TANGERINE BOWL MATCHUP--Florida State (9-2), a southern independent, meets Texas Tech (7-4), a member of the Southwest Conference, on Friday, Dec. 23.

SITE--Tangerine Bowl Stadium (50,622), Orlando, Fla.

KICKOFF TIME--8:00 p.m. EST.

EXPECTED ATTENDANCE--Through December 14, T-Bowl officials had sold 40,019 tickets. A good sale over the final week should mean a crowd in excess of 46,000.

TELEVISION--Mizlou TV will carry the telecast to better than 90 percent of the country. Play-by-Play announcer will be Duane Dow with Howard David and former NFL star Don Perkins in charge of color commentary.

RADIO--The Tangerine Bowl Radio Network will include most of the stations from the regular season Florida State and Texas Tech radio networks. Play-by-Play will be the responsibility of Jack Harris while Jim Gallogly will provide the analysis. Brooks-Gallogly Productions of Tampa, which will produce the broadcast, will name two field announcers next week. Armed Forces Radio will carry the broadcast around the world.

THE REPORT CARDS--Florida State finished its regular season with a 9-2 report card. During the campaign the Seminoles had winning streaks of two and six games. The two-game streak at the start of the season was broken by Miami, 23-17, while San Diego State ended the six-game streak, 41-16.

Texas Tech, like Florida State, started the season with back-to-back wins. Texas A & M, however, administered the first loss, 33-17. The Red Raiders rebounded with a 10-7 win over North Carolina and won their next two before being blanked by Texas, 26-0. Tech closed its season with back-to-back losses to Houston, 45-7, and Arkansas, 17-14.

THE COACHES--Bobby Bowden (Howard '52, now Samford), who was named Southern Independent Coach of the Year by Associated Press, guides the Florida State football program. Bowden has just completed his second year at the Seminole helm and has a cumulative record of 14-8, rather remarkable when one remembers that he started out 2-6. Prior to 1977 his overall record at the four year level as a head coach was a nifty 78-38, a .672 winning percentage which ranked 11th among major college head coaches. Now, with a 87-40 mark and winning percentage of .685 he should rank among the top 10 when the next listings are released. Prior to joining Florida State in January, 1976, Bowden was head coach at West Virginia for six years where his clubs were 42-26 and made two Peach Bowl appearances.

Steve Sloan (Alabama '66) will be closing out a three-year stint as head coach at Texas Tech when the Red Raiders meet Florida State. He recently accepted the head coaching position at Mississippi. This game will mark a homecoming of sorts for Sloan, who was the assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Florida State during the 1971 season when Larry Jones was head coach. Sloan went to Georgia Tech in 1972 before receiving his first head coaching assignment at Vanderbilt in 1973. His Commodore teams compiled a 12-9-1 record. In 1975 after Vanderbilt and Texas Tech had played to a 6-6 tie in the Peach Bowl, Sloan took the Texas Tech position. His overall three year record at Tech is 23-11. This is the second bowl appearance for the Red Raiders since Sloan has been head coach. Sloan was an All-American quarterback at Alabama and led the Crimson Tide to back-to-back national championships in 1965 and '66.

CAPTAINS--Florida State had captains for the season. Punter Bill Duley represents the special teams while the offensive reps are tailback Larry Key and tackle Tom Rushing with linebacker Aaron Carter and free safety Nat Terry at the coin toss for the defense.

THE SERIES--Florida State and Texas Tech will be playing for the fourth time, but this is the first time they have been matched in bowl competition. Florida State enjoys a 2-1 series advantage. First game played was in 1966 when FSU took a 43-33 verdict. That was followed by a 28-12 Seminole victory in 1967. Texas Tech's first win came in 1975, 31-20.

THE LAST TIME--Texas Tech and Florida State last met in Lubbock on Sept. 13, 1975. Ironically enough, that was the first game Sloan ever coached at Texas Tech. The Red Raiders took a 31-20 verdict before a crowd of 35,268. Three present FSU players were involved in TD plays for the Seminoles. Larry Key, who this season became the first Seminole to ever rush for more than 1,000 yards in a season, caught a 17-yard pass from Clyde Walker and Mike Barnes grabbed a 24-yard pass from Steve Mathieson. Walker is now a backup QB for the Seminoles and holds on all placements while Barnes is a backup wide receiver. Tech had just a 19-14 cushion with 9:51 remaining, but broke the contest open in an 11-second span. After scoring a TD to make it 25-14, the Red Raiders recovered a fumble on the next kickoff and in one play quarterback Rodney Allison, a Heisman Trophy candidate this season until he was injured, scrambled 21 yards for the touchdown.

Some notes about present players who participated in that game. First Florida State: RB Larry Key carried the ball six times that night for 23 yards with his longest gain being for 14. He also caught the two passes for one TD and 26 yards. QB Clyde Walker completed 10 of 14 for 128 yards and a TD. WR Mike Shumann caught three passes for 59 yards, the longest 29. In his first collegiate game punter Bill Duley booted four times for a 37.2 average. LB Aaron Carter had three tackles and one assist while defensive end Willie Jones had two tackles.

On the Texas Tech side: RE Billy Taylor hit the line eight times for 55 yards. His longest gain was for 19. QB Rodney Allison ran four times for 43 yards and a TD and completed one of four passes for nine yards. The Red Raiders' leading receiver was Steve Williams, who caught two for 17 yards.

SEMINOLES ON ROAD--Florida State this season had a 5-1 record in games played away from Doak S. Campbell Stadium, Tallahassee. The only loss came at San Diego State.

TECH ON ROAD--In games played away from its home stadium in Lubbock this season, Texas Tech showed a 4-2 mark. The losses came at Texas (26-0) and Houston (45-7).

FSU BOWL APPEARANCES--This is the ninth bowl game for Florida State since it began playing football in 1947. The Seminoles have not fared well in these post-season contests, having a 2-5-1 record in past engagements. The last bowl game for the Seminoles was 1971 when they lost a 45-38 decision to Arizona State in the inaugural Fiesta Bowl. The last Seminole bowl victory came in 1965 when FSU thumped Oklahoma, 36-19, at the Gator Bowl. The Seminoles and Penn State deadlocked, 17-17, at the 1967 Gator Bowl. FSU's only other previous bowl victory came in the 1950 Cigar Bowl at Tampa where Wofford fell, 19-6.

TEXAS TECH POST-SEASON GAMES--Like Florida State, Texas Tech has had its troubles in bowl games. In 15 previous appearances, the Red Raiders show a 3-11-1 record for their efforts. The latest Texas Tech bowl game came last season when it dropped a 27-24 verdict to Nebraska at the Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl. Tech's last bowl game victory came in 1973 when it bested Tennessee, 28-19, at the Gator Bowl. Among Tech's 15 previous bowl appearances, eight have been at the Sun Bowl and three at the Gator Bowl.

BOWDEN AND BOWLS--For Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden this will be his third bowl assignment. The previous two were with the Peach Bowl while he was head coach at West Virginia. He has a 1-1 record in previous games, having beaten North Carolina State, 13-10, at Atlanta in 1975 and losing 49-13 to the same school in 1972.

SLOAN AND BOWLS--This will also be the third head coaching assignment for Steve Sloan in bowl competition. His 1974 Vanderbilt club tied Texas Tech, 6-6, in the Peach Bowl while the Red Raiders of Texas Tech bowed 27-24 to Nebraska in last year's Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl.

FSU VS. TEXAS TEAMS--Florida State had one game this season with a team out of Texas. The Seminoles bested the Mean Green, 35-14, before a Homecoming crowd of 40,597 at Doak Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee. Overall, the Seminoles show a two-game win streak against teams from Texas since they tripped North Texas, 21-20, in Denton last season. The last loss administered FSU by a Texas club came in 1975 at Tech, 31-20.

FSU IN SOUTHWEST CONFERENCE--Overall, in games played against present members of the Southwest Conference, Florida State has not enjoyed a great deal of success. The Seminole record against the likes of Baylor, Houston, Texas A & M, Texas Christian and Texas Tech is 3-16-2. A point of record, though, is that against Houston the Seminoles are 2-11-2, but FSU and the Cougars have not played since Houston joined the conference for the 1976 football season. Thus, taking away the Houston log, the Seminoles would show a 6-5-2 mark. Against each school the Seminoles are 1-2 vs. Baylor, 2-0 vs. A & M, 1-2 vs. Texas Christian and 2-1 vs. Tech.

'77 SEMINOLES VS. CONFERENCE--Although Florida State did not play a Southwest Conference member this year, the Seminoles did play conference members. They had a 2-0 mark in the Big Eight, beating Kansas State (18-10) and Oklahoma State (25-17) and were 2-0 vs. Southeastern Conference schools, besting Auburn (24-3) and Florida (37-9).

10 WINS AND FSU--If Florida State can beat Texas Tech, it will give the Seminoles 10 wins in a season for the first time ever. In only two previous years (1949 and 1964) has Florida State been able to register nine wins. And, in both those years, the ninth victory came in a bowl game. Thus, the nine victories accumulated by the current squad is the most ever for Florida State in a regular season.

TWO LOSSES AND FSU--If Florida State can avoid defeat against Texas Tech, it will mean the Seminoles will have two losses in a season for the first time since 1967 when the Garnet and Gold bowed to Houston (33-13) and North Carolina State (20-10). That team also had two ties--Alabama (37-37) during the regular season and Penn State (13-13) in the Gator Bowl.

THREE LOSSES AND FSU--Even if Florida State bows to Texas Tech, the Seminoles have accomplished something this season. Those total losses (three) will be the least number of defeats for the Tribe since the 1969 team went 6-3-1.

HEAD COACH BOBBY BOWDEN SAYS:

ABOUT TANGERINE BOWL & FSU: "This is going to be a fine opportunity for our football team. It gives us additional recognition throughout the country with the television exposure. And, it also gives us a chance to move up in the rankings with a win. We are #19 (Associated Press) right now and a win over Texas Tech coupled with our win against Florida should move us up."

"I'm very concerned about our preparation for this game. The atmosphere reminds me a lot of San Diego State and you know what happened out there-- 41-16 loss. We have had so many distractions. First the coaches have been off recruiting, then the players have been in exams and we have practiced late at night. And, once we are at Orlando there is going to be a lot for our players to do--sightseeing, etc. The key to me in this game will be which coaching staff can get its players prepared best mentally."

"I would think this is going to be a low-scoring ball game. It is going to be hard for us to move the ball against Texas Tech. In fact, we may need to establish our passing game just to run the ball. The Texas Tech defense will be the best we've played against this year."

"I believe a bowl game has to be a reward for the players. They need to enjoy themselves or they aren't going to want to play. Still, though, it's game of winning and losing. We must be prepared to play the best we know how. Our kids won't have the monastery atmosphere, but it won't be carnival either. I hope to find the right blend."

"In coaching terms I would call Texas Tech a salty football team. They come to play and hit people. Those kids don't know what it is to not give their best on every down."

MORE ABOUT TEXAS TECH: "When Texas Tech is healthy it is one of the best football teams in the country. Look at their record last year (10-2). That should tell you something about how this team can play football when it has everyone in good health."

"Rodney Allison is the best quarterback in the country when he's healthy. If he wouldn't have broken that leg early in the season Texas Tech would probably be one of the top five teams in the country today instead of trying to fight its way back into the top 20. He was about 85 percent in that Arkansas game and you saw what almost happened. Tech came within a whisker (17-14) of pulling one of this season's major upsets. He was operating in that game with about two weeks of practice. Can you imagine what he will be like with four weeks to completely heal?"

ABOUT SLOAN RESIGNATION: "I don't think Steve's decision to leave Texas Tech will help or hinder their team in preparation for the game. This Red Raider football team has 25 seniors, who have been through the wars. They want to complete their career on the best possible note. The players aren't going to let everything that is going on around them hinder their preparation."

ABOUT FSU QUARTERBACK SITUATION: "'Right now I can't tell you who our quarterback is going to be in this ball game. Wally Woodham and Jimmy Jordan have both shown me they can do the job in game conditions. Which quarterback we will use will probably be dictated by Texas Tech and the type of defense they choose to use against us. Wally does certain things better vs. one type of defense and Jimmy does a better job against others."

ABOUT CROWD: "I certainly hope this game is a sellout. People in Florida should want to see college football and bowl games in their state flourish. The one way to do it is by getting behind their team and giving it all the support possible. And, I'm sure hoping that 90 percent of the people in those stands are pulling for the Seminoles. We are going to need all the moral support we can get to beat these folks."

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR JACK STANTON ABOUT RODNEY ALLISON: "Rodney Allison is the reason Texas Tech is 7-4 today. If he wouldn't have been injured this season they could have a much better record than that. With Allison healthy, Texas Tech is one of the finest football teams in the country. Our offensive coaches visited Texas Tech last spring and came back thoroughly impressed with his abilities.

"Allison has good running ability which is needed from a quarterback in the option offense. But, what makes him just as dangerous is that he can also pass the football. There are a lot of good veer quarterbacks in the country today but most of them aren't able to throw the football.

"There is no doubt in my mind that when Tech has everyone healthy it's the best 7-4 team in the country."

FSU WIDE RECEIVER ROGER OVERBY--"The players are just happy to be going to a bowl game. This was one of our goals when we started the season. Now we can prove ourselves against one of the best teams in the country.

"Texas Tech has got a super team. Those fellows on defense will hit. They remind me a lot of Auburn in that respect. Those Tech players like to play football. They never give up. The secondary people try to intimidate the receivers by the way they hit.

"There is no doubt in my mind--Texas Tech is the best team we've played this year."

FSU DEFENSIVE END WILLIE JONES--"We have got to be ready to play. We need to be ready both mentally and physically for this club. Throughout the week we are going to have a lot of distractions. If we don't keep our mind on what we are in Orlando for--a football game--we will get blown out.

"Texas Tech is a better football team than any we've played this season. I know it's good for the Florida State program that we are getting to play in a bowl against a school with an outstanding reputation. One of our goals at the start of the year was to play in a bowl. Now we need to show we are worthy of the opportunity the Tangerine Bowl is giving us."

FSU LINEBACKER AARON CARTER--"Texas Tech is big and good."

NO. NINE FOR HARBISON--The bowl veteran of the Florida State coaching staff is staff coordinator and offensive line coach Bob Harbison, who is completing his 29th year on the coaching staff. Harbison has been on the coaching staff of all previous nine bowl teams.

FSU TEAM TRAVEL--The Florida State team and athletic administrators will leave Tallahassee via Southern Airline charter Monday at 10:30 a.m. Scheduled arrival time in Orlando is 11:15 a.m. During its stay in Orlando, the team will headquarter at the Hilton Inn South. Phone: 305/251-4600.

SID TRAVEL--Florida State sports information director Mark Carlson will accompany the team to Orlando Monday. He will stay at team headquarters--Hilton Inn South (305/351-4600) during game week.

FSU BASKETBALL IN ORLANDO, TOO--Florida State is going to be playing basketball in Orlando, December 23, too. The Seminoles' game with Big Eight powerhouse Missouri, originally scheduled for Tallahassee on Dec. 21 has been moved to Rollins College on the 23rd. Tickets will be available at the door for the 1 p.m. tipoff. All tickets sold in Tallahassee will be honored at the door.

#### TANGERINE BOWL NOTES

This game represents the 32nd annual Tangerine Bowl. The first game was played in 1947 and found Catawba besting Maryville, 31-6.

The Florida State-Texas Tech matchup is only the second played in the expanded Tangerine Bowl. The first was last year when Oklahoma State pounded Brigham Young, 49-21, before 31,048. That crowd is a Tangerine Bowl record attendance which will easily be broken this year.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.--Amid all the excitement of Florida State's season-ending thrashing of rival Florida, senior running back Larry Key had a task to complete-- a task he had begun long ago.

As was the case through most of the 1977 season, the senior from Inverness went about his business virtually unnoticed. While the Seminole fans roared their approval to the inspiring aerial attack, Key managed to sneak in 143 yards on just 20 carries.

That performance boosted his 11-game total to 1,117 yards, making him the first Seminole runner in history to top the 1,000-yard plateau in a single season. That was just one of many records the personable 22 year-old has produced in his career at Florida State.

He's also No. 1 in career rushing attempts, with this season's 239 carries (also a record) pushing his four-year total to 625. His two other marks are yards rushing in a single season (1,117) and in a single game (170) against Auburn earlier this week.

In addition, he also rates high in several other categories, such as fourth in career total offense with 2,953. (That's behind the four greatest quarterbacks in Florida State history--Gary Huff, Bill Cappleman, Steve Tensi and Kim Hammond.)

A couple of other Florida State players made dents in the record book with their performances. Sophomore kicker Dave Cappelen booted 13 field goals in 1977, leaving him just one short of the record of 14 by Frank Fontes in 1970.

Punter Bill Duley established a new career punting mark. This three year average was 39.4 which bettered the old record of 37.8 yards.

And senior wide receiver Mike Shumann finished third on the career list in both receptions with 134 and yards with 2,304.


