

However, only five touchdowns were scored by passing, and the 114 completions are well below the 147 rung up by Tensi and Pritchett in 1964.

John Hosack broke a punting record with 61 kicks, three more than Charlie Calhoun had in 1961. The 61 punts are also a team record.

The only record which can go down on the positive side of the ledger is that set by defensive back Billy Campbell, who returned 20 punts, one more than Tommy Brown brought back in 1951. Campbell averaged 15.1 yards per return. The FSU record, held by Brown, is 15.7.

Phil Spooner and Ed Pritchett turned in performances which rank them among the top Seminoles of all time on a career basis. Spooner gained 323 yards, giving him a career total of 1178 yards, which is second only to Fred Pickard's 1590.

Spooner gained his yardage on 288 carries for a career average of 4.1 yards per carry.

Pritchett's total offensive yardage for his three years of varsity action was 2198--452 rushing and 1746 passing. He ranks third among total offensive leaders, behind record-holder Tensi and Eddie Feely.
