
Florida State University, founded in 1857, is in the process of making new and important responses to the needs of its 19,500 students and to the problems which confront the state and nation.

A major change in the academic structure of the University is in progress and will continue throughout the year ahead. The decision to reorganize and redistribute colleges, schools and departments into six major academic divisions is the result of a year-long self study made last year by faculty, staff, students and administrators. The primary conclusions called for a regrouping of academic disciplines to meet the demands of new social, economic, scientific and environmental problems of the nation.

That such change is possible is one of the key factors in the University's reputation as a nationally competitive pacesetter in graduate research and undergraduate instruction.

Currently graduating more than 5,000 students each year, Florida State offers more than 50 doctoral programs and more than 80 master's and baccalaureate fields of study. These are encompassed within the schools and colleges of Arts and Sciences, Business, Education, Home Economics, Social Work, Social Sciences, Library Science, Communications, Law, Music, Nursing, and the Fine and Performing Arts, which comprise four of the six new divisions. The other two divisions—Educational Services and Graduate Studies and Research—provide leadership for the University's libraries, continuing education, overseas and instructional research and service programs; and the University's major research centers, institutes and facilities, and the Graduate School.

A CAMPUS "ON THE GROW"



Florida State's constant growth means a changing skyline on the campus as its boundaries continue to expand westward from Westcott Gate. Going up on the sunset side is a new apartment residence hall for undergraduates (see picture at right) at a cost of \$2.4



million. It will be some time before the landmark towers of Westcott are filled in, but workmen are busy with a \$2.2 million project of re-building the insides of the south wing, while preserving the traditional brick towers and walls (left) which hold so much of the University's history. Future construction plans include the first phase of an education complex that will eventually cost some \$9 million, a new school of nursing and expansion of intercollegiate athletic facilities.







THE BELLAMY BUILDING FROM THE UNION POOL.



A qualifier for the NCAA Three-mile championships last spring, Bob is as strong in the classroom as he is on the track. Academically, he has earned a 3.18 grade point average in his first three years at Florida State. The St. Petersburg native is a pre-med major.

Only a sophomore, Chris is a starter at corner back for the Seminoles. Chris had an outstanding freshman year at Florida State, not only making several varsity appearances on the field, but also compiling a "perfect" 4.0 grade point average in his academic work. He graduated from Tampa Hillsborough High School with a 3.5 average and hopes to major in government with a minor in economics. In addition to pro football, Chris has his eye on a career in law and/or politics.

A senior accounting major, John is averaging 3.30 for his first three years at Florida State. An outstanding swimmer, he has qualified for the NCAA Championships all three years at Florida State. A native of Orlando, he is one of the Seminoles top all around swimmers and a holder of several records.



Head Coach Larry Jones

In two seasons as head football coach at Florida State, Larry Jones has directed the Seminoles to 15 victories against eight defeats.

The personable Arkansas native guided the Seminoles to an 8-3 and a Fiesta Bowl bid in his first year and last season Florida State had a 7-4 mark despite numerous injuries.

Since coming to Florida State from South Carolina, Jones has continued the Seminole tradition of wide-open football. "When I came here, I knew Florida State was a passing football team," said Jones. "I believe in the passing game and we will continue in that direction. That certainly doesn't mean I'm against a sound running attack. They complement each other. To have a successful offense you have to do both."

When the Seminoles won eight games in 1971, it was only the fifth time in Florida State's 26-year football history that a coach had been able to match that figure.

Jones, 39, is not totally offense oriented. "No team can win consistently without a sound defense," said the former LSU player. "Offense is the more glamorous side of football but I think defensive players take just as much pride in stopping the opposition."

A native of Little Rock, Ark., Jones was a three-spot performer at Little Rock High School. He attended LSU from 1951-54 where he was center-linebacker for the Tigers. He joined the LSU coaching staff under Paul Dietzel the day he graduated in 1954.

After one year of coaching at LSU, he entered the Air Force for a two-year tour and then returned to LSU for the 1958-61 seasons. He moved with Dietzel to West Point for the 1962-65 seasons and then to South Carolina for the 1966-69 campaigns. Jones was named first assistant and defensive coordinator at the University of Tennessee in 1970.

At LSU, Jones coached the offensive receivers and was in charge of the passing game.


After receiving his bachelor of science degree at LSU, Jones continued his studies and received a master's degree in education from LSU in 1961.

In 16 seasons of college coaching, Jones has served on coaching staffs whose teams have played in the Orange Bowl, Peach Bowl, Sugar Bowl three times and the Fiesta Bowl.

The Florida State coach was born Dec. 18, 1933. He and his wife, the former Judy Bianchi of Dallas, Tex., have three children, Burce, 12; Kevin, 9; and Laura, 8.





TODAY'S GAME

Despite the fact Kansas has one of the nation's finest passers in quarterback Dave Jaynes, the Jayhawks used defense and a running attack last Saturday when they scored a major upset by knocking off 18th-ranked Washington State 29-8.

Jaynes, who the Seminoles remember from last season, threw only nine times while completing four for 93 yards and one score. While Washington State was playing pass, Delvin Williams ran the ball extremely well, gaining 94 yards in 18 carries.

However, it is the Jayhawk defense which showed tremendous improvement over last season. Defensive end Dean Zook, younger brother of the Atlanta Falcons' John Zook, was a stickout last Saturday. He had nine tackles and four assists. Three times the 6-2, 201 pounder threw enemy runners for losses.

Kansas has 16 starters returning from last season's disappointing 4-7 season. If the Jayhawks' first victory is any indication, Kansas could cause trouble in the Big 8 Conference this season.

Florida State, a 9-7 loser last week to Wake Forest on a field goal in the final three seconds, will be trying to gain some offensive consistency. This was lacking against the Deacons with the exception of the Seminoles' one touchdown drive.

The Seminoles' young secondary will get a test with Jaynes throwing. Bruce Adams is his quarterback's favorite target.

This will be the third meeting between Florida State and Kansas with the Seminoles winning the two previous contests. The Tribe won 30-7 here in 1971 and was a 44-22 victor in Lawrence last season.






JIM DONNAN


A native of Burlington, N.C., he is married to the former Mary Wright, also of Burlington.

Freshman






WAYNE McDUFFIE


JIM PHILLIPS


Moyer and his wife Jane are both natives of Lexington, N.C. They have two children.

QUOTES FROM THE KANSAS DRESSING ROOM

From Don Fambrough:

Question was, "Did you plan to use the entire squad regardless of the score?"

"You bet I did. That was our gameplan all along and if I had it to do over I would do the same. I've been down here before and know what it is like. We had fresh kids in throughout."

About the defense

"Fantastic. I don't know how good they (Florida State) are; they may not be very good but anytime you shut a team out you have done the job."

About the offense

"The only thing with the offense I was disappointed in was our failure to take advantage of all the opportunities. But when you are playing everybody like we did it takes something away from you."

About injuries

"The only injury I'm concerned with is an ankle injury to (Billy) Riggins. We don't know if its a severe twist or broken. We'll have to wait for the X-rays."

QUOTES FROM COACH LARRY JONES

"Mistakes, mistakes, mistakes."

"I was extremely disappointed in our offense. Davison and Mitchell were both hurt and not ready to play. Without them we have no veterans."

"We weren't blocking. We have a lot of work to do at the line protecting. We had a lot of receivers open and weren't hitting them. We plan to play both Sexton and Orlando to try and find out who is No. 1."

"Kansas is a good football team. They certainly are big and strong. Jaynes is a fine quarterback as you can see."

"We played poorly enough to get beat worst. However, in other spots we played well enough to hold it down. Until we get our offense going, we've got to play better defensively. The defense made three big mistakes--that long pass, that long run and that screen pass where we missed so many tackles."

"If we could have gotten that one in when we had it on their 15 I think this would have given us some momentum. And with a young club like this, you need something good to happen to you."

"What do we do now? Monday we go back to work."

"I thought Mike ~~Shumann~~ Shumann did a good job of catching the ball."
