It's THE GAME in Florida! When you get Florida and Florida State together on the gridron, expect the unexpected.

Florida comes into this contest with a 3-1 record following its 14-6 victory over North Carolina State last Saturday, while the Seminoles were taking the day off.

The Gators registered triumphs over Duke and Mississippi State before bowing the Alabama two Saturdays ago. To its credit, Florida State has defeated Louisville and Wake Forest. The Seminoles dropped a regionally televised game to Georgia Tech three weeks ago.

In quarterback John Reaves, Florida has one of the nation's best passers. As a sophomore last season, he teamed with All-America receiver Carlos Alvarez for a 21-6 decision over the Seminoles at Florida Field. In that one, Reaves had touchdown passes of 10 and 30 yards to the Cuban Comet.

This season, sophomore Willie Jackson has added still another receiving threat to the Gator offense. And with junior Andy Cheney healthy, Florida has even more pass catching ability.

Tommy Durrance and Mike Rich return from a 1969 Florida rushing game which out-gained the Seminoles 153 yards to minus 18.

Against N.C. State last week, Florida showed it can play pass defense and turned in seven interceptions.

Florida State has had two weeks to try and get its offensive ducks in order. Junior quarterback Frank Whigham, who took over for senior Tommy Warren in the second quarter of the Tech loss, has been working on his timing and hopefully this additional work will sharpen an aerial game which hasn't been as potent as in the past.

This will be the 13th meeting between Florida and Florida State but only the fourth played in Campbell Stadium. The Gators own a 9-2-1 edge with the Seminoles' lone victories coming in 1964 and '67.



### FOOTBALL'S AMAZING MAJORS FAMILY

The Majors football story began 30 years ago. It still goes on and on, chapter after chapter, sequel added to sequel.

Father Shirley Majors started it all in 1941. And he still coaches, turning out distinguished teams at the University of the South (Sewanee).

John, eldest of five sons and now head coach at Iowa State, was a great All-America runner at Tennessee in 1956. Bobby, the youngest son, now a junior at Tennessee, also is a dazzling runner, safetyman and punter.

It all began because the father, Shirley, married to the former Elizabeth Bobo, detested farming.

He had a "piece of ground," as he puts it, in Middle Tennessee, not far from Nashville, but he hated to farm. He loved football. Shirley, a taciturn fellow who likes to hunt quail and rabbits and chew tobacco, didn't even have a college degree, but he got a chance to coach in 1941. He grabbed it.

#### Just One Loss

He coached at Franklin County High and at Lynchburg. Huntland (population 258) lured him away in 1949, by which time Johnny was ready to ramble with a football. Johnny scored an incredible 564 points while he played for his father, going on to the University of Tennessee in 1953. Huntland went on winning, losing one game in six years.

There was always a Majors in the lineup. Joe played next for his father, then Bill. Just to break the "monotony" there was a daughter, too — pretty Shirley Ann, and, as you might guess, she was a cheer leader and later married a football player. Larry starred for his father, too, but Bobby, the one now at Ten-

nessee, did not. He came along too late.

In 1957, Sewanee hired Shirley Majors. Sewanee gives no athletic aid, has lofty academic levels, and stresses classical studies as a sort of prep for the Episcopalian ministry. But Shirley cracked the whip and won with the players available. He had an undefeated team his second year there, now has a 13-year record of 66-34-5.

John led Tennessee to an undefeated season in 1956 and the No. 2 ranking in the nation. He finished second in the Heisman Trophy voting and ranks as one of the brilliant single wing tailbacks of all time.

Brother Joe shunned Tennessee, figuring he was too slow for the single wing. He tried Alabama, then transferred to Florida State. His greatest thrill there was in quarter-backing his team to a 10-0 victory over Tennessee in 1958. He's now a lawyer in Tullahoma, Tenn.

#### Bill Vs. Joe

Bill enrolled at Tennessee in 1957, playing against Brother Joe in that big upset a year later. Bill was a great defensive player and single-wing tailback, finishing in 1960. UT hired him as a coach. He lost his life along with two other coaches in 1965 when their car was hit by a train at a grade crossing in suburban Knoxville.

Larry, considerably smaller than John, Joe or Bill, played for his father at Sewanee, helping to defeat Washington and Lee, Hampden-Sydney, Millsaps and such. He went into coaching, too, and has produced fine teams for high schools in East Tennessee.

Bobby, the baby of the family and the largest as a college player, rolled up fantastic feats in high school in football, basketball, baseball and

golf. He finished up at Castle Heights Military Academy in 1967, and followed John and Bill to Tennessee the next fall.

As a 195-pound sophomore, Bobby was used as a flanker back and punt returner. He is not particularly fast but he has a deceptive gait that leaves tacklers reaching. This fall he'll return punts again, do the punting and play the all-important safety position on defense.

Saturday is always an exciting day to the Majors family. No one can rest until he gets the news on Shirley's Sewanee team, on how Bobby and the Tennessee Vols did and how Johnny's Iowa State team came out.

The Majors thrill to every victory and suffer in every defeat, and it'll be that way until their unique story ends—which is likely to be a long way off.

#### TAKE TEN TO WIN

Back in 1958 as the football season grew near, Florida State Head Coach Tom Nugent summized, "We've been seeking a big time schedule since football began here and certainly we have it now."

Most fans were quick to agree with the "experts" that the aggressive Seminoles had overstepped their bounds somewhat and in 1958, at least, were "outclassed by the likes of Tennessee, Georgia Tech, Miami, Georgia and Florida.

Although the Seminoles lost the first two "biggies" (Georgia Tech and Georgia), they carried a 4-2 record into the third "big one" against Tennessee in Knoxville.

The Vols, champions of the Gator Bowl the year before, were 2-2, but were favored. The Big Orange was led by Bill Majors who directed Tennessee's famed single wing offense.

The Seminoles, with Bill's younger brother Joe at quarterback, were a natural for pregame publicity about a battle within one of football's most famous families. The game was the Tribe's tenth against an SEC team and Florida State was still looking for its first win.

The Vols drove inside the Seminole 30 twice in the first period, but each time the Florida State defense rose to the occassion. Field position switched in the second quarter as Bobby Renn's punts kept Tennessee backed up against its goal line.

The third period was all Florida State. The Seminoles took the second half kickoff and drove to a score. Fred Pickard, who totaled 133-yards for the afternoon, picked up 51 to the Vol's 30. Renn and Pickard then moved the ball to the Tennessee nine in four plays and John Sheppard booted a 26-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead.

Three plays after the kickoff the Seminoles were threatening again. Al Ulmer picked off a Bill Majors pass. Vic Prinzi passed 27-yards to Tony Romeo for a firstdown on the one. Renn bucked in for the touchdown and it was 10-0 Florida State.

Then the Seminole defense took over. Tennessee punted on third down following the kickoff, but a Joe Major's pass was intercepted at the UT six. This time the Vols quick kicked on first down. After the Seminoles punted back, Tennessee ran on play, their sixth of the quarter and kicked. Florida State controled the ball to the end of the period.


The Vols made one last ditch drive, moving from their own 24 to the Seminoles 15 with time running out. But Prinzi intercepted a pass at the two and four plays later the gun sounded.

Tennessee's proud offense was stunned. UT gained only 29-yards rushing and just 82 passing, winding up 21 short of Pickard's individual total. The Seminoles meanwhile had a total net gain of 309 yards.

Back in Tallahassee, Seminole fans swarmed to the airport where a huge throng awaited their arrival. As the charter plane taxied up to the terminal one fan very innocently summed up the big day when he said, "The Seminoles have arrived."

#### - TRACK -

For the last 16 seasons, Florida State's Mike Long has built one of the finest track and field programs in the South. The Seminoles' track record under his guidance is one of the best in the nation.

Overall Mike Long coached Seminole teams have won 62 of 76 meets. In 12 of his 16 seasons, the Seminoles have lost no more than one meet and six times they have been undefeated in dual competition. In 1964 and '65, the Seminoles went through a total of 10 dual meets without a loss.

Coach Long is considered one of the nation's finest "on the field" coaches in the country by his contemporaries. He has a knack that brings out the very best that a young prospect has to offer. Also, he has been able to develop a spirit of camaraderie that makes the Seminoles an even stronger dual meet team.

Long came to Florida State in 1953 as an assistant coach in track, football and basketball. He brought with him 16 years coaching experience, 10 in Florida and 6 in Minnesota high schools. After one year here he assumed full responsibility of the Seminole Track program.

The personable, well liked track mentor was given a special honor in 1968 when the former members of his track teams contributed to a fund to provide Mike and his wife an all expense paid trip to the Olympic Games in Mexico City.

"I felt we needed an inspired effort and better execution than we've been getting in order to win. We got both.

"This past week of practice is the first time this year, including pre-Duke practices, that we've had the 22 boys who start on Saturday practicing together all week long. This was a hig help in developing team unity and getting polish which makes for good execution.

We had a lot of heroes, almost too many to pick out individuals. I thought our defensive end play continued to be very good. Jack Youngblood and Robert Harrell are just outstanding all around defensive ends who take a kas lot of things away from the offense. Harrell has played five consecutive good games and Youngblood has been outstanding the past two weeks after coming back from the knee injury in the Duke game.
