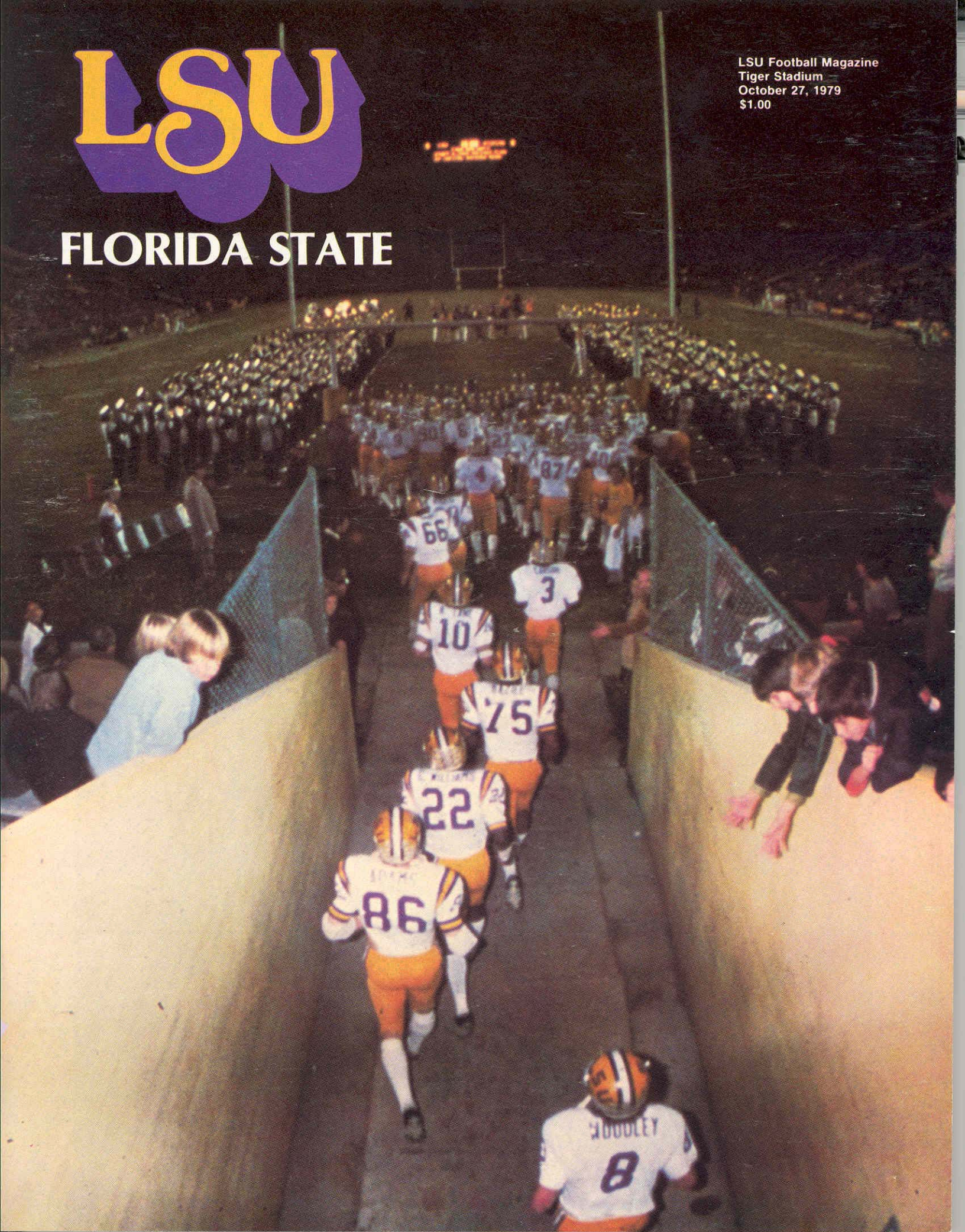
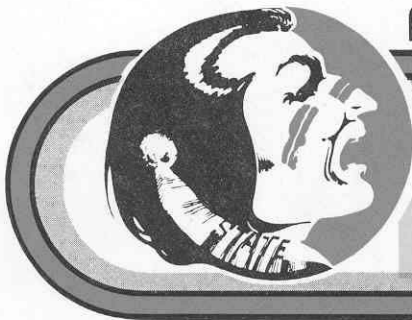

ED'S NOTE: THE FOLLOWING SUPPLEMENTS THE PREVIOUS RELEASE PERTAINING TO THE FLORIDA STATE-LOUISIANA STATE FOOTBALL GAME THAT HAS BEEN SELECTED FOR REGIONAL TELEVISION PRESENTATION BY ABC-TV.

THE GAME--Unbeaten independent Florida State (6-0) visits Louisiana State (4-2).

SITE--Tiger Stadium (76,050), Baton Rouge, La.

NEW KICKOFF TIME--3:07 P.M. CDT (4:07 P.M. in Tallahassee and most of Florida).

ABC-TV TEAM--Announcers for the telecast, which will be shown to 84 percent of the nation, are Jim Lampley (play-by-play) and Frank Broyles (color commentary). Bob Goodrich will act as the producer with Roger Goodman serving as the director.

MORE ABOUT TELECAST--The FSU vs. LSU will follow a national game between Houston and Arkansas that will be played at Fayetteville, Ark., starting at 12:50 p.m. EDT. The Seminole-Tiger clash will be the "lead" regional in the second portion of the doubleheader. Other regional games will find Washington at UCLA, Utah at Arizona State and Eastern Kentucky at Murray State.

FSU AND ABC-TV--This is the second regional telecast of the season for the Seminoles, the fourth in the last two years and fifth in three seasons. Earlier this year, FSU knocked off Virginia Tech, 17-10, in a regional appearance. Last season the Seminoles took wins from Miami, 31-21, and Navy, 38-6. The previous year the Tribe toppled Florida, 37-9. The LSU regional will be the largest to watch the Seminoles perform in the last three years. Seminole noseguard Ron Simmons has a string of three games where he has been picked as the ABC-TV/Chevrolet Defensive Player of the Game.

MORE ABOUT FSU AND ABC--Overall, Florida State will be making its 15th appearance on the ABC network since 1959. Two of those games have been national telecasts. The first national game came in the 1967 Gator Bowl where FSU and Penn State deadlocked, 17-17. The Seminoles second national game was in Tampa, Fla., on Thanksgiving night, 1970, when Houston won a 53-21 verdict. Overall, the Garnet and Gold is 8-5-1 in TV appearances.

TIGERS AND TV--This will be the 41st time LSU has appeared on television. Overall, the Tigers have a 19-18-3 record on the tube. That mark includes a 1-2 showing last season where the Bengal Tigers defeated Ole Miss, 30-8, and lost to Alabama, 31-10, in the regular season and then lost to Missouri, 20-15, in the Liberty Bowl.

LAST TIME ON TV--The last time Florida State and LSU met the game was a national telecast. That came in the inaugural Peach Bowl where the Tigers won a 31-27 verdict. That game was carried over the Mizlou TV sports network.

SEMINOLE ABC-TV RESULTS--Since the NCAA college football package went to ABC this is how the Seminoles have fared in reaching the 7-5-1 record: 1959--at Blacksburg, Va., FSU 7-Virginia Tech 6; 1966--at Blacksburg, Va., Virginia Tech 23-FSU 21; 1967--at Memphis, Tn., FSU 26-Memphis State 7; 1967--at Jacksonville, Fla. ABOUT FSU AND RATINGS--For the second consecutive week, Florida State has a seventh place ranking in the UPI board of coaches poll. But, the Seminoles, who were idle last weekend, dropped from seventh to eighth in the Associated Press rating system.

TRIP TO TIGER'S DEN--Unbeaten and nationally ranked Florida State (6-0) visits Louisiana State (4-2) Saturday.

SITE--Tiger Stadium (76,050), Baton Rouge, La.

KICKOFF TIME--7:30 P.M. CDT (8:30 P.M. in Tallahassee and most of Florida).

EXPECTED ATTENDANCE--LSU officials expect a capacity crowd for their Homecoming Game.

THE SEASON--Florida State is off to its best start ever as a major college football school. The Seminoles have won their first six games and extended a winning streak to 10 games over two seasons. LSU began its season with a 2-0 record before bowing to Southern California, 17-12, in Tiger Stadium before 78,322, the second largest crowd in history. The Tigers other loss was administered in Southeastern Conference play by Georgia, 21-14.

LAST WEEK--Florida State enjoyed its only open date of the season.

LSU trailed Kentucky, 19-3, midway through the third quarter but battled its way back to pick up a 23-19 Southeastern Conference victory. The winning score came with 7:49 remaining in the game on a one-yard TD run by freshman tailback Jesse Myles. The win hiked LSU's conference record to 2-1.

THE COACHES--Since coming to Florida State Bobby Bowden (Samford '52) has guided the Seminoles to a 29-11 record. That tally really makes an impression when one realizes the Seminoles had a 4-29 record prior to Bowden's arrival in the winter of 1976. In the September 29th game at Virginia Tech, Bowden picked up the 100th victory of his coaching career. The victory at Louisville last week now gives him a 101-43 ledger at the major college coaching level. In his previous head coaching stops, Bowden went 31-6 at Samford and 42-26 at West Virginia.

Charles McClendon (Kentucky '50) is in his 18th season as head coach at LSU and adding to the allure of the position in 1979 is the fact that he is the current president of the American Football Coaches Association. Cholly Mac has compiled one of the most enviable records in the annals of the game. Sixteen times he has had winning percentages, a mark that only a very few mentors have compiled. He has seen his charges win 134 games, lose only 56 and tie seven.

THE SERIES--This is only the second meeting ever between the schools and it's the first ever in the regular season. The initial battle came at the inaugural Peach Bowl (Atlanta) in 1968 when the Tigers took a 31-27 verdict. Florida State's offensive scheme that afternoon was wide open. QB Bill Cappleman completed 21 of 41 passes for 221 yards and three touchdowns. Two of the scoring strikes went to Ron Sellers, who had eight catches for 76 yards during the afternoon. FSU built up an early 13-0 lead, but the Tigers had narrowed their deficit to 13-10 by halftime and then took the lead for good with a 14-point second quarter.

THE CAPTAINS--Florida State has four co-captains, who were elected by their teammates prior to the season. Heading up the offense are guard Mike Good and quarterback Wally Woodham. Defensive end Scott Warren and cornerback Ivory Joe Hunter are in charge of the defense. Hunter this year became the first player in Seminole history to twice be elected captain. He also had the honor last year, but sustained a broken leg in the second game and received a medical red-shirt season. LSU will name game captains during mid-week.

MORE ABOUT SERIES--This game is not a one-shot deal. It's the first segment of a five-part deal that continues over the next four seasons. Each game, like this one, will be played in Baton Rouge. The series then resumes in 1989 on a home-and-home basis. Next season FSU and LSU will open the season against each other on September 6.

SEMINOLES ON ROAD--This will be the third "road" game of the year for FSU. The Seminoles won at Virginia Tech, 17-10, and took a 27-0 verdict at Louisville. The Tribe also played Arizona State in Tampa, Fla., where it took a 31-3 decision. Florida State now has three consecutive road victories, not losing since it was beaten 7-3 at Pittsburgh last season.

FAMILIAR FACE ON OPPOSITE SIDE--Florida State coaches will see a familiar face on the opposite sideline when they play the Tigers. Jerry Bruner, who was the Seminole offensive line coach for three seasons and also coached with Bowden at West Virginia, defected last spring to join the Tiger staff. He tutors the offensive linemen for Cholly Mac.

STREAKING SEMINOLES--Florida State is working on a 10-game winning streak. That includes wins to close last season against Southern Mississippi (38-16), Navy (38-6), Virginia Tech (24-14) and Florida (38-21). The current streak is the longest ever for the Seminoles since they have played major college football. There was a 13-game streak under Don Veller in the seasons of 1949, 50 and 51. Veller, who is now the golf coach at FSU, saw the Seminoles win their final three games of 1949 and the Cigar Bowl, eight games in a perfect 1950 season and the opener of 1951 before Miami (Fla.) issued a 35-13 loss.

JUST A NOTE--When LSU downed the Seminoles in the '68 Peach Bowl, the Tigers ended a four-game win streak for the Tribe. After a 40-22 loss to Virginia Tech, the Garnet and Gold closed the regular season with wins over Mississippi State (27-14), North Carolina State (48-7), Wake Forest (42-24) and Houston (40-20).

SEMINOLES & HOMECOMINGS--Last season the Seminoles were the guest in three of their opponents' Homecoming Games. FSU came out of that with a 1-2 record, beating Southern Mississippi (38-16) while losing to Mississippi State (27-55) and Pittsburgh (7-3). In their own Homecoming Game, the Seminoles routed Navy, 38-6, before an ABC-TV regional audience. This season LSU is the only foe that has tabbed the Seminoles as their Homecoming opposition.

RECORD HOME ATTENDANCE--Florida State is headed toward a banner year in attendance. The Mississippi State game drew a record Doak Campbell Stadium crowd of 48,701. That passed the previous single game high of 48,432 established last season in the Florida game. Thus far in the '79 season the Seminoles have drawn crowds that rank first, third and sixth on the all-time Doak Campbell Stadium single game highs.

LYLES KEEPS RUNNING--QBs Wally Woodham and Jimmy Jordan continue to break all sorts of Seminole passing records, but fullback Mark Lyles is going to finish his career among the top rushers in the school history. This season Mark has carried 108 times for 421 yards to up his career totals to 1,628 yards in 398 totes. The yardage total is third best all-time at FSU and he needs just 87 more to become the second leading ground-gainer of all time. Mark has also caught 65 passes for 584 yards and a score. His 96 career points ties him for 10th on the all-time scoring list with Mike Sellers (1950-51).

CHANGE IN THE PIVOT--Center Gil Wesley had started 29 consecutive games for the Seminoles, but he will not be handling the snaps for the remainder of the season. The Birmingham, Ala., native sustained a knee injury against Mississippi State that required knee surgery bringing an unexpected halt to the senior's career.

GOING FOR TWO IN SEC--The Seminoles will attempt to raise their record to 2-0 vs. Southeastern Conference competition this season when they visit LSU. Mississippi State was the first SEC victim, 17-6. After LSU, the Seminoles will have one more opponent from that conference this season--Florida at Gainesville on Nov. 24. Last season the Tribe split in its matches with SEC competition, beating Florida (38-21) and losing to Mississippi State (55-27).

BOWDEN VS. SEC--Since coming to Florida State, head coach Bobby Bowden shows a 4-3 record vs. competition from the Southeastern Conference. He's 2-1 vs. Florida, 1-1 vs. Auburn and 1-1 vs. Mississippi State.

TIGER HOMECOMING--LSU will be celebrating its Homecoming when the Seminoles invade. The Bengal Tigers have a 34-17-3 Homecoming Game record, but have lost three of the last four after winning eight straight and 17 of 18. This marks the first time since 1968 LSU has played a non-SEC opponent in its Homecoming Game and FSU is only the third non-SEC school to serve in that capacity since 1960. In the 1968 contest, LSU took a 10-7 verdict from Texas Christian.

DEFENSE IMPROVES--With the season past the midway point it seems obvious to make a comparison between the 1979 and 1978 Seminoles. In addition to an improved record, 6-0 now to 4-2 at the same point, the defense also has shown vast improvement while offensive statistics have fallen off some. Thus, for the digestion of those who like to work in figures...

As mostly everyone knows by now, the two have shared playing time over the last three seasons and their statistics are nearly identical. Below are their career statistics with career ranking below.

LYLES RANKS TOO--Fullback Mark Lyles also ranks on the Seminole career charts. His 1,628 yards rushing is the third best all-time for a Seminole. That comes in 398 carries. Just as impressive is the fact that Mark has caught 65 passes for 584 yards and one TD. His 96 total points ties Mike Sellers (1950-51) for 10th on the all-time career listing at FSU.

SEMINOLE TRAVEL PLANS--The Tribe is slated to fly to Baton Rouge via Texas International charter Friday, leaving Tallahassee at 6:30 p.m. Arrival time is slated for 6:45 p.m. CDT. Team headquarters will be the Bellemont Motor Hotel, 7370 Airline Highway (504/357-8612). The team will return via Piedmont charter Saturday, October 27 at 11:30 p.m. CDT. Arrival in Tallahassee is slated for Sunday at 1:45 a.m. EDT.

WHAT BOBBY BOWDEN SAYS...

ABOUT LSU GAME--"Hey, I'm looking forward to it. I'll say this may be the most important game in the history of FSU football. Beating Mississippi State in Tallahassee is one thing, but beating LSU at LSU is another. This is big. Oh, man, this is big. The biggest. Win it and everybody will believe we deserve to be number seven or better."

ABOUT PLAYING IN TIGER STADIUM--"The crowd there is going to make it a very difficult game for us to win. A lot of good teams have gone to Baton Rouge over the years and come away losers. Those Tigers don't play bad games in Tiger Stadium."

ABOUT COACHING IN TIGER STADIUM--"This will be a first for me. I look forward to it. You hear so much about what a great atmosphere it's for a college football game that it's going to be a pleasure coaching there. I just hope that we (coaches and players) don't get caught up in all the emotion and pagentry and forget why we're there."

ABOUT LSU OFFENSE--"Without doubt the most balanced we've seen so far this season. We've seen teams that could run well or pass well, but not in the first six games have we faced a club that can do both equally well."

ABOUT LSU DEFENSE--"The best we've faced this season. Mississippi State and Southern Mississippi were good, but LSU is the best we've lined up against. John Adams, the defensive right end, is considered one of the finest in the country this fall. He's extremely good at rushing the passer which is going to post a lot of problems for us."

ABOUT FSU DEFENSE--"Haven't those guys really been something this year? What a turn-around we've had here at Florida State the last couple of seasons. First of all we were known just for our offense--we were giving up bunches of points but still figuring out ways to win. Last season we were giving up 18 points per game and still finished with an 8-3 record. Our defensive football team has shown me a lot of pride. They were very upset when Mississippi State was able to score the touchdown with only 1:10 left in the game. Those guys wanted the shutout bad. We will need a great effort from our defense at Baton Rouge. This will be the toughest test of the season thus far. We won't be able to concentrate on stopping the run or pass, LSU does everything on offense well."

ABOUT FSU OFFENSE--"Yeah, I know we aren't scoring like we have in the past, but quite frankly we don't have to score a lot of points with the way our defense has been playing. Yep, it's true that when we get ahead I become conservative. The Mississippi State game was an example. When we got them 14-0 I didn't want to give them anything so we stuck mostly with the ground game. I'll admit that once we get ahead I then want to avoid losing."

ABOUT OPEN WEEK--"It was a plus. We didn't get any injuries and some players who were hurt had a chance to heal. Several guys--Phil Williams (hamstring), Gator Cherry (ankle), Scott Warren (flu) and Wally Woodham (wisdom tooth extraction)--didn't practice at all during the open week. Hopefully that isn't going to slow them down."

ABOUT HOW SEMINOLES WILL REACT IN TIGER STADIUM--"I think our players will react favorably, at least I hope that is the case. Many of these guys were on the team that went out to Oklahoma four years ago and we played well there. Certainly we haven't played any place this season like Tiger Stadium, but we have had some road experience. It isn't going to be something new for our team."

ABOUT SEMINOLE QB SITUATION--"I see no change unless Wally doesn't come around after that wisdom tooth surgery. But, the doctors have assured me he will be able to practice this week and start against those Tigers. I ain't about to change our pattern of using quarterbacks now after we've won 10 straight."

PLAYERS TO WATCH...

FLORIDA STATE

NG RON SIMMONS (No. 50) is Florida State's leading candidate for "All" honors this season. Along with DE Arthur Scott he was named lineman of the week in the southeast by Associated Press following Mississippi State game where he totaled nine solo tackles, two quarterback sacks and one other tackle for loss. Those stats come despite the fact that Simmons was double and triple-teamed throughout most of the game. Already in two seasons plus six games he has been named the ABC-TV/Chevrolet Player (Defensive on two occasions) in three consecutive TV appearances for the Seminoles. He was first team on the FOOTBALL NEWS Freshman and Sophomore All-American squads. He bench presses 530 pounds and runs a 4.56 in the 40-yard dash.

DB MONK BONASORTE (No. 42) shares club lead in interceptions with Bobby Butler at five. That ties them for third place among players in Division I-A this season. Monk has not had a steal in two games, but contributed heavily in the 17-6 victory over Mississippi State with 15 solo tackles and four more assists. His performances have been a surprise to some since he missed all of spring practice while recovering from knee surgery on the 1978 season. Monk came to FSU as a walk-on but has since won a scholarship. His interceptions and a blocked punt have led to 17 Seminole points.

PK DAVEY CAPPELEN (No. 1) leads the Seminoles in points with 35 through the first six games. He has converted on seven of 10 field goals--the longest 46 yards vs. Mississippi State--and been perfect (14-14) on placements. This year's point total gives him 204 for his career. He is the first Seminole ever to score 200 career points. He has now booted 31 consecutive PATs, not missing since the Mississippi State game of '78.

WR JACKIE FLOWERS (No. 23) is the leading receiver this season for Seminoles with 18 catches for 306 yards (17.0 average) and four touchdowns. This year's totals raise his career marks to 83 grabs for 1,414 yards and 12 touchdowns. The reception and yardage totals are sixth best all-time for FSU. The TD total ties him with Rhett Dawson (1969-71) for 11th best all time and the six-point catches is the fifth best all-time tying him with Dawson and Kent Gaydos (1969-71).

LOUISIANA STATE

SE CARLOS CARSON (No. 3) is the Tigers' leading receiver with 21 catches for 319 yards. He is still looking for his first touchdown of the season, but the Tigers have thrown just three scoring passes. As a freshman against Rice he caught five passes for five touchdowns and was named Southeastern Back of the Week by Associated Press. That is an NCAA record and he added to it with a TD reception the following week vs. Florida. A native of Lake Worth, Fla.

DE LYMAN WHITE (No. 94) leads the Bengal Tigers in tackles this season with 62 total hits. He also has three quarterback sacks to his credit for 22 yards. His play against Kentucky in 1978 earned him AP honors as the Southeast Lineman of the Week. Original plans of the LSU coaches had this youngster pegged for duty at linebacker but injuries in his freshman season forced a switch.

DE JOHN ADAMS (No. 86) has season statistics of 31 tackles which include three quarterback sacks and two tackles for loss. Tiger coaches have also credited him with breaking up two enemy passes. Called "Thunderfoot" by his teammates, John is probably the only down lineman in major college football who also handles the punting assignment for his team. In the 1978 season opener vs. Indiana he picked off a pass and returned it 73 yards for a touchdown.

QB STEVE ENSMINGER (No. 5) and QB DAVID WOODLEY (No. 8) share the signal-calling chores for the Tigers. Ensminger normally receives the starting assignment. He has completed 37 of 75 passes this season for 501 yards and two scores. Woodley has connected on 24 of 53 attempts for 351 yards and a TD.
