Larry Jones has been the Seminoles "Man on the go" since his arrival on the Tallahassee campus a year and a half ago.

The personable young Seminole coach surrounded himself with a hard working staff that has been a whirlwind of activity. Jones barely gave the new staff time to get to Tallahassee before he had them off to every part of the state on recruiting tours. Their endeavors paid off handsomely as the Seminoles enjoyed one of their best recruiting years last winter.

The hard work and long hours don't stop with recruiting. Jones' staff, which he says is "the best in the nation" prepared the Seminole squad into a tight knit, spirited group that ran up an 8-3 record and trip to the Fiesta Bowl in his first season.

The Seminole team was marked with a strong comradeship. Every man appeared willing to pay the price, not only for himself, but also for his teammates. And it was this factor, more than any other — more than their victories, more than the outstanding defensive play, more than the brilliant passing game — that pleased Larry Jones. Jones summed up his feelings in these words, "I was most impressed with the love and respect our players had for one another."

That unity would seem to be the key to Jones' coaching style — proving you can still believe in "humility," "teamwork," and "paying the price" while communicating with one another.

A native of Little Rock, Ark., where he was a three sport star in high school, Jones came to Florida State from Tennessee where he was chief assistant under Bill Battle for a year. Prior to that he was an assistant with Paul Dietzel at LSU, Army and South Carolina from 1958 through 1969.

Jones was a center-linebacker at LSU from 1951-54 and then joined the Tiger coaching staff as a graduate assistant. After two years in the Air Force he rejoined Deitzel's staff in 1958.

Larry and his wife, the former Judy Bianchi of Dallas, Texas, have three children, Bruce, 14; Kevin, 8; and Laura, 7.







TODAY'S GAME

In the Sunshine State, THE GAME is Florida-Florida State and today's contest is the 15th meeting between these intense rivals.

The Gators own a 11-2-1 edge with one of Florida State's wins coming in Campbell Stadium in 1964 when the Seminoles gained a 16-7 triumph. The only other Seminole victory was registered at Gainesville in 1967 with the Tribe winning 21-16. The 3-3 tie occured on Florida Field in 1961.

The first meeting came in 1958 with the Gators winning 21-7 after the late Bobby Renn took the opening kickoff deep into Florida territory before he was tackled by Jimmy Dunn, current member of the Gator coaching staff.

There have been some thrillers in this series. The 3-3 deadlock in 1961 was a shocker and the year before Florida managed a 3-0 triumph. In 1965, the Seminoles led late in the fourth quarter only to have Steve Spurrier toss a touchdown pass to Charles Casey to give the Gators their go ahead margin.

The 1968 game here was scheduled to be an offensive duel before a regionally televised audience. However, it turned out to be all defense as the Gators stopped Florida State four times inside their five and gained a 9-3 verdict.

Today, the Gators come into this one with a 1-1 record and fresh off a 28-13 win over Mississippi State. Florida State is 4-0 with victories over Pitt, Miami, Virginia Tech, and a 44-22 triumph over Kansas last Saturday in Lawrence.

Florida showed a pair of outstanding runners against the Bulldogs in sophomore Nat Moore and junior Vince Kendrick, a 224 pounder from Miami. Kendrick registered 113 yards in 14 carries including a 52-yard touchdown jaunt while Moore stepped off scoring dashes of 8 and 26 yards.

The Seminoles also have more rushing ability this season than in the immediate past. Junior Hodges Mitchell is averaging 105.5 yards per contest.

Heisman trophy candidate Gary Huff is having another banner season. The Tampa senior is among the leaders in passing and total offense. He needs just 14 yards to replace Bill Cappleman and become the Seminoles' career total offense leader


OUTSTANDING PLAYERS AWARD

BILL CANTY Offensive Coordinator, Quarterbacks

Originally, Canty was named by Coach Jones to direct the Seminole freshmen. However, Bill worked primarily with the varsity running backs last fall and was elevated to offensive coordinator when Steve Sloan departed.



JOHN DEVLIN Defensive Ends and Tackles

A former Army staff sergeant, John came to Florida State in 1971 from Virginia Tech, one of the Seminoles' arch rivals.

An avid paddleball player, this native of Norristown, Pa., played tackle at West Chester State where he was called the "best ever" by 25-year coaching veteran W. Glenn Killinger.

After receiving his degree in 1959, John became the line coach at Waynesboro, Pa., High School. In 1961 and '62 he was an assistant with the Fourth Armored Division football team in Ulm, Germany. From 1963-65 he served along with Larry Jones as an assistant under Paul Dietzel at the U.S. Military Academy. In 1965 he joined Jerry Claiborne's staff at Virginia Tech.

John and his wife, the former Irma Kleemann of Regensburg, Germany, have three sons and a daughter.

JIM DONNAN Running Backs

Jim is one of the newest additions to the Seminole staff, coming to Florida State from the University of North Carolina.

Prior to joining the Tarheels, Donnan was an assistant at his alma mater, North Carolina State.

During his playing days Jim was the second-leading passer in Wolfpack history. He was named the Most Valuable Player in the 1967 Liberty Bowl and was voted the ACC Player of the Year the same season. He was also No. 1 singles player on the N.C. State tennis team.

The 1968 graduate was named the Wolfpack's most outstanding student-athlete in 1967. Following graduation he joined State's staff as an assistant.

BOB HARBISON Interior Offensive Line

This will be "Harbie's" 25th season at Florida State, meaning that only one Seminole team, the first, hasn't benefited by Bob's coaching ability.

Bob has coached both offensive and defensive linemen during his long career at Florida State. He returned to offense last season after a number of years guiding the interior defensive linemen. His "Magnificent Seven" of 1964 is considered one of the Seminoles' better defensive lines.

A native of Evansville, Ind., Harbie played his college football at the University of Indiana under the late Bo McMillin. Following his senior season he performed in the Blue-Gray All-Star game in Montgomery, Ala.

Larry Jones is the fifth Seminole head coach Harbie has worked with. He also served under Don Veller, Tom Nugent, Perry Moss and Bill Peterson.

LARRY HOLTON Defensive Backs, Scout Squad

Another first year Florida State assistant, Larry comes to the Seminoles from Iowa State where he served two seasons as a graduate assistant.

At Florida State he will assist Gene Henderson with the defensive backs and also direct the scout squad.

A native of Keokuk, Iowa, Larry was a three-sport letterman at Keokuk High before gaining a football scholarship to Iowa State. As a senior he was named All-Big 8 Conference as a defensive back before earning his B.S. in Physical Education the next year.

Larry joined the Florida State staff this summer. He is single.

DICK MILDER Trainer

For the first time in nearly two decades Florida State will have a new athletic trainer as personable Dick Milder takes over for Don Fauls who retired last spring.

A graduate of Iowa State University where he served as student trainer under C.R. Bickerstaff, Dick has a Certificate of Physical Therapy from Iowa and a Master's Degree from Purdue. His training experience includes two years at West Point, a year at Iowa and two years at Purdue where he was located before joining the Seminoles. The Army veteran also has served as an assistant trainer for the St. Louis Football Cardinals.

Dick is married to the former Linda Lee Van Wechel.

BILL PARCELLS Linebackers

This will be Bill's third season as director of Florida State's linebacking corps. He and Bob Harbison were the only two holdovers from the Bill Peterson staff.

Parcells has been associated with outstanding linebackers during his entire coaching career and he ranks this year's group among the best he's coached.

The Oradell, N.J., native came to Florida State after four seasons at the U.S. Military Academy.

Bill played his college football at Wichita where he performed at guard, tackle and linebacker. He was All-Missouri Valley Conference twice and upon graduation was a fourth-round draft choice by the Detroit Lions.

His first coaching assignment was at Hastings College for one year. He then returned to his alma mater for another season before moving to Army.

Bill and his wife, the former Judy Goss of Wichita, have three daughters.



JIM PHILLIPS Receivers

Jim comes to Florida State from the pro ranks, having coached

the San Diego Charger receivers since 1969.

Following an outstanding college career at Auburn where he was an All-America end, he was a first round draft choice by the Los

Angeles Rams. He played seven seasons with the Rams and three more with the Minnesota Vikings before joining the Chargers as an assistant. He graduated from Auburn in 1958.

Jim ranks 15th on the all-time list of pro receivers with 401 catches for 6,044 yards.

A native of Alexander City, Ala., he and his wife, the former Mickey Kennedy of Phenix City, Ala., have three children.





Doug Dickey, Florida:

"This was the kind of game you dream about as a coach. Our offense didn't give FSU any help by mistakes, took a dvantage of breaks and our defense forced FSU into critical errors.

**Offensively, we showed a lot, of poise for a young team and David Bowden did an outstanding job of directing that. Nat Moore's long run in the third quarter was perhaps the key play in the game. He is extremely dangerous with the football and when he gets a tackler in a one-on-the situation he is going to win it most of the time.

"We did a good job up front, both offensively and defensively. I the ght our kids locsered up and went a fter them. We third not to be too technical with what we were doing, but just wanted tur people to go out there and get after them.

"Our defense is really coming. When you play that kind of game against Gary Hugg and Barry Smith you have done an afternoom's work and deserve a lot of credit. I thought our lineba ckers played extremely good football and Ricky Browne seemed to be getting a lot of goods things done for us.

The punting of Buster Morris on was also a factor. He punted very well into the wind and hung the ball up where David Snell couldn't get a good shot at a return. We were worried about Snell.
