

OFFENSIVE LINE COACH



Bill Smaltz, an original member of Earle Edwards' Wolfpack staff, is in his 15th season at State and for nine years has been offensive line coach, after previously serving as freshman coach.

Smaltz was head coach at Juniata College in Huntington, Pa., for seven years (32-17-2) when he decided to join Edwards here. The Aliquippa, Pa., native, born March 17, 1918, had an undefeated team at Juniata in 1953. Bill had been a prize fullback and passer at Penn State from 1939 to 1941

and played in the East-West Shrine Bowl game in 1941. Edwards and Al Michaels coached him at Penn State.

Following four years of Army duty, Smalt completed work for his B.S. degree in physical education from Penn State in 1947. Bill and his wife, the former Bette Rank of Robetrsdale, Pa., have a teenage daughter and son. They reside at 2121 Buckingham Road. Bette, a Penn State graduate, is an assistant professor in the woman's physical education program at N. C. State.

DEFENSIVE SECONDARY COACH



Jack, a two-way halfback, on the Wolfpack's 1958-60 teams, joined his alma mater's football staff last spring in time for the off-season drills. He will coach the defensive secondary, replacing his former teammate, Claude Gibson, who is now on the staff of the Boston Patriots.

He has coached on both the high school and collegiate level since graduating from N. C. State in 1961 with a B.S. degree in Recreation and Park Administration. Jack will do a major share of the scouting and assist in recruiting.

He was head coach at Bishop Ireton High School in Alexandria, Va., in 1967. Prior to that he had been assistant coach at George Washington University (1966), Wheeling (W.Va.) Central Catholic (1964-65), and Western High in Louisville, Ky., (1963). He also played pro football with Toronto and Pittsburgh (NFL) in 1961 and with Louisville in 1962.

Jack, born June 7, 1938, is married to the former Ruth Ludwig of Carnegie, Pa., and they have two sons and a daughter.

Hopes Bright in Winter Sports

Hope for another outstanding year in the winter sports—basketball, swimming, wrestling and fencing—is high at North Carolina State University.

Last year's record was very good.

It looked like this:

The basketball team climbed from last place in the Atlantic Coast Conference standings into a tie for third, then finished second in the tournament, beating Duke, 12-10, in the semifinals.

The swimming team, led by Olympic goal medalist Steve Rerych, splashed to an unbeaten season, then swept the

ACC championships.

The wrestling team had a 9-4 overall regular season mark, with former football star Chuck Amato capturing the ACC 191-pound championship.

The fencing team—led by Capt. Bill Hube — finished 22nd in the NCAA championships and posted a commend-

able 5-6 overall record.

A highlight of the 1968-69 year will be the NCAA fencing championships at State March 27-29. This will be the second NCAA championships finals for the State campus. The swimming finals were held in 1963.

The Wolfpack basketball team, led by Co-Captains Dick Braucher and Joe Serdich, should be another exciting

aggregation.

Star of coach Norman Sloan's show might well be last year's surprise performer, center Vann Williford, a 6-6, 190-pound junior from Fayetteville.

Although Eddie Biedenbach can't be replaced in the backcourt, sharpshooting Nelson Isley and the clever Braucher provide experience at guard, and transfer student Rick Anheuser should add considerable strength and finesse to the front line where Serdich and Williford are returning.

Among the sophomores expected to see considerable duty are guard Al Heartley of Clayton, Dan Wells, a 6-6, 210-pounder, and 6-7, 185-pound Doug Tilley of Bethesda, Md.


Coach Willis Casey's swimmers will miss Rerych, winner of two gold medals in the Olympics and the first State athlete ever to make the U.S. Olympic team. Rerych won nine individual AĈC championships at State.

However, returning swimmers include co-captains Tom Falzone and John Ristaino, junior Mike Witaszek

and sophomore Bob Birnbrauer.

Falzone, all-America the past two seasons, is the fastest breast-stroker in ACC history, and he holds the record for 100 yards at 1:00.4. Ristaino placed in the 100 and 200 butterfly in the ACC, as well as in the 400-yard individual medley.

Witaszek catpured the ACC 200yard breaststroke last winter and finished second to Falzone in the 100.

Birnbrauer was second to Rerych in the 100- and 200-yard freestyle events last year, breaking the old record in the 200 in the process. He was an all-America last year.

Coach Jerry Daniels, who replaced

the late Al Crawford as wrestling coach, has 10 lettermen returning, including Amato, from last year's squad. Amato will be seeking his third ACC title. His first came in the heavyweight division as a sophomore.

Three of those lettermen reached the ACC finals-Mike Couch in the 152pound division, Allen Brawley in the 137, and Amato. The other State finalist last season, graduate Greg Hicks, carried 32 straight victories into the title match.

Other lettermen on the team, which will include freshmen under ACC rules, are Allen Bowen, Don Cashman, Ben and Bob Harry, Bob Lewis, P. J. Smith and Jim Pace.

In fencing, all work will be aimed at the NCAA championships. However, the women's team, which is part of the varsity, hopes to repeat as Eastern Intercollegiate champions, a title they won at Hollins College in Virginia last

All but one member of the women's team is back, and they include state champion Barbara Walters, plus Linda Adkins and Jill Stivers.

Calvin Barnhardt, who competes in epee, will captain this year's men's team, which won't have Hube, Ray Lamont and Tim Isenberg. However, two men who made all-ACC last winter - Bob Mitunicwitz in saber and Larry Minor in foil—join Barnhardt as lettermen.

Weaver expects some interesting work from 6-7 Mark Canavan and Cecil Burk in epee, and Timmy Yang is a prospect in foil.
